The Shark Bay Community Resource Centre (SBCRC) has been inundated with people seeking assistance from our staff to set up their myGovID and ServiceWA apps on their mobile devices in preparation for new proof of vaccination regulations. We appreciate your patience as we are scheduling appointments to assist individuals to make the process as smooth as possible. Unfortunately for some it can be a lengthy process so we ask everyone to come along prepared with several forms of identification (including one with a photo such as a drivers licence and passport) as well as their wallet with other ID inside and their mobile phone. To set up the apps on your device we also need to create or link to an email address (we have found the same email address can't be used for couples) as well as link Medicare to your online myGov account so we will need your logins and passwords as well. Don't worry if you don't understand, our staff are here to help. Although I am on long service leave I must thank Katie, Natt and Judy for taking on this unexpected workload but as to be expected they are mastering the challenge.

Information on the COVID-19 vaccine and pregnancy

Planning

Does the vaccine stop me having a baby?

No.
The vaccine won't stop you from getting pregnant.

When should I get the vaccine?

Get it now.
You can get it before you're pregnant, or if you are already pregnant or if you are breastfeeding. The sooner the better for you and baby.



Pregnancy

Why should I get the vaccine?

Pregnant women who get COVID-19 can get very sick. The vaccine protects you from getting very sick from COVID-19. This is very important in the last three months, so get vaccinated early. Pregnant women with COVID-19 can have a still birth, or the baby might come too early, so get vaccinated now.



Which vaccine will I get?

You will get the Pfizer or the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine, which are both safe.



Will the vaccine hurt my baby?

No.
The vaccine will help protect you and your baby from getting very sick from COVID-19.

Have pregnant women had the COVID-19 vaccination before?

Yes.
Over 200,000 women across the world have now been vaccinated. Mothers and babies are safe and well, vaccination helped them from getting very sick from COVID.

Can I wait until after the baby's born?

Yes, it is your choice, but it is better to have the vaccine as soon as you can, so you are safe at the end of your pregnancy and when the baby is born.



Breastfeeding

Can I breastfeed after getting the vaccine?

Yes.
Getting the vaccine will help keep you and your baby from getting very sick from COVID. Breast milk is the best for your baby.

BAITING TO PROTECT NATIVE WILDLIFE

Under the Parks and Wildlife Service's *Western Shield* program, baiting to control foxes and feral cats occurs on more than three million hectares of conservation lands in Western Australia.

The baits used are toxic to introduced animals but not to native animals which have an evolved tolerance to the active compound (1080). All baited areas are signposted.

Baiting occurs on a regular and ongoing basis to protect endangered native animals including the numbat, western ground parrot and western swamp tortoise.

 **Attention pet owners: these baits will kill domestic dogs and cats. Baited areas must be considered dangerous for pet dogs and cats at all times.**

Information on the COVID-19 Vaccine

What is COVID-19?

COVID-19 is a virus (illness) that can make you really sick. It can give you flu-like symptoms with a high fever, cough, sore throat and shortness of breath. It can attack your lungs and cause chest infections (pneumonia) and possibly death.



Why is the COVID-19 vaccine important?

The COVID-19 vaccine works just like the flu needle. It helps your body fight the virus and protects you from getting really sick. It reduces the risk of you spreading the illness to the community, including your family and friends.

You will need two doses of the vaccine for it to work the right way.

The person giving you the vaccine will let you know when you need to get your second dose (for the Pfizer vaccine this is 3 to 6 weeks after your first dose).

Which vaccine will I receive?

You will be offered the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine (Comirnaty) unless there is a medical reason for you not to be given this vaccine. Most Australians can safely receive the Pfizer vaccine, and it is the preferred vaccine for people aged 12 to 59 years.



Giving your consent

If you agree (say yes) to getting your COVID-19 vaccine, the person giving you your vaccination will ask you to **give your consent** (permission to give you the vaccine needle).

When you give your consent (say yes), you are saying it is okay for someone to vaccinate you (give you the COVID-19 needle).



Remember it is up to you. You can choose to have the vaccine or you can choose not to have the vaccine if you don't want to.

You can talk to your health clinic, doctor or nurse for more information about the COVID-19 vaccination.

EMU FACTS

Emus normally eat seeds, native fruits, and green leaves. Most of their water requirements come from eating these foods.

Emus are a source of interest to many visitors who take photos of them walking through campgrounds and strolling on beaches. Sometimes they are observed wading in the shallow waters of the ocean.



Emus have a strong instinct to protect themselves and their chicks from any real or perceived threats. Dogs are often seen as a threat.

Feeding emus can make them sick, aggressive, and dependant on people. Emus can become a serious nuisance and threat to the public. These emus cannot be easily relocated or safely handled.

It is not unusual for dogs to be chased by emus. This is an unsettling experience for dogs and their owners as emus can be intimidating.


Feeding fauna without "lawful authority" is an offence under the *Biodiversity and Conservation Act 2016* which attracts a penalty.

FOR YOUR SAFETY

Emus are wild animals and are part of the natural environment.

Some emus are demonstrating aggressive behaviour towards people and dogs. This behaviour has been encouraged by unlawful feeding.

You can help protect yourself, your children, your pets, and the native emus by:

- **Not feeding the emus.**
- Keeping your dog under control.
- Storing dog food and water out of sight
- Not approaching or harassing emus.
- Storing your food out of sight.
- Guarding your food in BBQ areas and on tables.
- Supervising children with food.



The emus are actively looking for opportunities to steal food and may enter your campsite.

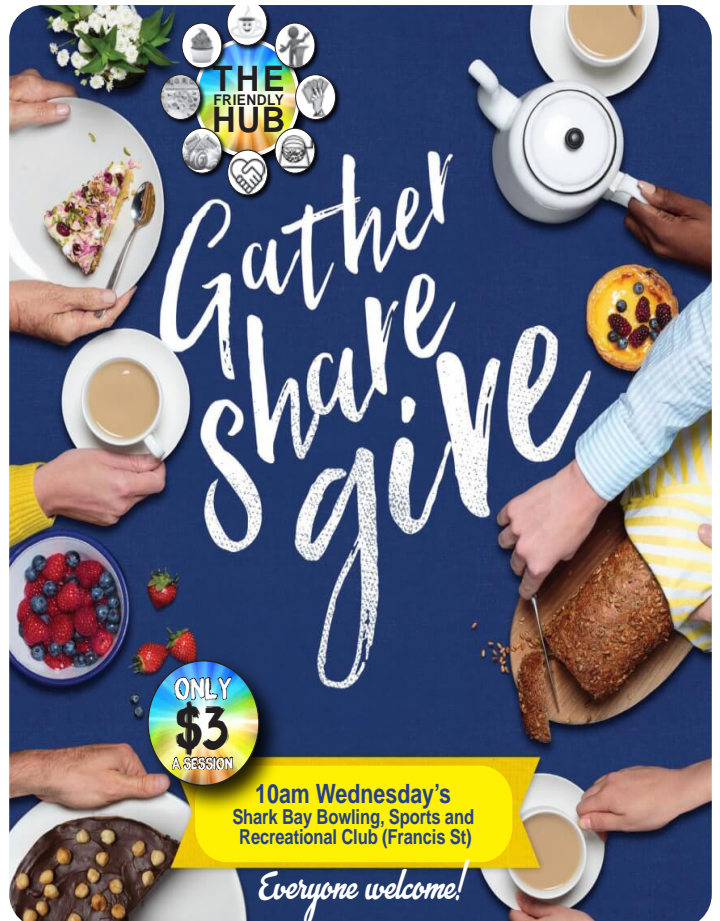

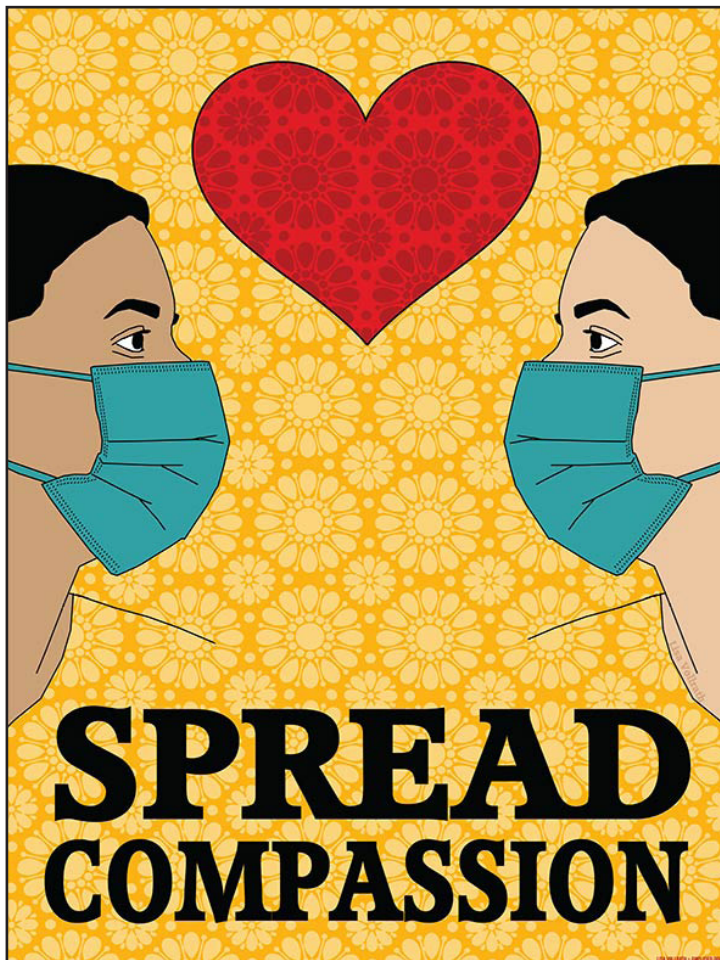

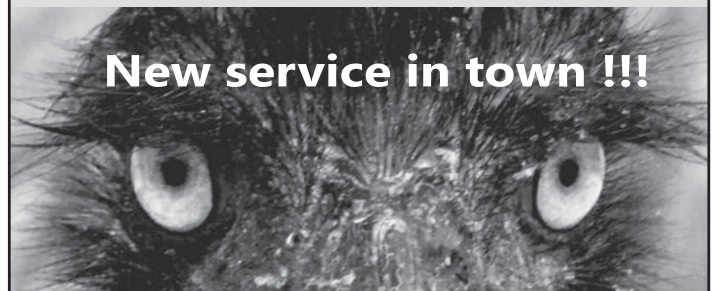

Preparation a community effort when it comes to disaster season



nbn has launched its 2021 Emergency Preparedness campaign by reminding Australians to put safety measures in place this disaster season and follow some simple tips to help maintain communications during emergency events.

Disaster season provides an opportunity to refresh contingency plans and make sure family members are aware of what to do.

nbn has these top tips for households:

1. Stay Mobile

Keep a charged mobile phone and portable mobile battery pack ready to use in a power outage, or if your nbn™ connection is disrupted in an emergency event. Consider turning off mobile data on unnecessary apps to save battery.

2. Stay Updated

Local radio is a good source of information during an emergency, so include a battery powered radio in your emergency communications kit. Also follow emergency services, including your state Fire and Rescue and Police Services, as well as utility companies and nbn (@NBN_Australia) on social media for updates.

3. Back up

To make sure you can access important information and essential documents from anywhere, including insurance policies and financial documents, consider creating a digital back up on a USB or in the cloud.

4. Alternative Power

If there is a power outage, equipment connected to nbn™ services will not work. For home needs during these times, you might want to consider investing in an alternative power source, like a generator. Unfortunately, alternative options like generators will not bring back home internet if the nbn™ network is also experiencing a power loss.

nbn is continuing to roll out the nbn™ Disaster Satellite Service and units are being installed at designated emergency management sites and evacuation centres across regional Western Australia.

The nbn™ Disaster Satellite Service services provide a back-up communications connection using satellite technology and will be switched on during an emergency event, providing free full satellite broadband functionality, including Wi-Fi and video streaming.

“Emergency preparedness is truly a community effort; we are prepared with our contingency measures and if households are prepared with those tips, we can work together to manage the impacts of emergency events and stay connected.”

Proof of vaccination requirements expanded on Monday, January 31, to apply to venues and events state-wide for those aged 16 years and older.

Acceptable proof of vaccination includes:

- the ServiceWA app, the WA Government's free, convenient and secure mobile application to show proof of your COVID-19 vaccinations
- your COVID-19 digital certificate from myGov or the Express Plus Medicare mobile app
- your certificate stored in a smartphone wallet
- a hardcopy of your certificate
- a digital or hardcopy of your immunisation history statement.

Vaccination certificates that are accepted by the Australian Government for travel into Australia will also be accepted at businesses and venues in WA.

An additional form of supporting identification is needed if the proof of vaccination is not stored in:

- The ServiceWA app
- Express Plus Medicare app

If you are unable to receive a COVID-19 vaccine for a medical reason, a doctor will update your record on the Australian Immunisation Register to show that you have a medical exemption.

You can then show proof of your medical exemption when entering a business or venue.

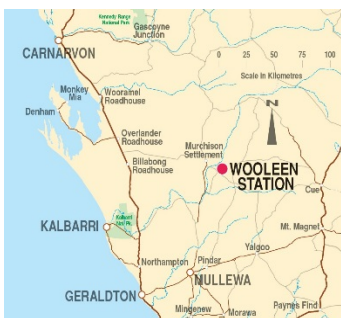

If you call the Shark Bay Health Centre after hours you will be transferred through to Health Direct where a Registered Nurse will ask you a number of questions to determine whether you need further emergency assessment by the Shark Bay nurse. If you require further assessment, your call will be put through to the local nurse.

Examples of an EMERGENCY include:

- Breathing difficulties
- Chest pain
- Severe abdominal pain
- Bleeding that can't be controlled with first aid
- Convulsions and fits
- Deep lacerations
- Eye or ear injuries
- Uncontrolled high fever
- Loss of consciousness
- Pregnancy – bleeding or onset of labour
- A very sick child
