Rec Centre

Its been a busy month at the Rec Centre as staff assisted with sports and athletics training for the school carnival. Students would attend after school and practice their distance running around the oval as well as their team sports games including passball, tunnel ball and leader ball.

Indoor soccer participation numbers have dropped so the CRC will after the school holidays commence basketball sessions on Wednesday's. Students will be encouraged to come along after school to training, followed by a game. Adult games will run the same night from 6.30pm. We will be asking adults to register their teams prior to it commencing as we plan to run the sport for a short period only (around 4 weeks however it depends on team nomination numbers).

We continue to be asked by parents when the Kindy Gym program will resume. Unfortunately we are unable to open this program until WA is in phase 5. The Shark Bay CRC is currently required to clean any surface touched whilst open at the Centre as well as any equipment or gear used, as per health regulations. Unfortuantely as you are aware this program allows and encourages children to play with a large amount of equipment, toys, books, blankets etc, with children touching and some even drooling over or placing toys in their mouths. We are all still required to social distance as well, which for young children can be quite difficult to understand.

However we encourage and welcome families to come along to our open courts sessions on Tuesday's. A smaller amount of equipment is made available and parents are encouraged to have a play of their chosen sport.

Halloween

Halloween originated with the ancient Celtic festival of Samhain, when people would light bonfires and wear costumes to ward off ghosts. The Celts, who lived 2,000 years ago in the area that is now Ireland, the United Kingdom and northern France, celebrated their new year on November 1. This day marked the end of summer and the harvest and the beginning of the dark, cold winter, a time of year that was often associated with human death. 

It may have come to your attention recently, that the Ranger has been visiting individuals regarding their dogs.


Responsibilities come with dog ownership and we would like to further assist you in understanding some of those responsibilities.

As a dog owner are you able to answer yes to all these questions?

- **Registration**: Is your dog registered? All dogs aged three months and over must be registered with your local authority. Failure to register your dog may result in a \$200 on-the-spot infringement.
- Tags: Is your dog wearing a current registration tag?
- **Microchipped**: Is your dog microchipped with your current address and relevant contact information? All registered dogs must be microchipped.
- Escape: Are your fences and gates good enough to stop your dog going under, over or through them?
- Behaviour: Does your dog socialise well with other dogs and people?
- Poo Patrol: Do you pick up your dog's poo when it does its business in public?
- **Exercise**: When you are out and about do you have your dog on a leash in public or under your control in dog exercise areas?
- Health: Is your dog free of parasites and in good condition for its age/breed?
- Home: Does your dog always have sufficient shelter, cooling, water, food and attention?



Volunteer Marine Rescue

Occasionally things happen that remind us why we decided to become volunteers in a group like Marine Rescue Shark Bay.

Such was the case during late August when a call from the Water Police advised that an epirb had been activated near the Useless Loop ship loading jetty. Three members left Denham in Tamala Rose on a high-speed dash in choppy conditions. Upon arriving in the area, the rescuers were contacted on channel 16 by a person on shore who could see smoke from a flare. They directed the rescue vessel in the direction of the sighting until three men clinging to an upturned and mostly submerged dinghy were located. The small dinghy had been swamped by a wave in the choppy conditions and the men had been in the water for an hour and a half. They were visibly shaken by the experience and shivering with the onset of hypothermia.

Thankfully, a good result in this case that could have ended tragically. They were taken to Denham Silver Chain and later released. The Useless Loop SES unit retrieved the dinghy and towed it ashore. Special thanks to the person onshore who guided the vessel toward the scene.

The men had made some basic mistakes that contributed to the dire situation they found themselves in. The 3.5 metre dinghy was too small for the conditions when the wind picked up and they were sixteen miles from the boat ramp in Denham. Their families on shore had no idea where they had gone or what time they were expected to return. They were not wearing their lifejackets and by the time they surfaced after being swamped the jackets on board had blown away from them in the fresh breeze. Fortunately, their epirb was in a bag which they could access easily, and it was this single factor that likely saved their lives.

Three volunteers were also called upon at 1am on Tuesday morning after a flare sighting was reported by a camper at Nanga Bay. The Challenger jet search aircraft flew up from Perth to scan the area with their electronic night vision capability, and Tamala Rose patrolled until the search was called off after sunrise with nothing found. Hopefully this wasn't a case of someone letting off a flare when not in distress, wasting our volunteers time and costing the States taxpayers thousands of dollars.

In other news, the construction of our new vessel is progressing well and is on schedule to be delivered at the end of November. Our much loved Edencraft, Rescue 3, is being advertised for sale and is generating a lot of interest because of the reputation of this design.

John Famlonga and Jack Capewell have fabricated an access gate for our new finger jetty at Tamala Rose's pen. We really appreciate the great service and the short time it took them to complete the job.

TRAINING

We train the first three Mondays of each month, starting at 5pm. A snap shot of our training program for September included: The first Monday was dedicated to general maintenance with our vehicle and rescue gear.

The second Monday saw us out in the bush doing a sweeping search. Terry did an amazing job setting the scenario up. The learning outcome of that exercise was that we need to brush up on our GPS skills.

In September a 3-year-old child went missing in the south west (the child was later found by his grandfather). This incident reminded us how important land searches are, so for our last training night, we did a re run of a bush search, but with lots more unidentified objects to find. All objects but one was located on the first search sweep. Members were determined to find the missing item so they repositioned and resumed their search. The item – a wooden pretend knife was finally located. In our debrief, it was identified how much the wooden knife blended in the dry bush and how hard it was to find. Searches sound easy, but we can assure you – they are not. It takes training and learnt skills to have favourable outcomes.

CYCLONE SEASON

Yes! It's that time of the year again. Time to think about your cyclone plan, get your back yard cleaned up and have Cyclone grab bag ready. The grab bag should include your valuable items, medication, food & drinks for several days, torch, clothing & personal items including important documents or information on where they are stored. A good idea would be to include some sort of personal entertainment (puzzle books, magazines/books, pencil & paper). Remember: the power may be out so you may not have internet or phone accessibility.


Responding to a cyclone event is the responsibility

of SES through DFES been the hazard management agency. However, there is a limit to what the SES can do after the event. We can assist to make a dwelling water proof if there is damage to the roof structure or windows. We can assist in providing props etc if the building is damaged structurally, but you must consider if it is safe for you to continue to live there if there is a possibility of further collapse. We can assist in clearing debris to provide access to your building if it is safe for you to continue to live there. We cannot provide permanent repairs to buildings as that is the landowners responsibility.

Property owners have a duty to take precautions to protect their property by having inspections and any remedial action taken to ensure the survivability of the property. Action plans need to be in place to decide where any loose objects such as outdoor furniture, play equipment, boats, caravans, pot plants, pets are stored or made secure before or by the blue alert. Don't forget to ask and offer assistance to your neighbours, after all that is what been neighbourly is all about and is what we do here in the Bay.

You may have heard the weather mob have indicated that there is likely to be a la Nina weather event influencing Australia in the coming months. During a la Nina event, which is the opposite of an El Nino, there is a predicted increase of the numbers of cyclones that affect the north west.



- o Monday: 12pm 5pm
- o Tuesday: 10am 3pm
- o Wednesday: 12pm 5pm
- o Thursday: 12pm 5pm
- o Friday: 10am-3pm

Most aluminium, glass, plastic, steel and liquid paperboard drink containers between 150ml and 3L are eligible for a refund.

There are some drink containers that are not eligible for a refund. Generally, excluded containers are those that are less than 150ml and greater than 3L. Containers excluded include:

- Any plain milk containers
- Any glass containers which have contained wine or pure spirits
- Containers 1L or larger which have contained flavoured milk, pure fruit or vegetable juice
- All cordial or syrup containers
- Registered health tonics.

Any containers that are presented as either broken glass or damaged/cut containers will NOT be eligible for a refund. Light crushing of cans, plastics and liquid paperboard is acceptable.

Please remember these steps when preparing for a bag-drop:

1. Clean it - Make sure your containers are CLEAN and cleared of any contamination. Contamination includes: sand, cigarette butts, sharps and lemon/lime, plus much more. Any container received with contamination will not be eligible for a refund.

2. Bag it - Place your containers into a bag – make sure you don't over fill to ensure your bag does not split or break.

3. Tag it – Either mark you bag clearly with: Your Scheme ID, Full Name and Contact Number. Or put those details clearly on a piece of paper and place in a sealed plastic sleave inside the bag.

4. Drop-it – Drop your bag into the marked cages at Yadgalah Aboriginal Corporation.










Life Member Awards

We may not be able to prevent every single suicide but by working together to end stigma surrounding mental health we have a chance to make a big impact. Every single person can make a difference if we all come together to make talking about mental health a normal conversation.

WHAT CAN I DO?

Check in on your friends and family and trust your gut. Even if they say they're okay and you feel something is off, follow it! Make yourself present and make them know that your not just a call away but you're right there with them. Presence is so important!

HAVE THE CONVERSATION

We talk about having the #awkwardconversation a lot at Dusty Roads, but really it doesn't need to be awkward. We need to work toward it being normalised. Asking what's up or saying I can see somethings been bothering you, shouldn't be hard. Ask the question and be prepared to sit and listen.

MARE THEM FEEL SAFE

If you think someone you love is thinking about suicide make them feel like they are in a safe space. Talk to them about if they've thought about how they would do it and remove anything they are thinking about using to hurt themselves out of reach.



HELP THEM HELP THEMSELVES

Sometimes people cant always reach out for help as it feels to overwhelming for them. So help them out. Take them to your local CP for first response help. Or to your local emergency department. Follow through and show them you're there all the way and they are not alone.



John true to his word said and did retire from being a SJA Volunteer Ambulance Officer on his 70th birthday. John gave 14 years voluntary service to our Sub Centre.



If you call the Shark Bay Health Centre after hours you will be transferred through to Health Direct where a Registered Nurse will ask you a number of questions to determine whether you need further emergency assessment by the Shark Bay nurse. If you require further assessment, your call will be put through to the local nurse.

Examples of an EMERGENCY include:

- · Breathing difficulties
- Chest pain
- Severe abdominal pain
- Bleeding that can't be controlled with first aid
- Convulsions and fits
- Deep lacerations
- Eye or ear injuries
- Uncontrolled high fever
- Loss of consciousness
- Pregnancy bleeding or onset of labour
- A very sick child
