The Shark Bay Community Resource Centre (SBCRC) has been inundated with people seeking assistance from our staff to set up their myGovID and ServiceWA apps on their mobile devices in preparation for new proof of vaccination regulations. We appreciate your patience as we are scheduling appointments to assist individuals to make the process as smooth as possible. Unfortunately for some it can be a lengthy process so we ask everyone to come along prepared with several forms of identification (including one with a photo such as a drivers licence and passport) as well as their wallet with other ID inside and their mobile phone. To set up the apps on your device we also need to create or link to an email address (we have found the same email address can't be used for couples) as well as link Medicare to your online myGov account so we will need your logins and passwords as well. Don't worry if you don't understand, our staff are here to help. Although I am on long service leave I must thank Katie, Natt and Judy for taking on this unexpected workload but as to be expected they are mastering the challenge.

BAITING TO PROTECT NATIVE WILDLIFE

Under the Parks and Wildlife Service's *Western Shield* program, baiting to control foxes and feral cats occurs on more than three million hectares of conservation lands in Western Australia.

The baits used are toxic to introduced animals but not to native animals which have an evolved tolerance to the active compound (1080). All baited areas are signposted.

Baiting occurs on a regular and ongoing basis to protect endangered native animals including the numbat, western ground parrot and western swamp tortoise.



Attention pet owners: these baits will kill domestic dogs and cats. Baited areas must be considered and angerous for pet dogs and cats at all times.



Information on the COVID-19 Vaccine

What is COVID-19?

COVID-19 is a virus (illness) that can make you really sick. It can give you flu-like symptoms with a high fever, cough, sore throat and shortness of breath. It can attack your lungs and cause chest infections (pneumonia) and possibly death.

Why is the COVID-19 vaccine important?

The COVID-19 vaccine works just like the flu needle. It helps your body fight the virus and protects you from getting really sick. It reduces the risk of you spreading the illness to the community, including your family and friends.

You will need two doses of the vaccine for it to work the right way

COVID-19 vaccination.

The person giving you the vaccine will let you know when you need to get your second dose (for the Pfizer vaccine this is 3 to 6 weeks after your first dose)

Which vaccine will I receive?

You will be offered the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine (Comirnaty) unless there is a medical reason for you not to be given this vaccine. Most Australians can safely receive the Pfizer vaccine, and it is the preferred vaccine for people aged 12 to 59 years.

Giving your consent

If you agree (say yes) to getting your COVID-19 vaccine, the person giving you your vaccination will ask you to give your consent (permission to give you the vaccine needle).

When you give your consent (say yes), you are saying it is okay for someone to vaccinate you (give you the COVID-19 needle).



Remember it is up to you. You can choose to have the vaccine or you can choose not to have the vaccine if you don't want to. You can talk to your health clinic, doctor or nurse for more information about the







Preparation a community effort when it comes to disaster season nbn

nbn has launched its 2021 Emergency Preparedness campaign by reminding Australians to put safety measures in place this disaster season and follow some simple tips to help maintain communications during emergency events.

Disaster season provides an opportunity to refresh contingency plans and make sure family members are aware of what to do.

nbn has these top tips for households:

1. Stay Mobile

Keep a charged mobile phone and portable mobile battery pack ready to use in a power outage, or if your nbn[™] connection is disrupted in an emergency event. Consider turning off mobile data on unnecessary apps to save battery.

2. Stay Updated

Local radio is a good source of information during an emergency, so include a battery powered radio in your emergency communications kit. Also follow emergency services, including your state Fire and Rescue and Police Services, as well as utility companies and nbn (@ NBN_Australia) on social media for updates.

3. Back up

To make sure you can access important information and essential documents from anywhere, including insurance policies and financial documents, consider creating a digital back up on a USB or in the cloud.

4. Alternative Power


If there is a power outage, equipment connected to nbn[™] services will not work. For home needs during these times, you might want to consider investing in an alternative power source, like a generator. Unfortunately, alternative options like generators will not bring back home internet if the nbn[™] network is also experiencing a power loss.

nbn is continuing to roll out the nbn[™] Disaster Satellite Service and units are being installed at designated emergency management sites and evacuation centres across regional Western Australia.

The nbn[™] Disaster Satellite Service services provide a backup communications connection using satellite technology and will be switched on during an emergency event, providing free full satellite broadband functionality, including Wi-Fi and video streaming.

"Emergency preparedness is truly a community effort; we are prepared with our contingency measures and if households are prepared with those tips, we can work together to manage the impacts of emergency events and stay connected."

Examples of an EMERGENCY include:

- Breathing difficulties
- Chest pain
- Severe abdominal pain
- Bleeding that can't be controlled with first aid
- Convulsions and fits
- Deep lacerations
- Eye or ear injuries
- Uncontrolled high fever
- Loss of consciousness
- Pregnancy bleeding or onset of labour
- A very sick child
