Executive Officer's Report

The Shark Bay Community Resource Centre will be returning to normal operating hours, 9am – 4pm as of Monday 4th May 2020. We thank everyone for their adjustment to our temporary opening times and welcome your return back to the CRC to utilise our facilities, knowledge and activities. Our Centre has received numerous calls recently regards when the Recreation Centre will be open again, however unfortunately this facility remains closed, a directive from State & Federal Government. The Shire has addressed this in their notices should you require further information or clarification.

WALKING GROUP

If your struggling to find the motivation to get out of your house and exercise on your own, then consider participating in our 5pm Tuesday Walking Group. This group of individuals meets at the CRC each Tuesday and sets off on a leisurely walk around Denham. Your welcome to bring along your or a friends dog to join us. No pressure, it's just a chance to socialise and exercise.

FISHING

We were delighted and excited by the Premier's announcement over the long weekend that recfishing is now a supported recreational activity once again back in WA. That means so long as we all practise social distancing and good common sense behaviours at the boat ramp, we can all go and wet a line again with the Government's full support. Just keep in mind social distancing needs to be maintained even on a boat unless with members of your household. That's 1.5m apart or one person per 4m² so think about how that might work on your boat and continue to avoid crowding at our local jetties especially when squidding at night time.

This is great news for the wider community as a whole with fishing providing a much-needed break and a good boost for people's well-being at this challenging time. It's also a good opportunity to check in on your fishing mates now that permitted gatherings have been increased from two people

up to 10 - as we all know how important time on the water and a good conversation can be for mental health. And of course, for those doing it tough financially, as many West Aussies are now, fishing provides the opportunity to put a healthy meal on the table as well.

LOTTERYWEST COVID-19 RELIEF FUND – NOW OPEN

A new funding program delivered in partnership between Lotterywest, Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries, and VenuesWest has recently been announced with 2 specific programs relevant to the Sport & Recreation Industry:

1. Event Cancellation Relief for Arts, Sports and Community Groups

Funding will be available for not-for-profit arts, sports and community organisations that are experiencing financial hardship as a result of events cancelled due to COVID 19. This program will consider cancellation costs and incurred and/ or committed costs related to events cancelled between 16 March 2020 and 15 September 2020. Arts, culture and community organisations can also seek support relating to actual and/or anticipated revenue that is necessary to deliver services or programs.

Applications will need to demonstrate that the cancellation of an event has resulted in financial hardship that may affect your organisation's ability to support the WA community with future activities.

2. Resilient Arts, Sports and Community Groups

Funding will be available for not-for-profit arts, sports and community organisations across the State to maintain staff, pivot operations, collaborate, develop new ways of working, innovate, maintain viability and build resilience as appropriate for future recovery. The program will contribute towards ensuring that eligible





organisations are able to continue delivering benefit for the Western Australian community during the State of Emergency.

Applications for both of these programs will open from Friday 24 April and close midnight Wednesday 13 May. It is imperative that any prospective applicants call Lotterywest in the first instance to register an expression of interest. Once registered, clubs and associations are encouraged to make contact with the departments Gascoyne offices to discuss their specific circumstances and to seek support and advice in preparing applications

SCIENCE WEEK GRANTS

The Western Australian Coordinating Committee for National Science Week (WACC) is offering grants to fund regional and metropolitan online STEM activities. Proposed activities are to be held in August, preferably during National Science Week (15-23 August 2020), in Western Australia.

Suggested avenues to engage include (but are not limited to) interactive online events, podcasts, digital storytelling, videos, virtual tours, citizen science activities and webinars.

Applications should be received no later than 5pm on Friday 15 May 2020 should be sent to scienceweek@scitech.org.au. Late and incomplete applications will not be accepted.

How to apply

Please complete the accompanying application form, paying attention to the guidelines below. Ensure you have described your activity/event and its intended outcomes fully.

Your activity MUST:

- engage the community or a set demographic within the community with a STEM based activity.
- adhere to laws as outlined by the West Australian Government regarding COVID-19.
- not be a school-only event.
- be held during August 2020.
- be a free event for all attendees.
- be evaluated by collecting feedback from participants during or after the activity and a written report submitted.

In addition, it would be desirable if your activity/

- · involves two or more organisations working in partnership.
- partners with, or, aimed to engage underrepresented or disadvantaged groups (e.g. minorities, multicultural, indigenous, low socio-economic, disability, regional or remote groups) or Youth.
- involves novel and/or innovative programs that have not been part of National Science Week before.
- creates an opportunity for attendees to explore further science activities in their local area after the activity/event.
- uses National Science Week as a launching point for a broader program or event with lasting impacts or outcomes.
- is recorded for use as an ongoing digital resource. In this instance, your application must provide evidence that the consent of those appearing in your footage has been considered.

If you are successful, you will be required to submit a valid tax invoice to receive funds no later than Friday 5 June 2020.

Shire President's Report

COVID-19 VIRUS PANDEMIC

Shire Operations Update

Full refunds have been provided for eligible gym members and also for the Shire's commission on cancelled accommodation and tour bookings. We continue supporting the local business sector and promoting available services (e.g. takeaway meals), whilst assisting with business and recovery planning, as well as helping community groups, where possible, to amend their activities (i.e. ANZAC Day commemoration).

Cancellation of Events and Activities

In response to the Recreation Centre April School Holiday Program and Youth Week Program cancellations, the Shire's Community Development Officer, in collaboration with the CRC, has prepared take-home activity packs to keep our young community members active.

The Shire's Community Assistance Grants Round 2 (2019/2020) applications were due to open during April, but will unfortunately now be postponed until the new financial year, with the Shire supporting our community organisations with funding for future projects and events.

The Shark Bay Winter Festival Markets were scheduled for 12 July, but have now been cancelled, with planning underway to host a Family Fun Day event once the Corona Virus restrictions have been lifted.

Staying Connected

In order to limit face-to-face interactions during the pandemic restrictions, the Shire has increased its social media presence. So, you can follow the Shire's Facebook page, register to receive SMS text messages or visit the website www.sharkbay. wa.gov.au to keep up-to-date on the Shire's services and resources provided to keep everyone both mentally and physically healthy whilst at home.

REX Airline Services

The WA State Government recently announced the provision of financial assistance towards

maintaining some REX services to regional WA for a period of three months before being reviewed. On 28 March, REX signed a Commonwealth Grant Agreement under the COVID-19 Regional Airline support program to receive assistance to maintain a minimal weekly schedule to regional and remote areas. This program will provide funding for up to six months, with an initial approval for six weeks. REX has applied for funding to conduct three weekly return services on the Perth-Carnarvon-Monkey Mia route. Visit REX's website http://www.rex.com.au/ for flight schedules.

Job Keeper Package

Whilst the local government sector was very active in the lead-up to the Job Keeper package when it was being introduced to Parliament, and despite advice to the Federal Government of the potential impact for local governments if they were excluded from the package, it was disappointing that amendments put forward were not included in the final legislation. This potentially means that thousands of local government jobs across Australia will be at risk. Support packages for local government workers are also not under State Government consideration.

Local Government Workforce

Whilst the Shire has taken every measure to retain as many staff as possible during this current crisis, it is unfortunate that some casuals and several local contractors have been affected by the Job Keeper package decision and also by the limited (if any) income from closed facilities, frozen rate increases and struggling local businesses.

Regional Border Restrictions

Numbers of visitors to the Gascoyne Region were substantially reduced with the introduction of the regional border restrictions. This was very evident during the Easter holiday break with the vast majority of potential travellers to the Gascoyne heeding the Government's instructions to remain within their residential regions.

To date, the Gascoyne remains COVID-19 virus free, so let's take all precautions to remain so and keep our Region protected for the sake of all our communities by abiding by the rules and restrictions that have been instigated for our wellbeing.

Thanks, Shark Bay Community!

A Big Thanks to all our local community members who are sticking with the rules and continuing to observe social distancing, not meeting in large groups and maintaining good hygiene, with the aim of keeping us all safe and well. Thanks also to the local businesses that continue to support us, as well as to all of our volunteers, who freely give their time and effort to ensure our health and safety.

On behalf of the Shire Councillors and staff. I commend everyone in our community for displaying strength and resilience, banding together and supporting each other through this turmoil. Please continue taking care of yourselves and checking-in with family, friends and vulnerable members of our community.



National online charity GIVIT, official charity partner in times of disaster for States and local councils, is calling for generous Australians to donate the safer and smarter way - online at <u>GIVIT.org.au</u> - to best support those in need during the unprecedented Coronavirus crisis.

As in disasters and emergencies such as the recent bushfires, GIVIT is working with all levels of government and over 3,200 registered charities and community groups to best manage donations and ensure people impacted by COVID-19 have access to essential items when they need them.



David (Dave) John Naldrett 16/6/44 to 30/3/2020

Dave immigrated to WA in early 1967. His first job was at Krasnosteins at Rob's Jetty, after seeing the others in shorts he cut his jeans off and got horribly sunburnt. After his first pay day he quit because the bloke next to him doing exactly the same work got paid more. That night in the pub he was hired as a brickies labourer and from then on building and painting or whatever was going, in those days there was plenty of work for anyone who wanted to work.

He and his mate Ken had hiked from one end of England to the other and their idea was to hike around Australia. After a road trip from Perth to Northam - really long way for new poms, their idea changed to purchasing an old Landrover and driving around, which they did for 12 months.

Dave and I met in 1980 and moved to the Bay in January 1981 where he worked as a deckhand for approximately 5 years, then after a short stint at the Water Corporation he returned to the building/painting/maintenance game. He earned himself a good name with his fair prices and good results meaning he never lacked for work.

In the early 80s he was called on by Maxine (our Silver Chain nurse) to transfer patients in his station wagon, which was a bit of a rarity in a town of mostly 4 wheel drive vehicles. He joined St John's Ambulance beginning as a driver and working his way up to an Ambulance 2 Officer. He stayed with them for 10 years.

He was a founding member of the local SES Unit who he stayed with for 20 years. He was a conscientious member who dedicated hours to all aspects of training and became team leader in most areas putting his best efforts into whatever he did.

In 1981 he joined the golf club and in 1982 he was tricked into standing for President, a position he held from 1982 to 1984, bluffing his way through things he didn't know! He was an active volunteer at all busy bees and built the toilet block almost single handed. In 2000 he was awarded Life Membership.

In 1998 he (finally) proudly became naturalised.

In all that we still found time for golf, fishing and camping.

He wasn't well for over 3 years but he was, up until 2 days before his death, still going out with me for a drive and I was still getting my early coffee delivered. In the end, with the virus and no footy on TV, I think he just decided enough is enough.

Rest in peace now my love.







SHARK BAY SANDAKAN SCHOLARSHIP

As a result of the travel restriction due to the virus. the Sandakan scholarship travel to Borneo for ANZAC DAY has had to be postponed. Hopefully by April 2021 the world will have returned to some normality although there will be major hurdles in place regarding the ability of airlines to continue to operate and the government restrictions on Australians travelling overseas. This is the day when the local people remember their people that suffered and died during WW2.

We have been fortunate in that the airlines have given a credit for the booked tickets and the land-based travel operators and hotels all were very quick to provide refunds. All we have to do now is to see if there are any increased costs.


With the restrictions in place for events etc. here in Australia, we are not sure if we can raise enough money for a scholarship to be conducted this year as a big proportion of our local groups fund raising comes from catering at community events such as the fishing fiesta. It will be a shame if we cannot provide students from Shark Bay with the opportunity to partake in this commemorative

We will keep our community informed as time goes by, but in the meantime if any student that has an interest in the scholarship they have a great opportunity to do some research and prepare and polish a presentation in readiness. There has been a great response to this years' unusual ANZAC DAY remembrances and our Sandakan Scholarship is an extension of the traditional memorial day.

The events that occurred in British North Borneo (now Sabah) and Sarawak during the time the Australian and British soldiers were there as prisoners of war during WW2 resulted in over 99% death rate after October 1943. There were only six prisoners that managed to escape from the death marches and camps in 1945 to tell of the suffering endured by the prisoners. The Australian government placed restrictions on the publication of details of the prisoners' plight for around 40 years after the end of the war. Now, through the efforts of groups such as ours, Australia's young people have the opportunity to learn of this sad part of our history.

In just the past few weeks, all around the world millions of people have started to wonder and fear if they are moving to a terrible end with terrifying speed, thanks to the Covid-19 pandemic. The sheer horror of this fast-moving infection is coupled with the almost physical shock from its sudden onset. And even the most religious people ask: Why is this happening? And: Where is God in all of this?

The question is essentially the same that people ask when a hurricane wipes out hundreds of lives or when a single child dies from cancer. It is a question that saints and theologians have grappled with for all time. The question now consumes the minds of millions of believers and unbelievers alike. who shudder at rapidly rising death tolls, struggle with reports of health facilities unable to cope with corona virus suspects, and recoil at photos of rows of coffins: Why?

Over the centuries, many answers have been offered about natural suffering. Such as that suffering is a test – that certainly can be the case with regard to testing our faith and strengthening it, and many do attest to it.

But that approach can make God out to be a monster.

Or the argument that suffering is a punishment for sins. Jesus himself totally rejected that approach, in his teaching and actions, dismissing the image of the monstrous Father.

In the end, the most honest answer to the question of why the Covid-19 virus is killing thousands of people, why infectious diseases ravage humanity and why there is suffering at all is: We don't know. For me, this is the most honest and accurate answer. But if the mystery of suffering is unanswerable, where can the believer go in times like this? For the Christian and perhaps even for others the answer is Jesus.

Christians believe that Jesus is fully divine and fully human. Yet we sometimes overlook the second part. Jesus of Nazareth was born into a world of illness. Scholars of the times sum up the conditions of the world as, "filthy, foul-smelling and unhealthy." where "A case of the flu, a bad cold, or an abscessed tooth could kill."

By far the majority of his miracles were healings from illnesses and disabilities. In these frightening times, Christians find comfort in knowing that when they pray to Jesus, they are praying to someone who understands them not only because he is divine and knows all things, but because he is human and experienced all things.

But those who are not Christian can also see Jesus as a model for care of the sick. For him, the sick or dying person was not a victim or someone to be blamed, but his brother or sister, and ours. When he saw someone in need, his heart was "moved with compassion." Our model for how we are to care during this crisis is "with hearts moved by compassion."



I don't understand why people are dying, but I believe God is there in the midst of this pandemic. I pray that you can come to that belief too. If you would like to discuss this, please feel free to phone or email me, as below.

If you call the Shark Bay Health Centre after hours you will be transferred through to Health Direct where a Registered Nurse will ask you a number of questions to determine whether you need further emergency assessment by the Shark Bay nurse. If you require further assessment, your call will be put through to the local nurse.

Examples of an EMERGENCY include:

- · Breathing difficulties
- Chest pain
- Severe abdominal pain
- Bleeding that can't be controlled with first aid
- · Convulsions and fits
- Deep lacerations
- Eye or ear injuries
- Uncontrolled high fever
- Loss of consciousness
- Pregnancy bleeding or onset of labour
- · A very sick child
