

<u>Changes to Casual Employment - Industrial Relations</u> Reform

During these challenging busy health times businesses may not be aware that on Friday 26 March 2021, sections of the Fair Work Act relating to casual employees were amended. These changes came into effect on Saturday 27 March 2021.

Extracted from the Fair Work Ombusman website they have advised;

A person is a casual employee if they accept an offer for a job from an employer knowing that there is no firm advance commitment to ongoing work with an agreed pattern of work.

Specifically, under the Fair Work Act, a person is a casual employee if:

- they are offered a job
- the offer does not include a firm advance commitment that the work will continue indefinitely with an agreed pattern of work
- they accept the offer knowing that there is no firm advance commitment and become an employee.

How is casual different to full-time or part-time? Full-time and part-time employees have an advance commitment to ongoing employment. They can expect to work regular hours each week. They are also entitled to paid leave and must give or receive notice to end the employment.

Think a mistake might have been made?

Mistakes can happen. The best way to fix them usually starts with talking and there are plenty of tools and resources made available online to assist.







Morning tea and a chat with others who also have small children under the age of 5 happen on Friday morning's @ 9:30am at the Shark Bay Bowling, Sports & Recreation Club. Dad's, mum's and grandparents are more then welcome to come to these sessions. Shark Bay CRC just ask you to please bring along \$3 which will go towards morning tea supplies.

As of the 6th of August we are hosting Sing&Grow during our Mum's and Bub's sessions. Sing&Grow provides music therapy services in the community for families with children from birth to 5 years. The zoom groups will meet for 30 minutes once a week, for 6 weeks. For those families that registered early, they will receive a special resource pack to assist and guide them along in the program. They include CDs and sets of information cards - one each of Play, Praise and Consistency. Shark Bay Fishing Club

As part of the acquittal process for our Significant Event Sponsorship with the Shire of Shark Bay, the Shark Bay Fishing Club conducted a survey at the end of this years Fiesta to try and gauge the local economic impact of the event.

112 people responded to the survey, which covered areas such as estimated spending on food, fuel, dining out, bait and other items.

In total, the estimated minimum spend in the town was over \$230,000 with some of the key points being:

- 71% of participants were visitors, and most of those drove to Denham.
- 20% of people were attending for the first time, and 25% had attended 15 times or more. The largest percentage of attendees had come between 2 and 5 times.
- While most spent less than \$400 eating out, some spent more than \$800.
- 25% of participants spent more than \$1,000 on
- 36% of participants spent more than \$1,000 on accommodation.
- 60% of participants spent more than \$200 on groceries and alcohol while 57% spent more than \$200 eating out.
- Nearly 20% of participants spent money on tours Shark Bay Fishing Club team







If you require further assessment, your call will be put through to the local nurse.

Examples of an EMERGENCY include:

- · Breathing difficulties

- Severe abdominal pain
- Bleeding that can't be controlled with first aid
- Convulsions and fits
- Deep lacerations
- · Eye or ear injuries
- Uncontrolled high fever
- Loss of consciousness
- Pregnancy bleeding or onset of labour
- A very sick child
