Shire President's Report - November 2020

WINNER! - Denham, Shark Bay

As advised in the October Report, the Shire nominated Denham for the 2020 Tidy Towns Award in three categories. We have won the award in the Litter Prevention and Waste Management category for our effective waste management by reducing litter and recycling our waste. The nomination included; Shark Bay Bring Centre, Cleanup Australia Day, bin sticker art project, Community Resource Centre low tide clean-up walk, Ocean Park dive clean-up and our local War on Waste boomerang bags. Congratulations to all those involved in the nomination and to all the local recyclers - keep up the good work!

Grants, Competitions and Christmas Events

Keep a look out on the Shire's website, local Facebook pages and posters around town for all the events and activities which are coming up during the next few weeks. A tribute to all our local volunteers will take place on 5th December as part of Thank a Volunteer Day.

Grant funding of \$7.500 has been received from Horizon Power to hold a Community Christmas Wonderland event at the Rec Centre on 12th December and Candice has put together a Shark Bay Christmas Festival Event Program, which also includes; the Seniors Christmas Party on 11th, Kindy Gym Party on 14th, School Concert on 16th and Christmas Carols at various locations performed by the Shark Bay Entertainers on both 22nd and 23rd.

<u>Visitation to the Bay</u>

The previous influx of visitors to the Bay has eased during the past couple of months, however numbers are set to increase again during the coming school holiday break with accommodation in Denham and Monkey Mia already at around 95% capacity during that period. It's great that so many more WA visitors are now aware of what the Shark Bay area has to offer tourists and what our awesome, and often unique, natural environment provides.

However, we do ask that visitors respect and protect our pristine lands and animals whilst here, so that we can preserve and conserve it for future generations.

New Childcare Centre - Rec Centre

Most of you will have already noticed the new childcare centre building which was delivered onsite last week adjacent to the Recreational Centre. I've had a guided tour already and it is very impressive. Lots of activity is taking place with assembly of fittings, play equipment, etc. as well as planning and preparing for the outdoor play and garden areas. The work is on schedule for an opening in early January next year with between 4 and 7 potential attendees, depending upon coordinator training,

Shark Bay Fishing Fiesta - Community Grants Scheme

At the November Council meeting, the Shark Bay Fishing Club made application under this Scheme for \$6,000 towards holding the 26th Shark Bay Fishing Fiesta in May 2021. This year's Fiesta was cancelled due to the

Covid-19 outbreak and allocated Shire funding was returned. Whilst Council is aware this event benefits the local economy and supports community groups, we have



recently been advocating with Government Ministers and agencies for a reduction in fish fillet limits and fish waste. Therefore, conditions applicable to this grant include incorporating catch and release categories into the competition, promotion of educational material on fishing restrictions/limits and the potential of using a 'celebrity chef' to educate fishers on how to utilise more than just the fillets when filleting and cooking fish.

Christmas Conservation Matters

Monitoring Return to 1616 animals - Finding Clues in Poo!

With the ongoing success of the Dirk Hartog Island National Park Return to 1616 Ecological Restoration Project, one of the biggest challenges for the fauna team is keeping tabs on all of the new arrivals as they establish and breed in their new island abode. Four of the 13 species have now been established on the island including banded harewallabies, rufous hare-wallabies, dibblers and Shark Bay bandicoots and all of them need to be monitored as they settle in and begin breeding.

When you consider that they all have their own little behavioural foibles, however, keeping track of their 'comings and goings' across a huge island is an enormous task. Traditional methods of radiotracking animals with radio collars has used successfully for many years, but this can be time consuming, labour intensive and costly.

So, it's a case of working smarter not harder and a new 'bag of tricks' is required! Fortunately, innovative new techniques are being developed that might help.

Revolutionary GPS (Global Positioning System) technology is now being trialled to help save time and give more information. Just like Tom Toms in cars that use satellites to help with navigation, GPS tags can be used to locate the island's new inhabitants. With drone technology currently being trialled, it's possible to download information on the whereabouts of up to 100 animals at one time.

More recently, the team have been working on a more innovative approach using DNA... from poo! Every time a wallaby leaves behind some poo (or scats to give the more scientific term), they also leave behind cells containing DNA. The DNA in these cells can be used, in the best forensic "whodunnit" tradition, to work out which animal it belonged to. An estimation of population size can be made simply by collecting scat samples within a given area.

Our intrepid science team have been on Dirk Hartog Island these past few weeks collecting samples to trial

this new technique. Results of this method so far suggest a promising new, low-cost, easy and efficient tool in the monitoring tool-kit.



- Using a straw to suck and relocate items into a bowl.



A Message from Vince



As we keep working together to navigate our way through unprecedented and challenging times and situations, now more than ever it is important for our politicians from all political persuasions to work together.

The balancing act of ensuring our regional communities are safe by managing our State border in a smart way, while keeping our economy moving forward, is achievable.

Despite the North being the engine room of the State's economy, keeping the State afloat, people in jobs and contributing greatly to our budget surplus during one of our most challenging economic times, it was disappointing the funding of many key projects across the regions has again been overlooked.

With many Shires barely registering on the radar in the recent budget, despite significant contributions, communities in the Shires have seemingly not been rewarded with funding commensurate with the enormous financial contributions being made.

The focus on the development of regional communities appears to have been diluted in the absence of the Nationals WA Royalties for Regions Program, resulting in a reduction in basic infrastructure projects, most taken for granted in metro areas and continuing to be over looked or now not even in the mix in the regions.



BEING PREPARED FOR LA NIÑA WEATHER EVENTS STORM BREWING:

The Bureau of Meteorology recently confirmed the arrival of Australia's first active La Niña season since 2010-2012. Based on the unprecedented levels of damage and disruption experienced during the last La Niña, individuals and business owners should be exercising high levels of caution, particularly those with operations in Australia's northern and/or eastern states.

From a meteorological perspective, La Niña means there is likely to be an increase in the number and severity of tropical cyclones between November 2020 and April 2021. Critically, the knock-on effects of these storms may once again be felt far beyond the cyclone zones themselves through above-average rainfall, flooding and storm surges, and higher-than-usual tides.

With more than five months of potential La Niña events still ahead of us, it's essential to take all necessary precautions to minimise the potential risks and costs to your home and business should it be affected by an extreme weather event. You'll find some useful general tips for doing this, below. But beyond these, one of the most important things you can do right now is speak with your Insurance company to ensure that your 'sums insured' are adequate and that all of your insurance policies are up-to-date.

<u>8 PROPERTY PREPARATION TIPS FOR YOUR HOME</u> <u>& BUSINESS</u>

No amount of preparation can guarantee your business or home won't be impacted by a major weather event. However, you can certainly take action to help mitigate both the likelihood and severity of any La Niña-related claims in the workplace. The following steps are a good place to start:

- Move your most important personal and business documents and data/devices to places that are secure and 'weather-proof'.
- Ensure you have adequate insurance to cover loss or damage to your key home and business premises and assets - and also understand what isn't covered.
- Check with your local council to ensure your business premises meets the required building standards.
- In the event of a major weather event, ensure the structural elements of your buildings (walls, roof and eves) are fixed and secure.
- Store any poisons or chemicals safely above ground level.
- Consider raising power outlets above previous flood levels.
- Keep gutters and downpipes clear from any blockages.
- Keep treetops and branches clear of your buildings and equipment



Ross River virus risk expands from South West to the Midwest and Gascoyne

The Department of Health is urging residents and travellers throughout Western Australia (WA), to take extra precautions to avoid mosquito bites over the coming months, to prevent mosquitoborne disease transmission.

The warning follows ongoing Ross River virus (RRV) detections in mosquitoes and a recent increase in the number of human cases of RRV disease notified to the Department of Health, indicating the virus is very active in the environment.

The current risk of acquiring RRV is highest in the South West of WA, and along the coastal Midwest and Gascoyne regions, from Jurien Bay to Denham.

Acting Managing Scientist at the Department of Health, Dr Abbey Potter, said that the increased activity is likely to be the result of prevailing 'La Niña' weather conditions, coupled with a number of years of below average RRV activity in WA.

"RRV naturally cycles in the environment between mosquitoes and animal hosts, such as kangaroos. During an outbreak, infected animals develop immunity to the virus, reducing the potential for transmission in subsequent years," she said.

"We have now experienced a number of years of belowaverage activity of RRV, so it is reasonable to expect that fewer animal hosts are immune at the moment. When low herd immunity is coupled with large numbers of mosquitoes and sustained virus activity, we can expect to see an increase in the number of cases of RRV disease in people."

"Recent rainfall and increased tidal activity, combined with warm weather, is likely to result in a continuation of high mosquito numbers over coming weeks."

"Mosquito management is being undertaken by local government authorities in collaboration with the Department of Health in areas with a recognised risk of RRV activity," she said.

"However, it is not realistic to rely on mosquito management programs alone to control all mosquitoes. Individuals living in or travelling to the regions need to take their own precautions to avoid mosquito bites." Symptoms of RRV disease can last for weeks to months, and include painful or swollen joints, sore muscles, skin rash, fever, fatigue and headaches. The only way to diagnose the disease is by visiting your doctor and having a specific blood test.

There is currently no vaccine or specific treatment for RRV disease, the only way to prevent infection is to avoid being bitten by mosquitoes.

Despite the warning, there is no need to alter any travel plans. Individuals living or travelling in the regions are encouraged to take the following precautions to prevent mosquito bites:


- avoid outdoor exposure, particularly at dawn and early evening;
- wear protective (long, loosefitting, lightcoloured) clothing when outdoors;
- apply an effective personal repellent containing diethyltoluamide (DEET) or picaridin evenly to all areas of exposed skin and always follow the label instructions;
- ensure infants and children are adequately protected against mosquito bites, preferably with suitable clothing, bed nets or other forms of insect screening;
- remove water holding containers from around the home and garden to ensure mosquitoes do not breed in your own backyard;
- use mosquito coils and mosquito lanterns and apply barrier sprays containing bifenthrin in patio and outdoor areas around houses; and ensure insect screens are installed and in good condition on houses and caravans;
- use mosquito nets and mosquitoproof tents if sleeping outside.

Shark Bay Fishing Club committee

How many species of seagrass are there?

There are approximately 70 species of seagrass (wirriya jalyanu) globally, surrounding all land masses, except Antarctica. Twelve species occur in Shark Bay (Gathaagudu) waters. Shark Bay is at the temperate-tropical zone which means both temperate (cool water) and tropical (warm water) species grow together. Many of the smaller tropical seagrasses are only found in the shelter of the larger temperate species, as they provide protection from grazing dugongs (wuthuga)and hungry fish. One tropical seagrass species, Halophila spinulosa or the fern seagrass, is beautiful and its' meadows wax and wane over the years, disappearing and reappearing.




