Executive Officer's Report



Not long now until we bring the biggest community event to Denham, and what a line up of activities, workshops and fun we have planned for the Shark Bay Fiesta. This is what you can expect;

- Firstly it will be a mandated COVID vaccinated event during liquor licence hours so please bring along your proof of your vaccination. Arm bands will be issued and required to be worn to indicate those permitted into the area.
- Friday morning there will be a Makeup Artist masterclass. This is being specially tailored to ladies that enjoy wearing makeup on a night out (not necessarily everyday) and want to learn effective techniques. This show and tell workshop will require all participants to be double vaccinated at the request of the Artist.
- Friday night we will host a 80's themed glow party.
- Markets will take place on Saturday and Sunday and will cost \$11 per stall (a Shire fee). George and Sherry are coordinating these on behalf of the CRC.
- Kids fishing competition on Saturday. \$5 entry per child.
- We will be holding 2 workshops on Saturday afternoon including a succulent plant workshop and the Arts Council's High Tea headpiece creations workshop. Both workshops will incur a fee for those participating.
- The Shark Bay Business and Tourism Association will be hosting a quiz night on the Saturday night.
- Sunday is High Tea day and unless the federal election throws a spanner in the works, the organising will be done by the the Shark Bay Youth Group. Tickets will go on sale as soon as we know when the election is (as it's possible the key Youth Group organisers are working the Federal election).
- 4pm on Sunday "Geoff Udy" (musician) will be performing a Sunday sesh from the events area.
- On Monday Amber Skrijl (a qualified accountant) will be hosting a general free tax advice session.
- Tuesday is Bingo at the Bowlo night (Shark Bay Bowling Sport and Recreation Club). Trying something new in 2022.
- Wednesday will be Wear Orange Wednesday in support of SES all across Australia.
- The Biggest Morning Tea fundraiser will be held Wednesday morning. \$5 donations strongly encouraged and bring a plate of morning tea to share.
- We have secured special guest Trevor Cochrane from the

television show Gardening Gurus and Destinations WA who will be holding information and Q&A sessions regarding propagation and waterwise planting. There will be two sessions to allow those unavailable to attend during the day to come to a night session.

- Prize presentations, community auction, and fireworks will take place on the last Friday. We strongly encourage and will remind everyone to secure your animals. Fireworks take place at around 8.30pm for 10-15 minutes.
- Geraldton band "Remnants" will be the feature band at our event finale.

With the new rules and regulations placed on fishing all across our great state, the open fishing competition will continue. Our committee strongly feels it is physically not possible for fishers to overfish should they be following state laws. We will however be introducing several new prize categories including gold band snapper, pearl perch and school mackerel as well as separating tuna, mackerals and cobia into their own prize categories. This is to reduce the pressures on only catching certain prize fish which will support survival rates of those species that were not previously prize categories. Catch and release categories will also remain for those species less favourable on the dinner plate.

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Shire President's Report - April 2022



Community Events and Activities

Clean Up Australia

Great to once again see so many of the local community coming together on 13th March to participate in Shark Bay's Clean Up Australia Day event and contributing to keeping our town and surrounding environments in pristine condition and free of rubbish.

Roll the Tape

This Art on the Move touring exhibition featuring artist Trevor Richards and supported by the WA Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries, was opened in the Rose Freycinet Gallery at the Discovery Centre on 4 March and will be on view until Monday 25 April.

Trevor also conducted a free painting workshop in collaboration with the Shark Bay Arts Council whilst in town.

Grant Funding Applications and Successes

During March, the following grants have been applied for;

- Lotterywest - \$38,475 contribution to help fund a new annual event – Beats in the Bay Festival, plus an application to the Horizon Power Community Partnership for an additional \$8,932 for the event which is scheduled to be held in October and to consist of a music festival and night markets.

Funding for the following projects has recently been received;

- \$29,500 from Lotterywest for an interactive children's dugong activity and \$1,293 from Cultural Heritage and Arts Regional Tourism program for touch screen monitors in the Discovery Centre.

Work continuing on;

- Development of Trails concept for Little Lagoon (as per endorsed Masterplan (\$15,000 – WA State Trail Planning Program).
- Installation of new lights and towers at Bowling Club (\$80,000 - State Government election commitment).
- Upgrade to Discovery Centre gallery lights, including to HMAS Sydney II film (\$19,496 – Art on the Move).

There are also several road and infrastructure projects planned, which include;

- Dual use pathway along Stella Rowley Drive to the lookout and shelter
- Dual use pathway at the Town Hall
- Upgrading and renovating the historical stables behind the CRC
- Upgrades and replacements for elements of the foreshore playground.

COVID-19 in the Bay

Whilst it was inevitable, given the very high Covid caseload now in Western Australia, that infections have now appeared in regional areas, including Shark Bay, I commend members of our community for working together to reduce the impact locally, by looking after ourselves and others, maintaining a safe and compassionate community and providing assistance and support, where possible, to those affected by the virus.

If we continue to follow the rules and restrictions in place to keep everyone as safe as possible, work together and stay

connected, we'll remain a resilient community throughout this pandemic.

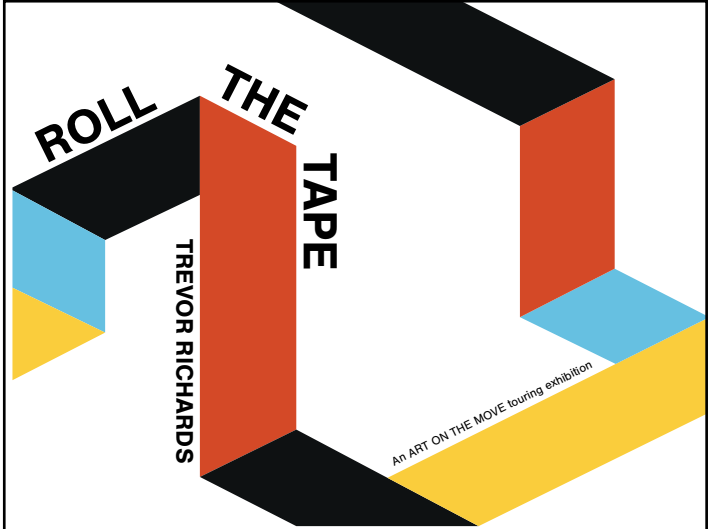

BAITING TO PROTECT NATIVE WILDLIFE

Under the Parks and Wildlife Service's *Western Shield* program, baiting to control foxes and feral cats occurs on more than three million hectares of conservation lands in Western Australia.

The baits used are toxic to introduced animals but not to native animals which have an evolved tolerance to the active compound (1080). All baited areas are signposted.

Baiting occurs on a regular and ongoing basis to protect endangered native animals including the numbat, western ground parrot and western swamp tortoise.



Attention pet owners: these baits will kill domestic dogs and cats. Baited areas must be considered dangerous for pet dogs and cats at all times.

Dear Remote Community,

We write to update you on the Silver Chain preparations for increasing community transmission of COVID-19 in Western Australia and how we will support the safety of your local community and ensure our services continue.

Throughout the pandemic, Silver Chain has implemented policies, procedures and training to enhance our protection against COVID-19 and continue to provide quality and safe care. We monitor the government requirements in relation to COVID-19 to ensure we are reviewing the latest health advice pertaining to regional and remote health care.

The safety of our staff is paramount. Silver Chain staff are vaccinated against COVID-19 and are also supported with the personal protective equipment (PPE) they need, training in the use of PPE, how to prevent and educate against infection and have access to entitlements and supports for their health and wellbeing.

To ensure the ongoing safety of your Remote Area Nurses (RANs):

- Community members must phone ahead for all non-emergency appointments.
- Subject to current WA Government mask requirements for health care facilities, clients will be required to wear a surgical mask.
- All visitors must adhere to all WA Government COVID-19 contact registration requirements.
- Additional restrictions for non-client visitors may apply. Restrictions will align with Silver Chain WA and Department of Health policy at the time of the visit.

Given what we have seen in other parts of Australia, as we move to an environment where COVID-19 is more prevalent in our community, we expect staff and clients will at times be in isolation due to exposure to COVID-19. We will continue to provide essential services in your community, but it may mean services could be delivered by an alternative staff member, be reassessed, deferred, or altered to meet community needs.

The WA Government has made all COVID specific advice and clinical care available through the WA Coronavirus Hotline (13 268 43; 8am to 6pm, Mon-Fri), the virtual COVID Care at Home Program ([/WA-COVID-Care-at-Home](#)), and local hospitals. We strongly encourage members of your community to refer to WA Government sources for COVID-19 updates, undertake preparations for COVID-19 self-management and contact our contact centre should they have concerns about their Silver Chain services.

Our mission is to protect the health and safety of our clients and staff whilst still providing quality care throughout the months ahead.

Our Year 6 Student Leaders led a celebration of Harmony Week in their class on Monday 21 March. Students were encouraged to wear a touch of orange e.g. loom band, hair ribbon, sock and they created art projects to celebrate living in a diverse, inclusive country and being part of our school where everyone belongs and is welcome and cared about.



NAPLAN testing

We expect NAPLAN tests to run 'as normal' again this year for students in years 3,5,7 and 9. If your child is sitting the tests this year, especially if it is their first NAPLAN experience, it is a great idea to visit the Public Demonstration site together with your child and have a play around. We do provide practice and familiarity at school, but your child will find it encouraging to have a look with you, and you will be interested to see how the tests work. We don't make a big fuss of NAPLAN – it is just one indicator – but the tests are useful for teachers at an individual, class and whole school level as we strive to meet each student's learning needs. Students in Y9, have a vested interest in doing as well as they can so as to avoid future similar tests (OLNA) in years 10 onwards. NAPLAN tests will run in week 3 next term, from Tuesday 10th May.

World Seagrass Day 1st March 2022

Seagrass is a beautiful underwater plant that is found all around the world. All seagrass looks different – that makes it quite a special plant. Seagrass is one of the most productive plants on earth because it filters water.

Shark Bay has twelve different species of seagrass. Seagrass is a submerged flowering plant. Shark Bay has some of the highest amounts of seagrass in the world. Dugongs, turtles, fish and stingrays all rely on seagrass for food and protection so if all seagrass disappeared almost all of Shark Bay sea animals would die.

Almost all of WA is covered in seagrass starting from Albany all the way up to the Kimberley. Western Australia can claim the largest seagrass meadows in the world covering an estimated 20,000 square kilometres. Twenty-seven species of seagrass live in WA but there are still many more seagrass species to discover.

There are 177,000 km² of seagrass in the world. By 2050 if we keep up ocean pollution there could be some drastic changes to the ocean and the animals which live in it. For example, dugongs could become extinct because most of their diet is seagrass. There are many ways you can prevent seagrass from dying. For example, if you see trash anywhere except in the bin you should throw it in the bin before it ends up somewhere it should not belong like in the ocean.

In conclusion seagrass is very important for the ocean environment. Most marine animals rely on seagrass in many ways like as a hiding place, and as a food source. Seagrass doesn't only benefit animals it also benefits the ocean, purifying it to maintain good water quality. Seagrass also stabilises the sea bottom.

Barefoot Black Tie is set within World Heritage Martine Parks at the most westerly point of the Australian continent, Shark Bay. Home to the Malgana First Nations people for thousands of generations, Shark Bay also boasts the oldest life forms on earth - the stromatolites! It also hosts the largest and richest sea-grass beds in the world, habitat to dugong ('sea cow') population which in olden times were mistaken for mermaids by shipwrecked sailors.

It's from this edge of the Indian Ocean that a group of time travelling characters converge, and merge and start their tale weaving of the Gascoyne Travelling Arts Festival. Traversing the elements to frame stories of each place across the isolated outback Gascoyne region.

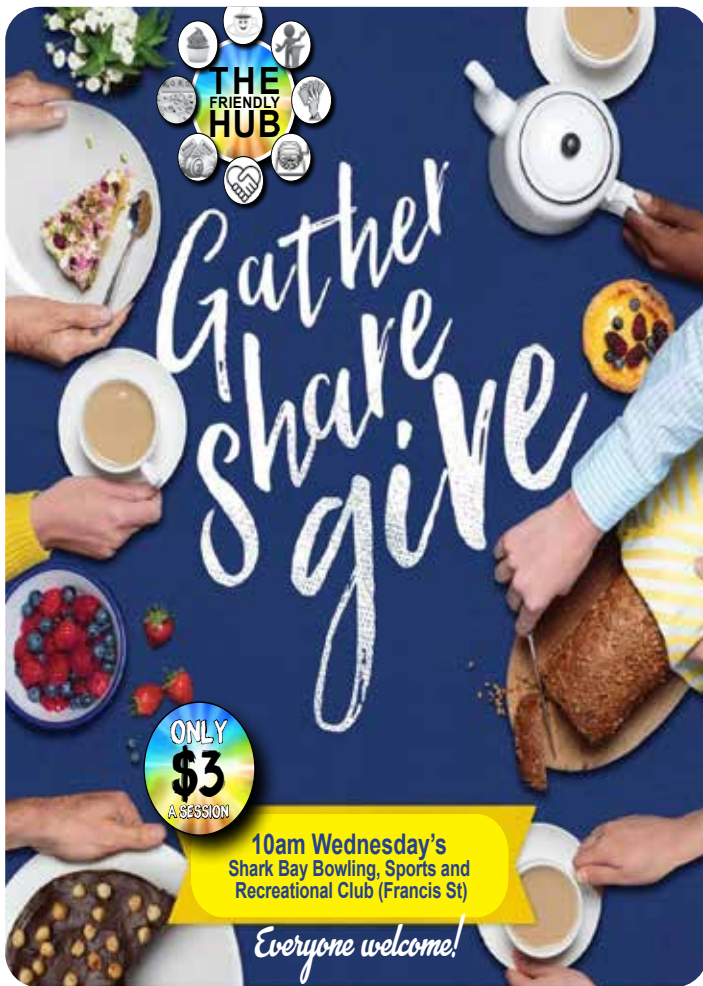

My name is Sherry Baker and I have Cancer.

Now that should sound very familiar, it is the format they use at AA (Alcoholics Anonymous). This is the model I will be using to introduce a new local group - Triple C (Cancer Community Connections), for two very good reasons. Firstly a lot of people who have cancer feel it is very personal and do not want anybody else to know, so what happens and is said at a meeting stays in the meeting. If someone doesn't mind anyone else knowing then it is up to them to say, the meetings have to remain totally confidential. The second reason is by the very nature of the group, it has to be self-perpetuating. Inevitably we are going to lose members of the group, however much we need and love them, it is also their knowledge and their experiences that we do not want to lose.

When you first get unwelcome news that there has been grim diagnosis, it can be overwhelming. The doctors, nurses and social workers try hard to be helpful, but too often they cannot explain in layman's terms, nor do they truly understand the logistics and needs involved with remote area living, *this is where other people's experience can help*. Cancer can be very frightening and cancer can be very lonely, *this is where other people's love and empathy can help*.

I would like to start this group to address this shortfall. There are so many past and present residents who have been struggling alone through this horrible nightmare. I have a degree in Welfare Practice through Curtin University, so with the assistance of many understanding and well-informed locals I should be capable of giving this project a sound grounding for the members to help each other in the years to come. We already have the Cancer Council and the Palliative Care Nurses supporting the formation of a local group.

Once a month on the first Sunday afternoon from 4 until 5pm has been suggested. This sounds good to me, a lot of people have work and voluntary commitments during the week and also a Sunday late afternoon doesn't even clash with the footy!!

I look forward with hope and optimism to our first meeting

Biosecurity Alert: Japanese encephalitis

Japanese encephalitis (JE) has recently been detected in Victoria, Queensland, New South Wales and South Australia. There are no current detections in Western Australia.

JE is an acute mosquito-borne viral disease that can cause reproductive losses and encephalitis in susceptible species. The disease occurs mostly in pigs and horses but can also rarely cause disease in people. The virus does not present any food safety issues from eating pork meat or products.

DPIRD is undertaking surveillance activities and urges pig and horse owners to remain vigilant for signs of this disease. In pigs, the most common clinical signs are stillborn or weak piglets, some with neurological signs. Horses may show neurological signs of varying severity.

If you suspect any animal is showing signs of the disease, you must report it. You can do this by contacting your local veterinarian, your local DPIRD Veterinary Officer or the national Emergency Animal Disease Watch Hotline on 1800 675 888. DPIRD has prepared an industry update targeted at small landholders which is attached to this email. Click below to open the update.

Living with History

Army Life - After returning from leave in early 1945, together with about one hundred volunteers from various units, I was sent to the Atherton Tablelands in Queensland. We were to receive basic paratroop training, and besides physical fitness, we were all required to be experienced in jungle operations.

As usual, the army was short of equipment. Most of the training consisted of jumping off twenty five foot towers with full pack and weapons. Although there were plenty of base wallahs swaggering around Brisbane in highly polished, calf length, American style, paratroop boots, we could not get them. As the ordinary army boot did not give enough support, there were a high percentage of broken and sprained ankles.

There were two DC3's from which most of us managed to get at least one practice jump. The instructors never had any trouble getting anyone to bail out. It seemed a lot safer outside those old planes than in them!

After four weeks of pretty strenuous training, without any explanations, we were all returned to our units. Sometime later we were told that the original plan was to drop us into Borneo to free Australian prisoners held there by the Japanese. The plan had a fair chance of success as at that stage of the war, Japanese forces in that area were spread pretty thin and were low in moral and condition.

The reason the plan was abandoned, was that MacArthur, the supreme Commander in the Pacific, refused to release

the necessary planes. All his resources were concentrated on his much publicised return to the Philippines. Australian forces were relegated to so called mopping up operations. Because of this decision, several thousand Australians died of disease, starvation or were murdered.

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Volunteer Marine Rescue



Recovery tows are one of the most common tasks Marine Rescue Shark Bay are called upon to perform. Crews have been out twice recently to bring broken down vessels back to the boat ramp. One job was to the North of Denham and the other was on the Western side of Faure Island which involves towing Cape Rose to Monkey Mia for launching.

This is all part of the job description for emergency services volunteers, but sometimes it is obvious that a bit of preventative maintenance and trip planning would have led to a trouble free outing for the boat owner.

With better boating weather on the way as the summer southerlies ease, now is the time to carry out all the essential maintenance checks for a hassle free day on the water. Check the Dept of Transport website for their 45 point annual checklist and their B.E.S.T., (Boat, Equipment, Safety Gear, Trailer) list which should be carried out before each trip.

Another great DoT initiative is the DECKEE App which you can download onto your phone for free. This app has loads of useful features for boaties. It has satellite imagery and can be used like a chart plotter to measure distances or

set waypoints. It can log and save your trips as well as preloading a Float Plan to share with someone reliable who can call for help in case you become overdue. In the near future DECKEE will become the Statewide log on/log off system for all boaties to use. It has up to date weather information including forecasts and marine warnings.

Another useful app is Recfishwest. This one is great for all fishers. It has all the fishing rules including bag and size limits for our region as well as a handy fish identification page. The maps page shows the Marine Park zones and closures and there is even a page to set up reminders for safety gear and license expiry dates.

Make the time now to get your boat and gear ready for a great season of trouble free boating with your friends and family. Don't let a lack of maintenance spoil your day out and potentially put yourself and others at risk.

Update

Its amazing how much space there is in the shed now we have had a big clean up and restacked items to make the space user friendly. It was a great excuse to practise moving around items using our pallet jack including fuel cells, our clark mask, pallets of water as well 500 sandbags. We are all stocked ready to tackle any cyclone or flooding risks here in Shark Bay.

Training

Terry our unit training manager has been busy using his years of experience and knowledge into training our members this month on a roof safety system. Often SES is asked to assist with tarping roofs or building structures during storms and with new regulations coming into place, SES must follow these new requirements for the safety of our personnel.

A roof safety system is a fall protection used for both flat and pitched roofs. The system is light and relatively easy to assemble. It involves a rope going over the whole building which is attached to two anchor points on the ground, which could be trees, star pickets or even a vehicle. From this mainline rope, SES crew are attached with another line via a harness. This method creates a safe and controlled environment for SES crews to work on a roof.

For many of us who are not keen climbers or are afraid of heights, our services to help set up the equipment, watch for hazards and assist from the ground is equally important.

General weekly unit training is held each Monday from 5pm at our local SES unit. New members are always welcome.

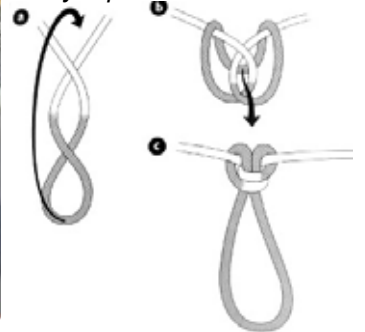

If you call the Shark Bay Health Centre after hours you will be transferred through to Health Direct where a Registered Nurse will ask you a number of questions to determine whether you need further emergency assessment by the Shark Bay nurse. If you require further assessment, your call will be put through to the local nurse.

Examples of an EMERGENCY include:

- Breathing difficulties
- Chest pain
- Severe abdominal pain
- Bleeding that can't be controlled with first aid
- Convulsions and fits
- Deep lacerations
- Eye or ear injuries
- Uncontrolled high fever
- Loss of consciousness
- Pregnancy – bleeding or onset of labour
- A very sick child
