Far Western

The 33rd Far Western Speedway Championship is almost here and the Shark Bay Speedway Club is well underway to ensuring they host yet another fantastic show of racing and adrenaline for our community. To date over 90 drivers have nominated to compete, which is a fantastic turn out indicating several hundred people alone will be in our community just to compete and assist crews with their racing at the Blue Ribboned event.

Due to the number of new star junior drivers nominating, a category titled Little Stars has been created to feature racing through out the day. This category will showcase the racing skills of the Club's beginner drivers and includes Rory Reynolds debuting on the track. The majority of these kids are aged between 10 and 11 and have only just mastered driving a manual car. Other racing divisions featuring will include New Stars Juniors, Top Stars Juniors, Super Mods, Modified Sedans, Production Sedans, Street Stocks, Wingless Sprints and everyone's favourite the Sprint Cars.

This is the first Blue Ribbon event to commence in Western Australia since the COVID 19 pandemic, with drivers and racing enthusiast itching to get back out racing now restirctions have been lifted. Shark Bay was actually the first Speedway Club

in Australia to commence racing again, with the first event run back on the 13th June. Think of the money these type of events, including the annual Fishing Fiesta, Barefoot Blacktie, Winter Markets etc bring to our town!

The Club has been busy making improvements around the track, grounds and administration to ensure they maintain their compliance with all safety regulations and requirements. Since Far Western in 2019, the track has been made wider, as new concrete wall panels are continuing to be installed. The Club now plans to work towards upgrading the grader as well as installing more female toilets.

A big array of sponsors have jumped on board to assist this year and the Club wishes to thank them all. SHIRE PRESIDENT'S REPORT - JUNE 2020

Corona Virus Restrictions Reduced

With the lifting of, and/or reduction in, Covid-19 restrictions across most of the regions in WA from 25 May, Shark Bay has experienced a substantial influx of visitors during the past three weeks or so despite the WA 'hard border' still being in place. The proactive approach by the Shire and Discovery Centre staff for many weeks prior to the intrastate



borders opening, has resulted in accommodation across the Bay being fully booked out for the July school holidays and local businesses reporting some economic relief and returning cash flows.

Shire Facilities Re-open










Ten Take Home Parenting Tips

 - Expressing our emotions
 - Coaching them through theirs
 - Story telling
 - Reading books
 - Observations
- Remember, difficult behaviour often starts with an emotion that the child can't manage,

- Parents need to help soothe these emotions using empathy and acknowledgement of the emotions rather than dismissing or minimizing them.





Shark Bay Community Men's Shed

Lots of activity

Now that the Shed is back to normal capacity, there has been lots happening and lots still to come in the future weeks.

Sadly at our recent meeting we accepted the resignation of acting President Bill Ross. Bill and Jocelyn are heading for a well-deserved semi-retirement in Geraldton. Bill has been an active member of the Shed since arriving in Denham three years ago and firmly believes in the need for a place for men to get together. Bill was on the Steering Committee which established the Shed and took over as Acting President late last year. The Shed team thank Bill for his hard work and positive approach to men's health issues and wish him and Jocelyn a long and happy 'semi-retirement'.

The Annual general Meeting of the Shed is scheduled for Monday August 17 at the Bowls Club at 5pm. More on this closer to the time BUT there will be nibblies and light refreshments following the Meeting. At the meeting all Executive positions will be declared vacant and it is clear that we will be looking for a new President and a new Secretary as I will be returning to Queensland a few days after the AGM. There is a phrase something like 'Now is the time for all good men to come to the aid of the Shed.'

At present there has been no forward progress on our application

for funding for a new Shed due to the impact of Covid 19. However discussions are continuing with the War On waste team in the expectation that some time in the new year there will be the possibility of a shared premises in Hughes Street.

POP-UP Bicycle Shop

Watch our local web pages for full details of our planned 'pop-up bicycle shop' coming on Monday July 6 between 8am and 10am. The shop will be in the forecourt of the Discovery Centre.

Why a pop-up shop? As Carlos said recently 'We are being overrun by bicycles' and he is right. Our collection network now extends as far south as the Recycle Shop at the Geraldton tip where a recent visit resulted in an offer of bicycles whenever someone is passing through with a trailer. I never thought you could fit three bicycles in a Cruze BUT you can.

The Shed team has been working on repurposing bicycles either discarded or donated for some time and has an extensive set of smaller bicycles available. Price is \$25 each not only as a fund raiser for the Shed but to cover costs when we have to purchase items such as tubes. It is quite an interesting exercise to mix and match bicycle parts and so far very few bicycles have been returned to the tip for metal recycling.

If you don't have a helmet, you need to know that bicycle helmets are on special at Shark Bay Fuel.

Help support this major Men's Shed activity.

Eventually, if unsold, bicycles will make their way to the Geraldton hub of the group 'Bicycles for Humanity'.


Vision Christian Radio, as the name suggests, is a radio station broadcasting 24/7 in more than 700 locations around Australia, including Denham, Shark Bay.



It has been 16 days since Phase 3 came into effect here in WA and Western Australians have once again been outstanding.

People have enjoyed the new freedoms, supported local businesses and continued to listen to health advice around physical distancing and good personal hygiene.

Thanks to our relaxed restrictions, WA is already the most economically free and active State in Australia.

And today I can announce that as of this Saturday, those restrictions will be easing even further.

In line with expert health advice, Phase 4 will commence this Saturday 27 June.

It will allow even more activities to recommence in WA, and continue to make our State the envy of the nation, and the world.

But before I outline those changes, it's important to acknowledge that our hard border has been in place unashamedly to protect the health and wellbeing of Western Australians.

It has allowed us to confidently

ease restrictions more than any other State and open up our local economy.

Having to reimpose restrictions in WA would be absolutely catastrophic.

I won't undo the good work of all Western Australians and rush to open the border against our health advice.

As part of Phase 4, from Saturday, the follow changes will

occur:

- All existing gathering limits and the 100/300 rule will be removed.
 Gathering limits will only be determined by WA's reduced 2sqm capacity rule;
- The 2sqm rule will include staff only at venues that hold more than 500 patrons;
- Removal of seated service requirements at food businesses and licensed premises, meaning Western Australians can once again enjoy a beer while standing at a pub or bar;
- No requirement to maintain patron register at food businesses and licensed premises;
- All events will be permitted except for large scale, multi-stage music festivals;
- Unseated performances will be permitted at venues such as concert halls, live music venues, bars and pubs;
- Gyms can operate unstaffed, but regular cleaning must be maintained; and
- The casino gaming floor reopening under agreed

temporary restrictions.

For WA's major sport and entertainment venues, a 50% capacity rule will apply. Therefore, under Phase 4 the temporary capacity of Optus Stadium will be 30,633 for sport events (35,000 for concerts), HBF Park can hold 10,150 (16,500 for concerts), RAC Arena can hold 7,150 (8,250 for concerts).

Today we've also outlined Phase 5 of easing restrictions - which is expected to take effect on Saturday 18 July.

Phase 5 will include removing ALL State restrictions except for the hard border with the eastern states and travel restrictions for remote Aboriginal communities.

That will include the removal of the 2sqm rule and the 50% capacity rule for our major venues.

This will be a significant moment for our State.

Phase 4 is another giant step for WA – we're confident it's the right step, at the right time.

However, Western Australians must continue to keep up physical distancing where possible and good personal hygiene to better protect themselves and the general health of our community.

We need to remain vigilant. We must take nothing for granted.

We need to all understand that if you are unwell, don't try be a hero and still go to work. It's simply not worth it.

Because if we have an uncontrolled outbreak, we will have to place restrictions back on.

And I cannot be clearer on this – I don't want to even contemplate that scenario.


