Its still the early stages of wrapping up the event finances for the Fishing Club but I can tell you that the event was very successful especially for our local community groups fundraising. We have welcomed a gross income of close to \$40,000 this year. Reports of finances and participation results back from community groups and activities include;

- Shark Bay P&C Association \$967.89 from two money boards, sausage sizzle and a snack bar.
- Shark Bay Bowling, Sport & Recreation Club is still calculating their curry night profits and meal numbers.
- Shark Bay Business & Tourism Association around \$2,500 which they advised will be donated to St Johns Ambulance, from 14 quiz tables booked (8 per table was encouraged) and their silent auction items.

These above organisations and groups did an amazing job catering or hosting fundraisers, especially when they can't predict the attendance numbers or the weather. The Fishing Club and CRC appreciates all the hard work each of these groups put in to enhancing our Fiesta and by taking special consideration to COVID rules as well as health and safety requirements for food handling and liquor licencing.

The Fishing competition welcomed 121 fishers this year (only up by 2 fishers from 2019) and included only 35 boats. 6 Junior anglers entered which was fantastic to see as well as 25 kids in the kids "Catch & Release" fishing competition. As you can imagine, the kids had lots of fun, with several decent bream being weigh in, as well as a baby black snapper and baby bluebone. It was a magic day in the Bay and the kids really enjoyed themselves.

Shire President's Report - May 2021

Shire's Community Assistance Grants - Round 2

These Shire grants are dedicated to ensuring local community-based groups are supported and encouraged, with this round aimed at equipment and/or minor community focused projects. Council considered applications for financial assistance from local community groups at the May meeting and agreed to the following organisations being allocated the funding below;

- Marine Rescue Shark Bay (barbeque replacement)
- SJA Shark Bay Sub Centre (volunteer training workstation upgrade) \$2,000
- Shark Bay CRC (community noticeboard, Charlie Sappie Park) \$1,000
- Shark Bay Speedway Club (cool room panels)
- Shark Bay School P & C (disco equipment) \$1,500

Significant Event Sponsorship Funding

Under this funding stream, Council also approved an application from the Shark Bay Business and Tourism Association for \$5,000 towards prize money to support the January 2022 Wind on Water Festival (anticipated to be an ongoing annual event), which is proposed to be a two-day festival including water sport competitions, a community art project and social community activities. January is deemed to be the windiest, and therefore the best, month for kite surfing in the Bay and the event is intended to attract visitors during the January school holidays.

Dual Use Pathway - Stella Rowley Drive

Council has agreed to commence work on the installation of a dual use path which will extend from Denham to the lookout on Stella Rowley Drive. Future completion of work on the entire path will be contingent on other budget priorities and securing of external funding.

Grant Funding Applications

As advised in my previous report, the Shire is awaiting the outcome of a \$2.5m grant application submitted to the Building Better Regions Infrastructure Fund. Should this submission be successful, the funds will be used to construct 12 new units and extend the Denham Herald complex. An additional application for \$20,000 from the Department of Communities has been submitted to assist with costs to replace the existing roofs.

Emergency Communication Services

The need to ensure that communication services and equipment remain operational in the event of emergencies and natural disasters was highlighted during the recent cyclone and raised at May's LEMC meeting. The Shire has therefore submitted an application for an NBN fixed satellite to be located at the Recreation Centre, which will ensure that communication services are available throughout future emergency situations.

Congratulations to everyone involved in organising,

supporting and participating in these two recent events. It is awesome that there are so many in our local community who are willing and able to give their time and effort to

providing activities and entertainment, contributing to our lifestyle and enjoyment of living in the Bay!



Upgrading of town TV Transmission

The town's TV transmission (for WIN, GWN and the TEN network) needs to be upgraded from an MPEG2 to an MPEG 4 system. This is a required upgrade to ensure the continuity of the service, but unfortunately many older TV's are not able to decode the MPEG4 signal, and so will not be able to receive pictures and/or sound once the upgrade is completed.

For those residents and visitors who do not want to buy a new TV, a set top box (cost between about \$40 - \$70 from most reputable electronics stores) should be sufficient to decode the upgraded signal.




To give everyone time to get ready for this change, the Shire has arranged to delay the upgrade of the system until 30 June 2021.





Conservation Matters

Wandering Weeds!

It's been a good year for rain in the bay and although drenching rain brings life, it also brings weeds. Weeds have an amazing ability to spread rapidly. Some weeds, however, are worse than others.

Native to America, it was first notice in one Perth suburb in 1984. In the space of only four years, it had spread as far north as Geraldton.

Golden crownbeard is toxic to humans and poisonous to stock and other animals if they eat it. It is an amazing survivor and its



animals if they eat Above: Golden crownbeard (Verbesina it. It is an amazing encelioides) is highly invasive.

ability to tolerate a wide range of conditions and breed up quickly following rainfall makes it able to spread out across the landscape and cover all other vegetation like a blanket until all you can see is golden crownbeard.

With all the recent rain you'll see vast yellow carpets of crownbeard as you travel through Geraldton. All of these attributes make it one of the more invasive of weeds and place it high on the list of priority weeds to control. Seeds can survive in the soil for several years, missing them one

year can result in several years work to remove them.

Although golden crownbeard has now made a home in Denham, numbers are still low making it possible to control and eradicate with a concerted effort from everyone.

Be on the lookout and remove seedlings before they flower.





<u>Suicide - You cannot address a problem without talking about it!</u>

It does not matter what the issues are in our life, we must have a conversation and talking to someone about the situations we find ourselves in will relieve pressure and help us to normalize our own response to these issues. The challenge for all of us is to recognize where we are at, and then work through it.

As a society we have perhaps come too politically correct about what we talk about and how we talk about it!

Conversations around suicide are a classic example of this!

When we consider that 75% of suicides in Australia are men, it is important to develop an understanding of life problems in our own lives and in the lives of others around us. Suicide does not have a set of risk factors that you can refer to and suicide ideation is not necessarily a mental illness. Suicide prevention is everyone's business.

There is a lot to talk about when we are discussing suicide, and it is essential that we all learn more, but three key points summarizing what we know about suicide are:

- 1. A distressed (suicidal) person does not want to die. They want to stop the pain.
- 2. It is safe to talk about thoughts of suicide with at risk people.
- Suicide is not usually a complex decision. The reasons (layers) behind the suicidal thoughts are complex, and usually need professional help.

We also know that a lot of completed suicides happen to people that are under extreme distress (what we call situational distress) and not from a mental illness. We do not have to have a diagnosed mental illness to complete suicide. be in the three areas of our life where we often connect with people - our family, workplace and/or community group.

We must always remember a conversation can change some-one's life. Sometimes this is confused with, a conversation can save someone's life (only that person can save their own life).

We do not know if someone is suicidal unless we ask. If we have that gut feel about the person, we must ask. It's not easy and we do not need formal training and your 'language' is up to you. We do however need awareness, empathy and the ability to listen. If the answer is 'yes' put in place an immediate plan for both support and follow up ensuring the safety of all. We need to be prepared to act. There is plenty of help out there (refer to useful contacts below), your local mental health team, local doctor, and other support services in your area. Be prepared by becoming informed. Remember before it all gets too much Talk to a Mate!!®

When we talk about suicide, it always presents material that some people may find distressing. If you know of someone feeling depressed or suicidal please contact one of the following services:

Did you know 3 million Australians are living with anxiety or depression.

People quite often ask, when should I be concerned? Be observant about any changes in a person's situation, anything that is out of the ordinary for that person. Some experts spend all their time talking about indicators of risk, and higher risk groups (men for example). However, we all should be deemed at risk if we have 'shit' going on in our life. Suicide can happen to anyone, anywhere, anytime. Knowing individual human capacity is the unknown factor!

We should never underestimate the power of ordinary people to make a difference and the important role we can have supporting someone through a difficult patch in their life. This can






