












SHARK BAY 2021 CHRISTMAS FESTIVAL MARKETS

There will be visiting circus performers, lots of amazing market stalls, and a visit from Santa at 9am. Don't forget to bring a towel to dry off after the slippery dip!





HMAS Sydney II Memorial Weekend

The HMAS Sydney II memorial weekend events, held between 19-21th November, were a great success. Thanks to everyone involved in the organisation of all aspects of the occasion. Thanks also to the many visitors and locals who attended the events, which concluded with a memorial service at the Discovery Centre Sydney II Wall to honour the memory of the Sydney and her crew, which was lost 80 years ago and not found again until 2008.

The significance of this historical maritime event to Shark Bay relates to the battle itself and what took place in November 1941, to the West of Shark Bay. The location of the wreck was not confirmed until the Finding Sydney Foundation located it 112 nautical miles west of Steep Point, off our coast. Denham is recognised by the Australian Government as the closest town to where the battle encounter took place and also the resting place of the ships.

Grant Applications

The Shire has made an application for funding to the Road Safety Commission for \$2,040, which will be used to

produce brochures aimed at assisting visitors to Shark Bay to safely explore our local 4WD tracks and leave 'no footprint'.



An additional grant application for \$9,260 has been submitted to the Department of Communities for a feasibility study to be conducted for the potential creation of a community garden. The outcome of both these grant requests has yet to be advised.

Kicking off this month with a look back on November and an introduction to our latest member in town...... me.

Prior to arriving in Shark Bay I worked at Warwick Police Station which is in the Joondalup district. Shark Bay is now my second country town having spent a few years working in Laverton, which is a small town in the Goldfields located 950km North of Perth. In my time there I also worked in Warburton and deeper into the desert at Warakurna which is 1,700km from Perth. I am sure that if you have met me then you will have guessed that I was not born in Australia, I am also not Irish as many guess:)

I was born in Dunfermline, Scotland and moved to Australia 9 years ago after leaving the Royal Navy. From there I joined the Police and in my career when not in the country I spent my time working north of the river from Warwick to Two Rocks and everywhere in between. We arrived at 10:40 and looked around the park and saw all



When they finished praying, us year 6s laid a wreath while Howard sang some songs, the songs were really good.


When it was all over we were told that there was cake at the town hall but there was nothing when we got there. Isabella started getting low so we called Miss Bec and she said to go to the café and

Personal Locator Beacons. (PLB)

Thankfully they were able to be found safely and helicoptered out. This was possible because they had a PLB in their vehicle. 


