Shire President's Report



Regional economic Development (RIED) Grants

Minister Alannah Mac Tiernan visited the Bay in mid-November to announce the recipients of RED Grants in Shark Bay and meet with some of the successful proponents. There have now been two RED grant funding rounds, with a further round occurring in January/February. A total of 24 applications have been assessed and 11 projects across the Gascoyne Region have been successful.

Of the 11 funded projects, four are from Shark Bay- Dirk Hartog Island Distilleries (first round), Tidal Moon Sea Cucumbers, Denham Seaside Caravan Park expansion and Ngala Early Years childcare facility (second round). So, if you have an eligible project, consider submitting a funding application for the round early next year!

Thanks to everyone who attended the workshops and presentations. There will be another opportunity to comment on the identified options for adaptation when the draft plan is open for community consultation. I encourage your input, particularly if you own property both along Knight Terrace or on the seaward side of Fry Court, as your assets may be at risk in the future.

REX Airlines Update

This is a reminder regarding the 'community fare' tickets that are available for 25% of the seats on REX flights on the Shark Bay and Carnarvon route. Whilst these are labeled 'community' they are not restricted to local residents. This fare is also available to all passengers on the Perth-Shark Bay-Carnarvon route, meaning that to secure a ticket at the lowest rate you will be competing with other than local residents.

These fares will need to be booked a minimum of 30 days out from your departure date. Any seats not sold within 24 hours of the scheduled departure time will also be offered at the 'community fare' rate (currently \$158 each way).

Coral Coast Highway- Fly and Drive

As a trial, between 1 April and 31 October next year, it will be possible to arrange a one-way hire car rental deal with Avis between Perth and Exmouth. The one-way relocation fee (usually \$1,000) will be reduced to \$250 if driving Perth - Exmouth and \$150 if driving Exmouth back to Perth. Normal hire car rates and conditions also apply. This will likely increase our visitor numbers as more people take advantage of the opportunity to explore a variety of destinations accessible from the North West Coastal Highway.

Coastal Hazard Risks and Planning

Information sessions on coastal hazards have just been held in the Bay to supplement the two community workshops previously held. Those at the sessions discussed the recommendations from the State's Plan to deal with future impacts from seawater inundation and coastal land erosion associated with projected sea level rises. The Coastal Risk Management Plan has identified the local areas which are at risk and developed options and to ensure that Denham is well prepared for these coastal hazards.

Shark Bay Bridge Club

We would like to thank the Shire of Shark Bay for the grant we have received in round 1 of the community grants for the year 2019-2020. This money allows us to buy 3 new tables as well as a new computer for the scoring and to "deal the hands".

The Shark Bay Bridgers come together (nearly) every Monday and Friday at 1pm in the Town Hall. We have only 9 members but on a regular basis we have visitors dropping in too.

Bridge is more than just an enjoyable pastime. Scientific studies have shown that playing bridge has demonstrable benefits for mental fitness and brain health in seniors. Specifically, playing bridge is particularly effective at delaying the onset of Alzheimer's and other forms of dementia. The rules, (sometimes) complex bidding structure, and social interaction that are involved in playing bridge all force the brain to create new neural connections and prevent the buildup of the amyloid deposits shown to cause Alzheimer's. Recent studies into aging have found that the oldest, most active seniors play bridge regularly more than they engage in any single other pastime or lifestyle choice.

A much more in-depth study is currently underway to investigate what it is about bridge that has such a positive effect on the longevity and quality of life of seniors.

We would love to welcome some new members, and anybody interested can always drop in or contact me for more information. If there is enough interest, we will organise some bridge information sessions and lessons.

Hi guys its Seth again and welcome back to my article for this month. I have done a bit of fishing but not much because I went down south for a while.

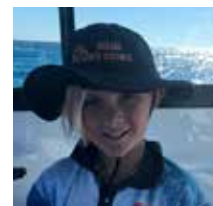

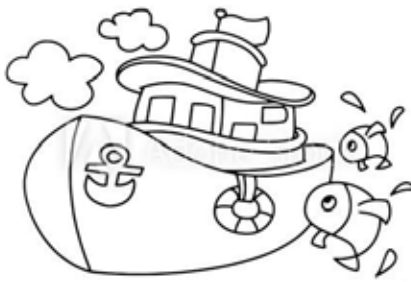
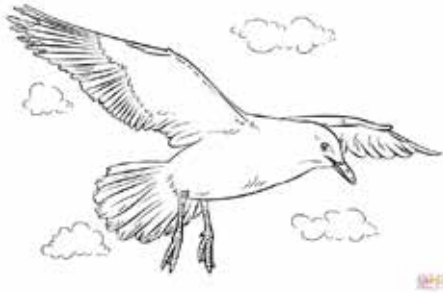
While I was down south, I went to my Nanny and Poppy's house in Boyup Brook with my family where I got my early birthday present. It was my very own

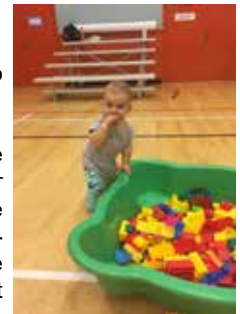
Happy birthday to Ava who turned one in November and Cassia who turns one on the 1st of December.

Dirk Hartog Island Return to 1616 Ecological Restoration

Well it's been a big year for everyone involved in Dirk Hartog Island's Return to 1616 Ecological restoration project. Aimed at returning the island to its former glory when first visited by Dirk Hartog, the project has so far established thriving populations of rufous and banded hare-wallabies. These populations are now doing so well that paw prints and wallaby droppings are more commonly found on the island.

Parks and Wildlife's Dirk Hartog Island stall in Denham's winter markets in July was very popular with over 300 participants, possibly due to our incredibly delicious, celebratory wallaby cookies and a visit from Charlie Chuditch who travelled from Perth for the occasion.

As you can see below – he really got around! The chuditch (*Dasyurus geoffroi*) is a top order predator and as such, will be the last animal reintroduced to the island at the end of the twelve-year project.

Displays showed how we can all play our part in the success of the Return to 1616 project by keeping out "free loading pests" who might seek to join us when visiting the island. For the project to be successful, it is vital to keep pests off the island including weeds, rats and the incredibly invasive Asian house gecko now found in Denham.

What does an Asian house gecko sound like? Follow the QR code link to the right to listen.

New Recruits

In August and September, island life became more rowdy with Shark Bay bandicoots joining the party. Shark Bay bandicoots are the 'hobbit' of the bandicoot world being the smallest of all. They didn't have far to travel from Bernier and Dorre islands so they'll be very comfortable in their new home. Twelve of the bandicoots were fitted the latest in bush fashion this season, a radio collar necklace. Radio collars help scientists to see what goes on behind the scenes ie – where the bandicoots go and what habitat they're using.

Daily monitoring revealed that while some bandicoots were 'stay at homes' not moving far from release point, others were very adventurous travelling up to 4km, which can be likened to a person walking 1,650km in a couple of weeks. Thanks to a glut of insects this season on the island, our Shark Bandicoots are not only surviving, they're positively thriving with an increase of 20% body weight in the same time frame. That's equivalent to a 60kg person weighing in at a staggering 73kg after an exceptionally enjoyable 4-week holiday!! Putting that food to good use, several females were even found to be carrying joeys in their pouch.

In October, 26 captive bred dibblers (Parantechinus apicalis) flew 800km from Perth Zoo to join the island community. They are one of 10 native animals lost from the island following European settlement and the introduction of sheep, goats and cats. Although not much bigger than a mouse, dibblers are more closely related to the Tasmanian tiger and fearsome predators to boot. Unless you're an insect or a small lizard however, you don't have much to worry about. Despite 6 dibblers being fitted with radio collars, they proved more wiley or less interested in bush fashion. Whatever the reason, most of their collars were found abandoned after only a week. Even so, this short period provided invaluable information on the survival and whereabouts of these small carnivorous marsupials. Further monitoring using motion sensing cameras and Elliott traps will also be used to keep tabs on the newest recruits.

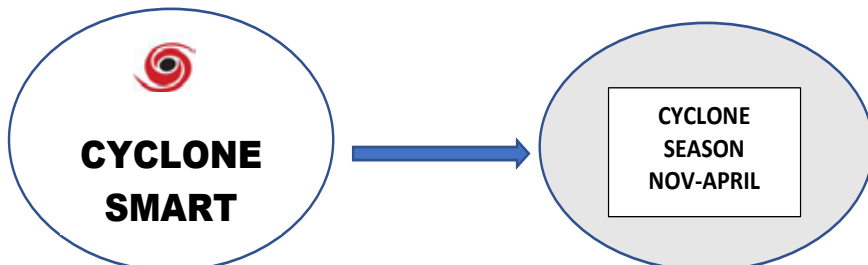

BLUE ALERT - Get Ready for a cyclone

- Keep up to date with the latest on the cyclone through radio, an online.
- Remind everyone in the household of the cyclone plan they committed to.
- Locate your emergency kit (and if you plan to relocate, add additional items).
- Secure items like boats, caravans, trailers, garden sheds, rainwater tanks,
- Outdoor furniture, loose material, LPG bottles and rubbish around your home or work.
- Check in with friends and neighbours to make sure they're getting prepared.



YELLOW ALERT - Act now to stay safe

- Keep up to date with the latest on the cyclone through radio, TV and
- Online – particularly storm surge advice.
- Put your plan into place. Go to your nearest welfare centre if you have planned to.
- Put fuel in your car, and park it in a sheltered area with the handbrake on.
- Fasten all cyclone screens, board up or heavily tape windows. Close your curtains and lock your doors.
- If you live in a low-lying coastal area and there is a risk of storm surge, you may be advised to relocate now.



RED ALERT - Shelter now

- Keep listening to your portable radio for information on the cyclone's progress. Don't rely on your mobile phone to be working.
- Check that pets and animals are safely sheltered.
- Turn off your electrical appliances and gas supply valves.
- Go immediately to the place where you planned to shelter in your home.
- Stay away from doors and windows.
- Stay inside until the **ALL CLEAR** is given



ALL CLEAR - Be careful

- Check that your family and pets are safe and well.
- Always wear shoes if you need to go outside. Be careful of fallen power lines and trees, damaged water and sewage lines, loose roof sheeting and other materials.
- Keep electrical appliances switched off until checked by a qualified tradesperson, and never use matches, cigarette lighters or naked flames, as there may be a gas leak.

Supplies for sheltering during a cyclone

An **emergency kit** is essential for short term survival (at least three days) whether you choose to stay at home or need to relocate to safer accommodation. An emergency kit is a collection of items that are essential for your household's needs in the event of any emergency.

Keep your kit in a sturdy bag or waterproof storage box, which is stored in a safe and easily accessible place.

Start your Emergency Kit with the following items

- Medication
- First aid kit
- Toiletries, sanitary supplies
- Drinking water (to last at least three days)*
- Canned food (to last at least three days)*
- Portable, battery operated AM/FM radio
- Waterproof torch
- Spare batteries

* You may require food and water for your family to last more than three days depending on your location and family's needs

Supplies for relocating to safer accommodation during a cyclone

A relocation kit is an addition to your family's emergency kit. A relocation kit is useful when you decide, or authorities advise you, that your life and property are at risk and you need to relocate to safer accommodation.

Store your kit in a safe place that is easily accessible.

You and your family need to

- Prepare a relocation kit
- Identify items you will need to add to your kit before a cyclone or flood threatens
- Add these items to your kit when a cyclone or flood alert is issued



A full list of relocation kit items can be found at www.dfes.wa.gov.au

Relocation kit items should include

- Essential medications
- Driver's license, passports & insurance papers
- Cash, debit and credit cards
- Warm/spare clothes
- Sleeping bags and bedding

Welfare centres will not allow pets (other than guide and assistance dogs). If you have pets you will need to consider where to relocate if your home is not safe.

Do you have well prepared family or friends that will allow you and your family, as well as your pets to shelter?

If your only option is to relocate to a welfare centre, leave your pets at home and secure them in the strongest part of your home with food and water.

Did you know?
Welfare centres do not allow pets.

If you are relocating to a welfare centre – you **must** take your own **bedding, food and supplies** with you. In most cases these will not be provided for you.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

I have a Pensioner Concession Card from Department of Human Services (DHS) / Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA). What am I entitled to?

Once registered and your concession has been validated, you may take one free return or two free single trips on Transwa services each calendar year (from 2020).

I have a Gold Health Card from Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA). What am I entitled to?

Once registered and your concession has been validated, you may take two free return or four free single trips on Transwa services each calendar year (from 2020).

How do I register for Pensioner Free Travel and get my concession validated?

Complete the attached registration form (or download it from the web) and attach images of both sides of your concession card(s).

What do I do if I have a digital wallet instead of a concession card?

A digital wallet allows you to have your concession or health card with you everywhere you take your smart device. Transwa accepts either the physical card or your digital wallet as evidence of your valid concession.

When registering we ask for a photocopy or scan of your card(s). You can also screenshot both sides of your digital wallet and send us the images with your online registration form.

Why do I need to give Transwa consent to access my concession records held by Centrelink?

We need your consent to enable the Australian Government Department of Human Services (Centrelink) to confirm the concession details you provide to the Public Transport Authority of WA (Transwa) when you register with us. The consent you give remains valid with Transwa unless you withdraw your consent by contacting us.

How do I book my Pensioner Free Travel?

There are a number of ways to book your Pensioner Free Travel with Transwa once you have registered. Have your concession card/digital wallet handy and:

Visit us at one of our Transwa Booking Centre's or visit one of our Accredited agents

Call us on 1300 662 205

Book online (available from late 2019)

What do I do if my travel plans change?

We know plans often change. To cancel or re-schedule your trip, call us on 1300 662 205 prior to the scheduled departure of the first leg of your journey and we will re-book or arrange for your Pensioner Free Travel entitlement to be reinstated.

Can I still use my WA Free Trip Vouchers from Centrelink or DVA if I have not registered with Transwa?

From 2020 you must be registered with Transwa to receive Pensioner Free Travel on Transwa services. Transwa will calculate your travel entitlement each calendar year and you will not need to provide a paper voucher.

Can I still receive a concession fare after I have used my free travel entitlements?

In addition to Pensioner Free Travel, WA Pensioner Concession cardholders and WA Gold Health cardholders can claim 50% concession on Transwa services.

Am I entitled to other travel entitlements if I live in the north of Western Australia?

If you live north of the 26th parallel in Western Australia and hold a Pensioner Concession Card or DVA Gold Health Card you may be entitled to other free travel options. Contact the Department of Transport for more details.

Do I need travel insurance?

Travel involves many risks and our liability to you may be limited in certain circumstances. We strongly suggest that you protect yourself by purchasing comprehensive travel insurance cover for (without limitation) loss of booking due to delays or cancellations, damage or loss to personal baggage and other items, personal liability, death, personal injury and medical costs. We do not sell or endorse any specific travel insurance products.

Shark Bay School

Term is whizzing by and teachers are assessing students so that their progress can be recognized and celebrated and the next steps in their learning can be planned, as individuals and as groups. Staff are now planning for next year and deciding how to use our resources for the best outcomes. Most of our planning is school-based, but we also need to comply with system-wide policies and a new one is the Department of Education's Mobile Phone Policy. This will mean that no student, primary or secondary, should use their phone at school during school hours, including lunch times and recess. It's best not to bring a phone to school at all, but those that are brought should be handed in at reception at the start of the day. Students can always make or receive an important call on a landline. The main aim of this policy is to help students learn to prioritise school work and personal interactions at school, be active at break times, and keep their use of social media to specific periods of recreation. It's all part of learning to self-manage and prioritise activities which is such an important life skill.

Caring

Our school values 'caring', which made our multi-sports day on November 15th, linked with dressing in blue for diabetes awareness so special. Caring includes caring for oneself, living an active lifestyle and learning sport skills to enjoy games with others, and caring about those facing extra challenges, such as diabetes. We were proud of our students' effort and enthusiasm all day, participating in

coaching sessions run by the Stephen Michael Foundation in netball, football, cricket and basketball.



A whole morning outside in the sun made it extra important to consider sun safety. With our UV rating typically in the high-extreme range we need a combination of strategies to keep students well, including areas of shade, appropriate clothing and hats and prompting regular application of sunscreen. After much discussion, including student representatives, we plan to provide all students with school hats with brims for next year; students choosing to wear caps will need to play in shaded areas. This will be coupled with a focus on sun safety in health lessons.

EMERGENCY

If you call the Shark Bay Health Centre after hours you will be transferred through to Health Direct where a Registered Nurse will ask you a number of questions to determine whether you need further emergency assessment by the Shark Bay nurse. If you require further assessment, your call will be put through to the local nurse.

Examples of an EMERGENCY include:

- Breathing difficulties
- Chest pain
- Severe abdominal pain
- Bleeding that can't be controlled with first aid
- Convulsions and fits
- Deep lacerations
- Eye or ear injuries
- Uncontrolled high fever
- Loss of consciousness
- Pregnancy – bleeding or onset of labour
- A very sick child

Guidelines and Criteria

Local citizens and community group and/or community event will be eligible for the Shire of Shark Bay Australia Day Citizen Award in 2020. The awards will be presented at the Shire of Shark Bay Australia Day Celebrations to be held on the 26 January 2020. Nominees will be notified of their nomination and will be officially invited to the event.

The recipients will be selected from people and groups who have made noteworthy contributions to the community during the year, or given outstanding service to the local community over a number of years through active involvement.

Nomination Process

The Shire of Shark Bay invites nominations for the awards from local community members and community groups.

The recipient of the awards will be decided at the December Ordinary Council Meeting.

Selection Criteria

The award winners will be judged to have shown active citizenship and:

- Significant contribution to the local community.
- Demonstrated leadership on a community issue resulting in the enhancement of community life.
- A significant initiative which has brought about a positive change and added value to community life.
- Inspiring qualities as a role model for the community.

Eligibility Criteria

- Nominees should reside or work within the Shire of Shark Bay.
- Groups of people or couples will not normally be eligible except when meeting the criteria of a community group.
- A person may receive an award on more than one occasion in recognition of their outstanding contribution or involvement.
- Unsuccessful nominees may be nominated in future years.
- Sitting members of State, Federal and Local Government are not eligible.
