## Shire President's Report - November 2021

#### **Shire of Shark Bay – Local Government Elections**

The October local government elections for Shark Bay, were determined by the electoral commission returning officer on 16 October and resulted in Cr Edmund Fenny and Cr Ben Bellottie being returned to Council in the Denham Ward and Mira Vankova elected to Council representing the Pastoral/Useless Loop Ward. Thanks to all the candidates for their desire to serve the community and congratulations to those elected.

At the October Special Meeting of Council, elections were conducted to appoint councillors to the positions of President and Deputy President. The result being, my retention of the Presidency and Cr Mira Vankova's appointment to the Deputy role, for a two-year period.

#### **Rates Incentive Prize**

Cr Vankova drew the prizes for those ratepayers who, having paid their rates in full, were eligible to receive an incentive from the Shire in the form of monetary vouchers to be expended with local businesses. The lucky ratepayers

# Waste Collection Requirements in Denham

As a community, we want to maintain our reputation as a Tidy Town, and this requires a contribution from everyone. From 1 December 2021 the following requirements must be observed or your bin will not be collected.

### One Bin Only

Only one bin will be collected per household, unless approved by the Shire prior to collection.



#### Incorrect Items

Do not put items such as bricks, heavy timber or steel in the bin. These materials can damage the collection equipment and your bin. The bins are for domestic waste only.



#### **Overflowing Bins**

Bins overflowing with rubbish will not be collected. Ensure that the lid on your bin is able to remain shut at all times to ensure no wildlife can access it.



#### **Damaged Bins**

Bins that are broken, cracked, or missing lids/wheels will not be collected. It is your responsibility to ensure repairs or replacement.



#### Rocks On Lids

Bins using rocks to keep the lid secure will not be collected as they can damage the truck. The Shire are currently working on an alternative solution and will update the community via social media.



### Replacement Bins

RENTERS: Please contact your agent or property owner to notify them of any damaged bins.

OWNERS: Please make sure you arrange to repair or replace damaged bins.

## **Shark Bay School News**

Staff met for our School Development Day on 11th October, with a focus on reviewing student data and planning for their needs, as well as issues and policies like the Department of Education's Code of Ethics and our Cultural Responsiveness as a school, as these are current priorities of the Department of Education.

#### **NAPLAN**

Back after missing last year, it was interesting and very pleasing to receive our school NAPLAN results this year, confirming our other system and school-based assessments. Due to our small numbers we always struggle to report outcomes while respecting privacy and we also know that statistical significance is reduced for small sample sizes. However, despite those caveats, we are very pleased. Our older students, studying through SIDE, continue to make good progress based on past achievements. Our younger students are easier for us to analyse as we plan, teach and assess them and can correlate NAPLAN with other tests. Our Primary students in Years 3 and 5, the NAPLAN test years, have done extremely well as a group; in most subject areas tested our students are matching or beating both 'Like School' (schools defined as having similar characteristics) and National mean scores for all Australian schools. This is a huge credit to them, their teachers and their families. It's also further encouraging evidence that we are on the 'right track' with our new programs. Congratulations!

#### **STEM Scholarship**

Many congratulations to Laylah on her receipt of a Telstra Tech for STEM Regional Scholarship - a new laptop intended to see her through school and University. Fabulous!



#### **Midwest Education Award**

Congratulations are also due to our nominee for the Midwest Education Awards 2021, Miss Crowley. While our staff works as a team and all contribute to the excellent progress we are seeing, Nicole Crowley has been instrumental in leading introduction of our new Literacy programs in the younger classes, setting students up for continued success throughout their future schooling. The InitiaLit programs were implemented from the end of last year, with professional

learning, organisation of resources, assessing students to place them in the correct level at the start of 2021, and explicit group teaching by the team of teaching and education assistant staff this year. Well done and thank you to the whole team for the growth we are seeing in student literacy achievement. We are all proud to nominate Nicole on behalf of the team.



#### **Interschool Carnival**

Early Thursday morning the 16th September 2021 at 5:00am an excited group of athletes from Shark Bay School headed off to Carnarvon to compete in the Interschool athletics carnival.

After a welcome from the school all the year groups headed off to their events which included long distance, throws, long jump and triple jump.

You'll notice we have a new citrus garden, which is an outdoor sitting space for staff, supporting everyone's wellbeing as a good place for a few moments of unwinding, chatting and taking the air, while also soon producing more fruit for our students, to go with the pineapples, figs and dragon fruit that are doing so well. We thank Cath Fitzhardinge, whose Dad was Principal in the 1980s for making a gift to the school to support this project in memory of him and his great fondness for the school, staff and students of this town. Many thanks also to Rick Moroney for creating it and to the Sellenger family for the pavers.

#### **COVID** vaccinations

You may have seen that from the start of next year, all school staff will be fully vaccinated against COVID-19, unless medically contraindicated for them. # Marine Rescue Shark Bay

#### **Commanders Report 2021 AGM**

The past twelve months has been a great time to be involved with the Shark Bay Marine Rescue group. A global pandemic has been affecting millions of people around the world but has left us relatively unscathed. Travel interstate and overseas was restricted so thousands of West Australians flocked to Denham resulting in a massive spike in vessel numbers out on the water.

#### **Group Operations and Achievements**

Over the past 12 months we have responded to 21 callouts involving 5 epirb activations, a triple 0 call where we pulled 2 people and a dog from the water, a tragic boating accident which resulted in 1 fatality and 1 critically injured as well as the usual breakdown recoveries. We responded to all calls for assistance thanks to the willingness of our volunteers to stop what they were doing and contribute their time to help others.

The group took delivery of our new vessel Cape Rose in January this year. I would like to commend the Rescue 3 replacement committee for the work they put in to achieve an excellent result. It is an outstanding vessel, and it will serve the group well for the next 15 years. The sale of Rescue 3 was an interesting exercise which saw bids coming in from all around Australia. The highest bid of \$90,000 came from a buyer in Melbourne. Thanks to Damien for his help in the process.

DFES have advised that Tamala Rose is to be replaced in the 22/23 financial year with a purpose built 10-12 metre boat. A vessel replacement sub-committee has been formed to make it happen.

#### Committee

I would like to thank the outgoing committee members for their contribution to the smooth running of the group over the past 12 months. Quoin and Ed are going to be busy with children and work commitments and Marty has taken on the post office as well as his other duties at Monkey Mia. We welcome Patrick, Ian, and Leon aboard as committee members and I look forward to working with them at keeping the group moving ahead.

#### Membership

We have had 4 new members join the group in the past twelve months. We now have 16 qualified skippers and crew and 13 members on DFES training pathways. Total number in the group is 34.



#### **Training**

We continue to send members away to various training opportunities as well as conducting on the water training locally. Five members are currently enrolled to obtain their radio operators certificate through online learning. There will be a basic navigation course in Denham during November for members to become qualified crew. Next years training calendar will be finalized before Christmas to allow members to plan ahead.

We ran a large Marine Search and Rescue exercise out of Denham in August that simulated a charter vessel with 14 people on board catching fire and sinking. Agencies involved included Police, Border Force, Fisheries, SES, St Johns Ambulance, Shark Bay Aviation and Marine Rescue volunteers from Denham, Kalbarri and Carnarvon. Over 40 people were involved on the day, followed by a debrief and a bbq at the shed. Exercises such as this help us identify ways we can continue to improve as emergency services.

#### Conclusion

Marine Rescue Shark Bay continues to be a vital organisation for the town of Denham. Once again, this year we have proven to be a dedicated and professional group of volunteers. The keen young members we have coming up through the ranks should ensure we remain effective well into the future. I would personally like to thank everybody who has contributed to the success of the group and to encourage everybody to remain actively involved. As I have said in the past, by being involved, you will make a difference to peoples lives.

Speed eNews is a weekly communication aimed toward keeping clubs and organisations up to date on current events, handy tips to improve competition and safety, as well as any changes that may be taking place within the sport. #### PRE-EVENT SCRUTINEERING CHECKS



As we warm up to a new season, now is a timely reminder to all competitors to keep up to date with the current Speedway Australia Rules and Regulations regarding the appropriate safety equipment and apparel for their respective division.

In previous seasons, it is not uncommon to see competitors turned away at scrutineering for not having safety apparel that met the safety standards of their division, or in some cases, apparel that was significantly worn and not suitable for competition.

Our track visits over the past 12 months have shown us Scrutineers are doing an excellent job educating competitors and spotting inappropriate or unsuitable apparel pre-event, but the odd competitor is still slipping through the cracks (see window net, and boots in photos). If possible, we encourage scrutineers and officials to spot check cars and competitors where necessary to ensure what rolls through pre-event checks, is what in fact rolls onto to the racetrack.

This can be said not only of competitors apparel, but also vehicle safety items (e.g., Window Nets) and Pit Crew Apparel (e.g., Quad Bikes and Helmets) both of which remain significant safety concerns for several Sedan and Open Wheel divisions.

#### PIT GATE OFFICIALS

The pit gate is often one of the more interesting places to be at a Speedway event – with officials getting up close with cars as they roll on and off the racetrack. Unfortunately, it's also one of the most dangerous should the gate attendees not stay alert and be wary of their surroundings.

Frequent reminders from the Chief Steward and Clerk of the Course to gate staff can greatly reduce the risk of an incident occurring, with simple tips such as keeping a close eye on cars entering and exiting the track and ensuring the gate locking mechanisms are secured before racing commences. Also, under no circumstances should anyone be making physical contact with the pit gates, be that leaning or resting against them, whilst vehicles are circulating on track.




#### **Glow In The Dark Disco**



#### **Training**

Some took part in a Storm and water damage operations course and others completed a safety upgrade to their vertical rescue qualifications.





Rufus one of our dedicated volunteers who works for Parks and Wildlife in town had a blast down in Kalbarri recently on a Off-road 4wd training course. He was by far one of the most entertaining and hands on members on the course and was awarded the "Mudflap award" for tearing the protective flap off the Kalbarri vehicle whilst out driving. Gave us all a good laugh anyway!



#### **Land Search**

Late in the month, unit members were involved in the heart wrenching search for Cleo Smith. Shark Bay SES members spent several days searching without the desired result. Our thoughts are with Cleo's family as they deal with the horrendous possibilities her disappearance may entail.

Staff members from BoM visited and gave a presentation of their predictions for the forthcoming cyclone season. They informed us that it was likely to be a similar pattern as last year with a similar number of cyclones and the same probability of weather events such as tropical lows.

James Ashley reminded us that it was not necessarily the number of cyclones we should concentrate on but whether they pass near us. If Seroja had turned left just an hour or so sooner, Shark Bay would have experienced a real serious weather event. He emphasised that a storm surge would have a major impact on Denham if a cyclone passed by, not necessarily overhead. Another

major point he raised concerned the amount of damage to structures rises substantially as the wind speed increases especially at cat 3 and above.

As the "official" cyclone season has kicked off, we again urge all residents to review their cyclone plans and importantly have a clean up of their yards. Objects that usually stay in place during our summer breezes can be converted into destructive missiles during a cyclone. If you are unsure of just what to do, please contact our unit and we can advise of measures you can take to make your castle as safe as possible. Don't forget to plan for your furred, feathered or finned friends.

As a last note, please, please, please advise the police if you note any suspicious things or activities in the search for Cleo Smith.

You will be treated to the big band and contemporary sound of the Royal Australian Navy Band WA, as they get your feet tapping, and old favourites the Troupadores as they display their great vocal harmonies with well-known and much loved songs from a big catalogue.

a grand finale with all entertainers coming together to close the concert around 8.30pm.






