Shire President's Report

Winter Markets - Sunday 11 July

The markets were extremely successful, with 28 unique stall holders and a total of 49 stalls. In addition to organising the event, the Shire contributed live entertainment, bouncy castles, fairies and face painting, plus a children's sensory play station. It was estimated more than 1,000 people attended this event, with positive feedback from both the community and stall holders being received. From the survey of stall holders conducted, it was clear the event also contributed significantly to the local economy.

Significant Event Sponsorship Funding

As reported earlier, Council has approved funding of \$5,000 towards prize money to support the Shark Bay Business and Tourism Association's January 2022 Wind on Water Festival. This two- day festival will include water sport competitions, a community art project and social community activities. January being the windiest, and therefore the best, month for kite surfing in the Bay is intended to attract visitors during the January school holidays. This Festival will hopefully become an annual event.

Grant Funding Applications

As previously advised, we are still awaiting the outcome of the \$2.5m grant application to the Building Better Regions Infrastructure Fund to enable the construction of 12 new aged care units to extend the current Herald Denham complex. The result of an application to the Department of Communities for \$900 to fund the Thank a Volunteer Day event has yet to be advised.

Shire Budget 2021/2022

A review of the Strategic Community and long-term Financial Plan was undertaken in June with the goal of maintaining consistent rate levels, whilst also continuing to deliver the community's aspirations expressed in the Strategic Plan. In March 2020, Council decided not to increase the rate in the dollar nor increase fees and charges, which resulted in the majority of ratepayers not receiving a rate increase last year. However, the community's expectation was that a high service delivery level and provision and maintenance of facilities and infrastructure would continue. So, I commend the Shire administration for an excellent job in closely monitoring operational costs to still achieve a balanced budget at the end of the 2020/21 financial year.

For this financial year budget, Council gave consideration to the freezing of rates and fees and charges the previous year and also to the rate income which will be required to continue funding future projects, developing additional facilities and providing services for our community. Although a rate rise was inevitable, Council has tried to keep the rise to a minimum, with a budgeted increase in rate rise of 4%.

Capital Works Projects -2021/22

Projects to be undertaken during the current budget period include; upgrades to the existing skate park, solar lighting installation for Stella



Rowley Drive and Francis Street footpaths and installation of the Men's Shed at the rear of the previous childcare building in Hughes Street.

Emergency Communication Services

There is an obvious need to ensure that communication services and equipment remain operational in the event of emergencies and natural disasters, as highlighted during cyclone Seroja and raised at a recent LEMC meeting. The Shire's application for grant funding to install fixed NBN satellites for use in emergency situations at both the Recreation/Evacuation Centre and the Emergency Services Precinct has been successful, with installation of the devices scheduled for December this year.

A Warm Shark Bay Welcome to New, and Congratulations to Recycled, Shire Staff

Ashleigh Buchholz, the new Community Development Officer, commenced with the Shire on 14 July. Her predecessor, Candice, is relishing her new role as Coordinator of the Discovery Centre and Dale Chapman is poised to take over the administrative reigns of the Shire in early October. Congratulations and welcome to the Bay!







A warm welcome into our units new members Sherry and Steve. Learning new skills and helping others out in stressful times is very rewarding.

One thing for sure, as members of SES you never know when or where you might be deployed to, and for what reason!

We had four requested deployments during August. Each situation was very different.

- At approximately 4.30pm on a Tuesday afternoon Police asked for two air observers to fly to Woodleigh Station to conduct do a SITREP as an EPIRB had been activated. Due to the timing, daylight hours were limited. Chris our pilot, made our flight very comfortable and ensured we were on the ground before the sun went down. Visibility was very good, other than cows, sheep and goats no distressful situation or people were observed from the air. SES ground support was also required with the assistance of Shark Bay and Northampton Police. They all searched into the late hours of the night but found nothing. Many thanks to Shaun, Terry, Bryan, Joe and Judy for attending.
- ❖ Another request the unit received, was to fly to Meekatharra to help search for a missing prospector. In due course it was decided (as the plane would have to refuel), members were to drive because the vehicle was required for the search. Logistics were an issue, as it would have been a ninehour drive to get there because of recent rains and road conditions, as well as fatigue management. Crews would be required to immediately join in on the search. In the end our unit didn't attend. Thanks

to Terry and Joe for putting your hand up for this deployment.

- Then there was a request for air observers to fly to the top of Dirk Hartog Island to locate a boat that was overdue. Thankfully the boat was located before members left the SES headquarters. Thank you, Jamie, George, Terry and Joe.
- ❖ Our final deployment for August was to participate in the Shark Bay Marine Search and Rescue Exercise that was held on 21st August. We united with other DFES units/brigades in our region and external agencies. Over 40 people were involved, each group specialized in their particular area of search and rescue. We were required to fly air observers over a certain GPS position looking for a particular boat, people (dummies) and debris in the water. Scott our pilot was outstanding, we searched using a one-mile grid pattern. Objects observed from the air included life jackets floating and a deployed life raft. Natt, George and Judy were the observers.

In August some of our members also attended a 4WD offroad and recovery training course in Kalbarri. Photo's are below.

Upcoming events is the WAFES conference being held 9th September at the Crown Hotel in Perth and our AGM that is being held 6th October 2021.

Bub's Sanity Saver and SING&GROW

During August, in collaboration with Parenting Connection, Ngala and the SBCRC, families in Shark Bay have had the opportunity to join in weekly Sing&Grow sessions with coordinater Jess via zoom. These sessions are run as part of Shark Bay Community Resource Centre's Mum's & Bub's Sanity Saver weekly morning tea with the Sing&Grow program starting at 10:30am. Thanks to the Shark Bay Bowling, Sport and Recreation Club for allowing us the use of their venue.

What is the Sing&Grow program?

Sing&Grow is a national, evidence-based music therapy program providing services for young children and their families. Group programs focus on strengthening family relationships, building capacity in parents to support their children's development in the early years of life, and supporting children's transition to school.

Through the sharing of both traditional and non-traditional children's songs, Sing&Grow provides families with a safe space to interact in new and positive ways, to increase their confidence to use music and play at home, and to learn new ways to support child development. Services encourage children and parents together to explore, learn and play in a developmentally stimulating, fun and musical environment.

Group programs are held in accessible venues in collaboration with community organisations. Up to 10 families attend half an hour - 1 hour weekly sessions (generally over 6 weeks), participating in hands-on music activities that assist children with developmental skills and extend the repertory of parenting skills in relating to children through interactive play.

Known song material, original compositions, singing, movement to music, relaxation and instrumental play are all incorporated into an established session plan, and a resource CD and booklet is made available to each family and the host organisation, further supporting families' capacity to use the musical activities at home.

Marine Rescue Shark Bay

Marine Rescue Shark Bay has had a busy August. Three calls for assistance were received from people who required a tow back to Denham and two calls from Water Police to help locate overdue vessels. All jobs resulted in successful outcomes.

One of the overdue vessels was located fifteen nautical miles southwest of Carnarvon by the Challenger search and rescue jet. This was a very frustrating job as the people on the vessel involved could not read their chart plotter well enough to give us their position. They had run out of fuel and drifted a long way. They had no VHF radio and the epirb they activated had a very weak signal and was not picked up until the search aircraft was directly above their position.

Saturday the 21st of August was the day of a large MARSAR, (Marine Search and Rescue) exercise out of Denham. The exercise scenario was that a charter vessel with fourteen people on board had caught fire and sunk about ten miles West of Denham. Three Marine Rescue vessels from Denham and Kalbarri, marine rescue volunteers from Carnarvon and Denham DBCA staff joined the Fisheries and Border Force patrol boats to carry out

a search for deployed life rafts and jackets, search and rescue dummies, and other debris.

All items were located and the "injured" dummies were treated on board and conveyed to shore to be met by St John Ambulance and Fire and Rescue volunteers. Shark Bay Aviation contributed greatly to the exercise by taking off with three SES Air Observers and were the first unit to spot debris in the water.

The exercise was organised by our regional DFES manager and run by Shark Bay Police from their radio base at the station. Over forty people were involved, and a barbecue and social get together was held at the marine rescue shed after the debrief at the end of the day.

Valuable lessons are learnt from exercises such as this and help us to identify ways we can further improve our systems to make sure we are ready to respond effectively should the situation ever arise for real. Thanks to all the people and agencies for taking the time to participate.





<u>Virtual family and domestic violence</u> <u>support extends to Shark Bay</u>

Specialist regional domestic violence organisation DVassist is set to extend its support services to Shark Bay from September this year.

It means people living in the Shire will have access to a domestic violence telephone helpline and webchat staffed by qualified counsellors with experience in regional, rural, and remote communities.

DVassist's website and online information hub will also be updated with geographically relevant domestic violence support services and resources which can be searched via location.

Expansion of the service to Shark Bay for the next 12 months have been made possible through the NAB Foundation Community Grants program which supports local projects that help communities prepare for natural disasters, support long term recovery and build resilience against future disasters.

NAB State Business Banking Executive WA, Jeff Pontifex, said with more Australians being impacted by natural disasters, it's vital that local support is available to help communities before, during and after a natural disaster.

"As a bank, we know we have a vital role to play to support our customers and local communities when they are impacted by natural disasters. In the immediate aftermath of Cyclone Seroja, NAB provided \$450,000 in customer grants to help the local community with their immediate needs and our bankers will continue to provide on the ground support for the long term," he said.

"Through the NAB Foundation Community Grant program, we're providing funding to local projects that help communities better prepare for natural disasters and assist in their long term recovery. That's why we're getting behind DVassist to support them as they extend their vital services to more West Australians."

DVassist Chief Executive Officer, Esther Schwald said up until now the non-profit organisation had only been able to service 16 regional pilot areas in Western Australia.

"But we need to extend our support and communities at risk of natural disasters are a priority as they have added challenges and pressures which can compound relationship violence,' she said.

"We are extraordinarily grateful that NAB Foundation has recognised the critical need to support us as we extend our services to some of the smaller and more remote towns where people can be socially isolated, physically distant from services and live in fear of stigma or retribution."

Ms Schwald said as a virtual service DVassist can provide confidential and anonymous help to people living in Shark Bay without compromising safety or privacy.

"Whether it's you or someone you love who's experiencing family or domestic violence, we can talk to you no matter where you are or what you are doing."




