Executive Officer's Report







Expressions of Interest

Expressions of Interest are being sort by locals to become QPR Facilitators in the Gascoyne region. QPR stands for Question, Persuade, Refer. It is an evidence-based suicide prevention training that aims to help people recognise signs that someone may be thinking of or in the initial phase of a suicidal plan, and seek an emergency response on their behalf. The training can be completed online, but can also be delivered Face-to-Face in a 60-90 minute session. Over the past year, WA Country Health Service Mental Health & Community Alcohol & Drug Services (CADS) have been rolling out QPR face-to-face traininh throughout Geraldton and the northwest Gascoyne region and have had a good response with businesses and workplaces who find the short format fits in easily with team meetings and busy schedules.

WA Country Health Service Mental Health & CADS are seeking 6 people to become QPR face-to-face facilitators for the Gascoyne region. These people would be required to:

- Complete an online (admittedly, quite dry) instructor training within 3 months of being selected.
- Promote QPR in your town / region.
- Work with another QPR facilitator to conduct, at least, 4

QPR trainings per year. (Note: There are 2 QPR facilitators for each training)

 Send relevant paperwork (sign-up sheets, evaluation forms) to WACHS for analysis.

While QPR Facilitators are able to charge for the course, WA Country Health Service Mental Health & CADS feel that it is in the interest of the community that this is offered for free to ensure accessibility for all. As such, it would be beneficial if the facilitator has permission and support from their workplace to complete their facilitation training and run the QPR courses.

In return, WA Country Health Service Mental Health & Community Alcohol & Drug Services (CADS) will:

- Reimburse selected individuals for the online instructor training, valued at \$644. (Please note: You will need to provide a Tax Invoice for reimbursement, as well as a Statement by Supplier if you do not have an ABN).
- Assist with promoting QPR in the Gascoyne region
- Provide all materials for QPR training, including booklets and localised powerpoint presentations.
- Liaise with QPR Facilitators on a regular basis to analyse evaluations and provide feedback, and assist with any problems that may arise.

Grants

The Arts \$15k plus grant program offers between \$15,000 and \$60,000 funding for artists, creative industry professionals and organisations to deliver a one-off project or a program of activity.

The program supports the development and growth of a vibrant sector that promotes the participation and active engagement of Western Australian communities in high quality arts and cultural experiences.

Individuals, groups and organisations are welcome to apply however:

- Individuals must have Australian citizenship or permanent resident status.
- Groups including unincorporated bodies, partnerships and individuals informally collaborating on an activity must be based in Australia.
- Organisations must either be registered under law (e.g. incorporated association, company limited by guarantee) or created by law (e.g. university, school or government statutory authority).



- WA educational institutions (kindergartens, primary and secondary schools, colleges and universities) cannot apply for curriculum-based arts activity. If you are in any doubt, contact us to discuss your activity.
- If you are applying on behalf of Aboriginal people you must provide evidence of significant Aboriginal involvement in the conception, development of and participation in the activity.
- Although WA residency is not a requirement to apply for a grant, if you are applying from outside WA you will need to show the benefits to WA artists, creatives, arts or cultural workers in your application.

SHIRE PRESIDENT'S REPORT - JANUARY 2020

AUSTRALIA DAY

More than 100 people attended the Australia Day event held in the Shire Hall

on 26 January and celebrated all that's great about Australia and being an Australian.

Australia Day is for all of us, regardless of where our stories began, to come together to acknowledge our past, celebrate the present and look to our future. Being Australian means we can come from many different cultures and backgrounds but live in harmony and appreciate our good fortune to be Australians and enjoy the freedoms we have.

A big thank you to the CRC and Shire staff, volunteer 'chefs' and Shark Bay Entertainers for ensuring the celebrations were a great success!

CITIZENSHIP AWARDS PRESENTATION

The Shire of Shark Bay's citizenship awards demonstrate our appreciation for all those volunteers who contribute to the Australian community by donating their time and energy to support others. I congratulate and thank ALL those who were nominated for the awards and acknowledge your contributions to the local community. The award in each category was presented to; Kyle Dobney (Youth), Shark Bay Speedway Club (Group or Event), Maureen Hoult (Senior) and Brian Child (Citizen 25+ Yrs).

SILVER CHAIN AND MEDICAL SERVICES

the continuity of local medical services, the CEO and I recently organised a meeting with Silver Chain directors to discuss with them the current situation regarding employment of a replacement nurse practitioner and other issues. I can reassure you we are working with Silver Chain to ensure that the service being provided is not diminished.

An experienced health service professional has been engaged by Silver Chain to review operations at the Shark Bay clinic (and 12 additional remote posts) and will shortly visit Shark Bay and assess the services here. It is anticipated she will meet with President Council and seek input from community members whilst in the Bay.

Whilst Silver Chain is meeting their State Government contractual obligations with the current provision of medical services, the Council will continue its endeavours on your behalf to seek an expanded and improved service for Shark Bay.

HYDROGEN POWER IN DENHAM

I'm sure most of you would have seen the recent media release regarding Denham being selected to trial the first hydrogen plant powered by solar energy in WA which, if successful, could become the model blueprint for hydrogen power in other regional towns and provide the opportunity to expand the plant to supply full power requirements for the town in the future.

The trial hydrogen plan will produce enough energy to power 100 homes and Denham is the first regional town where the capability of hydrogen as a future renewable energy source is being tested. The project is being run by Horizon Power, which has sought EOIs from companies to build the 60-kilowatt plant. Council has agreed to lease a 20 ha area of land adjacent to the current wind turbine facility.

Excess energy from the solar panels will be fed into the grid, adding to the wind power from the turbines and solar energy from homes. Our diesel generator would then be replaced with renewable energy as part of Horizon Power's goal of no new diesel power by 2025. This trial has attracted interest from across Australia and will be widely watched.

It will be equipped with the latest electronic navigation and communication equipment as well as search aids including FLIR night vision capability

It will be up to the group to sell Rescue 3 on the open market and the proceeds of the sale will be transferred to DFES to go toward the cost of the replacement vessel.





Hi guys i know i said this was my last article but I've done so much fishing this month so bring on the encore.

My friend Nate Eastough came back up to Shark Bay for about a month's holiday and stayed with us. Daily we were either fishing, boating, swimming or spearfishing, with the odd down day watching the Xbox needed. You would find us either at the service jetty, boat ramp, snorkelling along the foreshore, at swimming lessons or out fishing at the old sunken barge, ship wreck out the front of Denham Seaside or in the moorings.

We went crabbing a few times out at Monkey Mia and we always got a hand full of sized ones, which were delicious and it made sure we were not over doing it and crabbing for our future. While we were there, we went fishing at the old sunken Pearl farm on Australia Day and we caught a blacky, mulloway, the world's largest ranking cod (20cm good job Nate) and I caught the beauty, a 73cm

pink snapper. It blew everyone away as they were enjoying themselves in the sunshine and water back at the boat ramp!

After we went fishing, we went over to the new Pearl farm pontoon with the Morgan's and went ski biscuiting with all the kids. It was heaps of fun before I forgot flung off the biscuit because of my mate Josh Emery.

I took Mum out on the boat one hot day as its normally just me and the boys. She stayed on the boat and was decky while Nate and I went diving. Chuck out the anchor and wait it out or call for help (mum always makes me take a phone). Someone will come looking for you eventually, especially if you can't find the phone. I can see why VMR cadets is a great idea now, regardless of how much fishing or boating anyone does.



Verbesina - Wolf in Sheep's Clothing

You may have noticed a new plant around the Denham area at the moment. Although Golden Crownbeard (*Verbesina encelioides*) bears a superficial resemblance to the beautiful sunflower and has a delightful name, don't be fooled by this "wolf in sheep's clothing". It's definitely not a local and although it's trying to "sneak in under the radar", this interloper isn't welcome in our spectacular natural environment.

Drought tolerant, Verbesina produces lots of seed which helps it to form thickets that rapidly "blanket" entire areas. It also releases a chemical into the soil which suppresses other vegetation helping it to push out native plants and animals as it spreads.






Whilst other areas have succumbed to this new and deadly weed, Denham is well placed to "shut the barn door" and keep Verbesina out. If allowed to get a foothold, enormous damage could be done to the Shark Bay World Heritage Area's plants and animals and the Dirk Hartog Island National Park *Return to 1616* Ecological Restoration Project.

What to do?

An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure! Hand removal works well early on and it's so much easier to remove a couple of plants than to tackle hectares of 'wall to wall' Verbesina. So get in early! If you see some growing, removal is simple!

- Put a bag over it to prevent seed drop
- Pull it up by the roots so it can't resprout,
- bin it

But be careful! This plant is toxic and sap can be irritating so use gloves! If you catch it before seed set – check out appropriate herbicide use at www. florabase.dpaw.wa.gov.au/browse/profile/15725



Prevent the spread of Verbesina. Before heading out bush, or over to Dirk Hartog Island National Park, check your 4WD and camping gear to ensure you have no weed seeds looking for a free ride.

Turtle Tagging

You've probably all heard the joke - How do you catch a unique animal?......you neek up on it!

Well that's exactly what volunteers have been doing at Turtle Bay on Dirk Hartog Island National Park recently. Getting up close and personal with a truly unique marine turtle is a fabulous opportunity for volunteers who come from near and far to join in WA's longest running project studying the loggerhead turtle (*Caretta caretta*).

Loggerhead turtles are the second largest marine turtle in the world and the vast majority of WA's loggerheads nest right here in Shark Bay. Within this region, Dirk Hartog Island has WA's highest density and population of nesting turtles and is thankfully free of feral animals with very little human disturbance which makes it a critically important site to their survival.

Between 1000 – 1200 turtles nest on Dirk Hartog island in breeding season each year between November and April. Each night, female turtles perform the herculean task of heaving their heavy bodies up the beach to dig a hole and lay between 50 and 100 eggs. Each day volunteers count the drag marks to help estimate population numbers. The volunteer's nightshift involves walking along the beaches and rocky shores of Dirk Hartog Island to locate the turtles, tag and record information on them. Tagging allows them to be identified when they return to the beach and the information recorded is used to gain a better understanding of turtle ecology.

How can we help?

Loggerhead turtles are listed as endangered in Australia and are vulnerable the world over as a result of many threats including loss of nesting areas, nest predation, pollution, disorientation from coastal lighting and being caught by long lines and trawling nets. But there are things we can all do to help.

Plastic

Along with crustaceans and molluscs, turtles eat jellyfish. Unfortunately, floating plastic in the ocean can look a lot like jellyfish and when eaten by turtles, it can have dire consequences. Plastic ingestion is a major contributor to turtle deaths but there are things we can do to help. So hang on to your plastic or try to reduce or eliminate your plastic use entirely, especially when heading out on a boating trip.

Pets

Pets aren't permitted in national parks for good reason. Dogs can interfere with hatchlings and disturb females laying eggs so leave the pets behind when heading out.

Light pollution

Light from vehicles and camping or even torchlight and flash photography can cause female turtles to abandon the nest when laying eggs and interfere with hatchlings ability to navigate.



Leap Year

We all know our calendar has 365 days on it, and that makes up a year. But it actually takes the earth 365.25 days to completely orbit the sun. That extra quarter day, added up four times, means that a day needs to be added to the calendar every four years. That extra day is February 29th in our calendar. The last one was 2016, & this year 2020 is one. It makes life difficult for anyone born on 29th February in a Leap Year.



It gets a bit more complicated, because the earth's orbit is not quite 365.25 days. So that extra day every four years overcompensates for the error. Over a period of 400 years, the total errors amount to three extra days.

Did you know that every 400 hundred years the calendar leaves out the leap day on each of the next three century years. The last time it occurred was the year 1600. In the years 1700, 1800, 1900 there was no 29th February. Then 2000 was a leap year, so the years 2100, 2200, 2300 will not be leap years.

Usually any date on the calendar advances one day of the week from one year to the next. The name "leap year" comes from the fact that in a

leap year, the day of the week will leap two days forward from March, because of the extra day on February 29th. As a consequence, Christmas Day 2019 was on Wednesday; this year it will be on Friday.

So what caused this "missing" day and our calendar to be out of sync? The answer is found in the Bible!

Joshua, the successor to Moses, was leading Israel in battle against the nation's enemies at a city named Gibeon, Joshua had the upper hand and wanted to finish off the enemy. He prayed to God, "Let the sun stand still over Gibeon. and the moon over the valley of Aijalon". So the sun stood still and the moon stayed in place until Israel had defeated its enemies. The Bible recorded, "There has never been a day like this before or since. The sun stayed in the middle of the sky, and did not set for about a whole day." This means that the earth stood still, since the sun and moon didn't move in the sky, for almost a full day, but not a full 24 hours. This has been taken to account for most of the missing 24 hours in the earth's

Added to this is the record of a King Hezekiah, who was faithful to God but was dying from an illness. Isaiah a prophet, assured the king that God would heal him. Hezekiah asked for a sign, which was not uncommon in his day. The prophet stated that God would make the shadow on the sun dial either move forward 10 degrees or back 10 degrees, according to the king's choice. The king asked the Lord to make the sun move backwards ten degrees,

which he did & Hezekiah received a further 15 years of life. Ten degrees on a sun dial equals 40 minutes of time, the portion of time that fills the gap in the "missing" day in our Earth's orbit. Joshua's "about a whole day", reckoned as 23 hours and 20 minutes, plus Hezekiah's 40 minutes equals 24 hours.

Only the creator of our planet, God, could alter its orbit, and in his care for the children of earth, he chose to do so! Leap Year is a testimony that God is in control, and one day he will cause time to be no more. So let's not waste this 'extra' day we have; make the most of your leap day, make the most of every day!







If you call the Shark Bay Health Centre after hours you will be transferred through to Health Direct where a Registered Nurse will ask you a number of questions to determine whether you need further emergency assessment by the Shark Bay nurse. If you require further assessment, your call will be put through to the local nurse.

Examples of an EMERGENCY include:

- Breathing difficulties
- Chest pain
- Severe abdominal pain
- Bleeding that can't be controlled with first aid
- · Convulsions and fits
- Deep lacerations
- Eye or ear injuries
- · Uncontrolled high fever
- Loss of consciousness
- Pregnancy bleeding or onset of labour
- A very sick child
