Shire President's Report - February 2022



December 2021 Community Events

There were several community activities and events held during December, which included the Christmas Festival Markets, Thank a Volunteer Day, the Christmas Decorations Competition and the Seniors Christmas Lunch, at which there were more than 40 local seniors who thoroughly enjoyed the three-course-lunch catered for by the Shark Bay Café, with supplies from IGA, and assistance from the Shark Bay Youth Group, as well as Community Resource Centre and Shire staff. Each attendee also received a tin of biscuits, courtesy of the Shire plus a calendar from the CRC.

Grant Funding Applications and Successes

During January/February, the following grant funded projects were completed;

- Re-roofing of three pensioner unit blocks (\$30,000 - Social Housing Economic Recovery Program).
- Internal tiling at Men's Shed – all works now finalised and under management of Men's Shed Committee ((\$110,287 – Gaming Community Trust Funding).

Work continuing on;

- Development of Trails concept for Little Lagoon (as per endorsed Masterplan (\$15,000 – WA State Trail Planning Program).
- Installation of new lights and towers at Bowling Club (\$80,000 - State Government election commitment).
- Upgrade to Discovery Centre gallery lights, including to HMAS Sydney II film (\$19,496 – Art on the Move).

Awaiting the outcome of the following grant submissions;

- Upgrade aspects of the Herald Aged Care units (\$4,118,000 – Social Housing Economic Recovery Program).
- Replacement of the Denham Seawall (\$2,019,525 – National Flood Mitigation Program).
- Conduct of an Emergency Recovery Exercise to determine the town's resilience and preparedness (\$38,943 – Local Stream program, Preparing Australian Communities).
- Children's interactive Dugong activity in the Discovery Centre (\$29,500 – Lotterywest).
- Virtual reality content from the Dirk Hartog Return to 1616 project to be installed in Discovery Centre (\$1,202.95 – Cultural, Heritage and Arts Regional Tourism program).

Unsuccessful grant applications include;

- Feasibility study for the creation of a community garden (\$9,260 – Department of Communities).
- Update and/or replace dual language tourism signage (\$10,000 – Stronger Communities Program).

Australia Day Celebrations, Citizens of the Year Awards, and Australian Citizenship

The annual Shire Citizen Awards Ceremony was conducted on 26 January at the Shark Bay Bowling and Recreation Club which this year also included an Australian Citizenship Ceremony. More than 80 people attend the event to congratulate and acknowledge the community members and groups who have contributed to the welfare of Shark Bay residents during the past year.

The nominees for the Individual Category were; Shaun Burton, Rebecca Moroney and Claire Harrower, with the award presented to Claire.

In the Individual over 65 years Category nominees were; Pat Parker and Chris Rewi, with the award presented to Chris.

The Youth (under 18) Category was awarded to Jennifer Moroney, whilst the Community Group or Event nominees were; Shark Bay State Emergency Services, Shark Bay Youth Group and Shark Bay Fishing Club, with the award presented to the Youth Group.

Congratulations to all the nominees and thank you on behalf of the Shark Bay community for your volunteer service. We all appreciate the time and effort that you so freely give to support our lifestyle and continued wellbeing in the Bay.

Congratulations also to Gabbi on taking the final step to become an Australian Citizen!

Following the formalities, a hearty breakfast was provided by the Community Resource staff, ably assisted also by the Bowlo club members and supplemented by the generous donation of mullet and whiting fillets from the Shark Bay Fish Factory.




Art on the Move

FREE PULSE OXIMETER

The Department of Health is offering free pulse oximeters to vulnerable members in regional communities. A pulse oximeter is a small peg-like device that clips onto your finger to read your heart rate and blood oxygen levels.

Combined with the Department of Health's free WA COVID Care at Home service, these pulse oximeters will help to alleviate unnecessary pressure on Shark Bay's limited health care systems.

The Shire has been issued with a number of oximeters that are free for eligible members of the community. If you can answer yes to the following questions you can pick up your oximeter at the Shire administration office:

- ARE YOU NON-ABORIGINAL AND OVER 65?
- ARE YOU ABORIGINAL AND OVER 50?
- ARE YOU PREGNANT?

Please only collect if you are well and have not tested positive for Covid-19. If you have received a positive Covid-19 test result, please contact the office on 9948 1218.

Please note - only one pulse oximeter is available per household at this point in time.



Waste Collection Requirements in Denham

As a community, we want to maintain our reputation as a Tidy Town, and this requires a contribution from everyone. From 1 December 2021 the following requirements must be observed or your bin will not be collected.

One Bin Only

Only one bin will be collected per household, unless approved by the Shire prior to collection.



Incorrect Items

Do not put items such as bricks, heavy timber or steel in the bin. These materials can damage the collection equipment and your bin. The bins are for domestic waste only.



Overflowing Bins

Bins overflowing with rubbish will not be collected. Ensure that the lid on your bin is able to remain shut at all times to ensure no wildlife can access it.



Damaged Bins

Bins that are broken, cracked, or missing lids/wheels will not be collected. It is your responsibility to ensure repairs or replacement.



Rocks On Lids

Bins using rocks to keep the lid secure will not be collected as they can damage the truck. The Shire are currently working on an alternative solution and will update the community via social media.



Replacement Bins

RENTERS: Please contact your agent or property owner to notify them of any damaged bins.

OWNERS: Please make sure you arrange to repair or replace damaged bins.

The more time parents spend with their child, the more attuned they will become to their emerging abilities. Parenting children aged 10 - 12 is a challenging time for parents, and the more time they can spend together will make this transition period easier. These event helped strengthen the bond between parent and child, helped develop team work, promoted the importance of good communication skills and allowed the parent and child to be together in a safe and stimulating environment.

Both events were well attended with Mums and Dads valuing the opportunity to participate.

The importance of sitting around a table communicating with others is a life skill and something that's not done as often as it should be. Meals were devoured by hungry kayakers and no one could get enough of the icy cold drinks on offer!

The events were a huge success and we thank Parenting Connection WA for understanding the importance of bringing parent and child together.

We hope to offer more of these parenting courses here in Shark Bay in the future.



50 regional and remote schools embark on a mission to uncover new insect species

50 regional and remote [schools](#) across South Australia, Queensland and Western Australia have been selected to take part in a new citizen science project, [Insect Investigators](#), led by the South Australian Museum and supported by the Western Australian Gould League and the Western Australian Museum.

The project, which launched in September 2021, will connect regional and remote school students with researchers to document their local insect biodiversity and discover new insects in their area.

Participating schools are required to set up a Malaise trap, a tent-like structure that catches flying insects, and monitor their findings for a four-week period commencing March 1, 2022.

The specimens will be sorted, DNA barcoded and sent to expert scientists who will identify and research the insects to help build on the knowledge of Australia's insect species.

Dr Karen Cullen, Executive Officer of the WA Gould League, said she has been overwhelmed by the level of interest from schools wanting to participate in the inaugural year of *Insect Investigators*.

"We are so excited by the demand for this project, with nearly 200 schools applying for the 50 places," she said.

"In Western Australia we have [17 regional schools participating](#), spread right across the state."

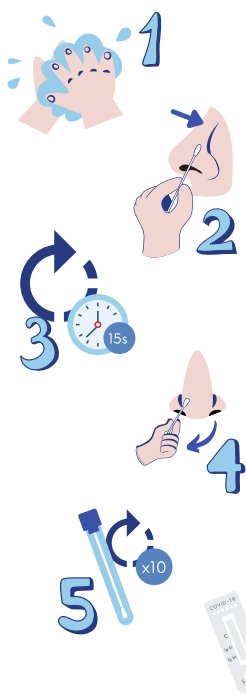

COVID-19: Testing and Isolation Protocol



RAPID ANTIGEN TESTING (RAT): HOW TO USE IT

HOW TO USE IT



1. Make sure your hands are clean
2. Insert swab into one nostril until you feel a slight resistance (about 2-3cm)
3. Rotate the swab at the back of your nose while counting to 15 slowly, then remove the swab from the nostril while rotating it
4. Repeat step 3 with the same swab on the other nostril
5. Place the swab into the vial, rotate the swab 10 times, remove the swab, then close the vial and shake
6. Place 3 or 4 drops of liquid from the vial onto the round circle at the bottom of the rapid antigen test
7. Wait before reading the results of the test (check the RAT packaging for how long you need to wait for)
8. Check your results; one line means you have tested negative and two lines mean you have tested positive for Covid-19

When a positive result is registered, WA Health will assess how best to manage the situation, including whether health care is needed, and provide advice on what to do next.

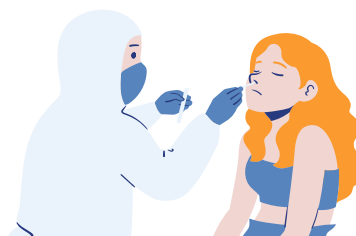
People who have self-administered a RAT at home for Covid-19 and tested positive must register their results online with the Department of Health. This process can be completed by the person who has returned the positive result, or by another person on their behalf.

To register your results, visit [healthywa.gov.au](https://healthywa.health.wa.gov.au), search the site for "Rapid Antigen Test" and follow the link to "Register a positive RAT test".

The mandatory registration requires information to be logged including:

- Date and time of test
- Personal details about your situation
- Phone number to be contacted on

People who do not have access to the online registration system must still report their positive test result, and can do so by calling 13 26843.

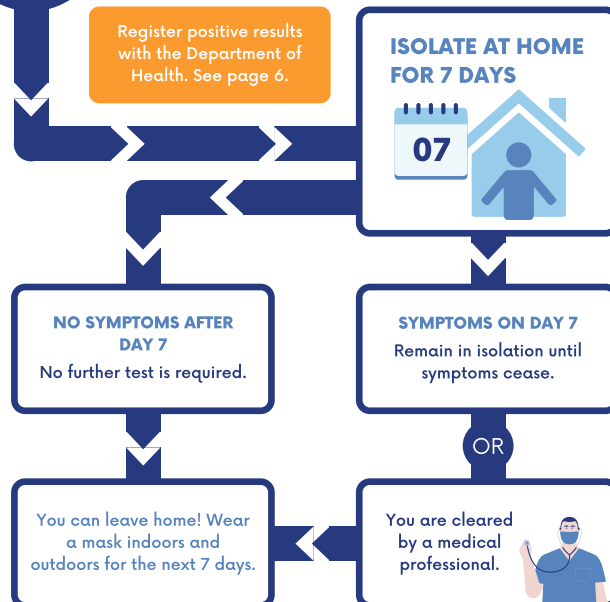

BAITING TO PROTECT NATIVE WILDLIFE

Under the Parks and Wildlife Service's *Western Shield* program, baiting to control foxes and feral cats occurs on more than three million hectares of conservation lands in Western Australia.

The baits used are toxic to introduced animals but not to native animals which have an evolved tolerance to the active compound (1080). All baited areas are signposted.

Baiting occurs on a regular and ongoing basis to protect endangered native animals including the numbat, western ground parrot and western swamp tortoise.

Attention pet owners: these baits will kill domestic dogs and cats. Baited areas must be considered dangerous for pet dogs and cats at all times.

Academic Excellence Recognition

We received this certificate from the Minister of Education and Training of WA at the end of 2021, recognizing the particularly good performance of our students in NAPLAN testing, with a letter from the Director General congratulating our staff on their focus and efforts supporting the best possible outcomes for students.



We know that NAPLAN is only one measure of a school's success, but we are so pleased that our quality teaching practices, our parents' support and our students' efforts, are leading to such good growth in literacy and numeracy.

Student Certificates and Awards

Shark Bay School values both Caring and Achievement. We model to students the importance of caring for each other and ourselves, and of striving to do our very best in all tasks, not in competition with each other, but in order to achieve the best we can.

Teachers encourage the development of these values and provide support, encouragement and acknowledgement every day. Often, these informal interactions are the most valuable and appreciated, but in addition we award certificates at Assemblies and have special awards at the end of the year. When selecting students for formal recognition by certificate or award, staff take into consideration

- Consistency – students demonstrating caring, respectful values reliably or with increasing effort/frequency
- Achievement and growth in academic outcomes – students who demonstrate commitment to their studies, reliability in completing work including homework on time and to the best of their ability, and extra effort so as to achieve better grades/outcomes.

Staff keep records of home reading, homework completion, work submission and reliability with classroom responsibilities, to ensure fair recognition of effort. Growth in academic achievement for each student can be measured through our learning programs' assessment scales and through additional testing which measures student performance in a quantitative, comparative manner in comparison with a national database, such as through OnEntry testing, NAPLAN testing, PAT testing and Brightpath testing. These assessments ensure that teachers can evaluate not only excellence in achievement, but excellence in improvement in achievement, and acknowledge and award students fairly in a way that builds a classroom culture of celebrating effort and success.

At present we are not permitted to hold whole school Assemblies. Class teachers will confirm dates for short Certificate presentations for each learning block, starting with Wuthuga (Y3-4 and 5-6) at 8.30 am on 18 March, and Buyungurra (Y7-12) at 8.30 am on 25 March.

Staff team

This year we welcome Ms Gabi de Oliveira Andrade to our teaching team as a Science/ Technology/ Engineering/ Maths (STEM) specialist for our Primary classes and also teaching Maths Measurement for Y3-4 students and supporting the Y1,2 class on Wednesday mornings. Also new to the staff team is Mr Michael James, running our Year 7-12 Buyungurra Learning Block, and teaching History and Social Science to Y7-8 students. It's great to see our high school students settling so well into their learning routines.

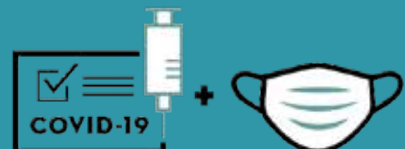

Shorebird Count

A shorebird count was carried out around Denham at the end of January as part of Birdlife Australia's annual monitoring program. Two volunteers came up from Perth and joined with Karen and I to do counts at six different sites over three days.

I would like to thank Kim Branch from DBCA for helping with logistics for a couple of the harder to reach sites. Rangers Cody and Trevor were a wealth of local knowledge and off road driving skills.

The tidal mudflats around Shark Bay are an extremely valuable source of food for the migratory shorebirds which travel here from the Northern Hemisphere each summer.

They travel over 10,000 kms along the East Asian Flyway to escape the harsh winters of their Northern Hemisphere breeding grounds around the Arctic Circle to come to places like Shark Bay where they feed and rest over our summer months in preparation for the return journey.

Several of the species that are regular visitors here are now listed as vulnerable, endangered, or critically endangered due to their declining world populations. Their numbers are suffering due to habitat loss from land reclamation along the migratory flyway, especially in the Yellow Sea.

During the surveys 14 migratory and 15 resident shorebird species were sighted. Interestingly, the area between Nicholson Point and Little Lagoon Creek had the greatest diversity with 11 resident and 11 migratory species including types which are listed as critically endangered.



We are privileged to have such an important feeding and roosting site so close to where we live and this area needs protection, especially from 4 wheel drives and off-leash dogs to minimize disturbances to these birds over the summer months.

Other sites surveyed were Lharidon Bight, Monkey Mia, Geschenault Point, Dubaut Creek and Big Lagoon. These surveys are conducted annually at hundreds of sites around Australia and are an important tool for monitoring shorebird population trends.

We look forward to working closely with DBCA and Birdlife Australia on future surveys and trying to establish protection for these important shorebird species and the environment they rely on to survive.

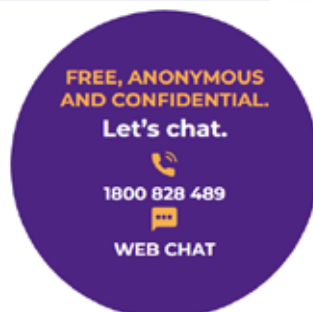

Caladenia roei, a species of orchid cited in Bentham's *Flora Australiensis*.

Roe's poison (*Oxylobium spectabile*) first collected by Roe at Emu Hill near Narembeen, WA.

Haliotis roei, Roe's abalone, a species of abalone habitating the Southern Australian coast to Victoria.





Possibly the most significant legacies Septimus Roe left involved the setting aside of Kings Park Garden. Perth in 1830... & as the founding President of the Swan River Mechanics Institute he was instrumental in establishing the Western Australian Museum & The State Library of Western Australia.

Like his great grand-daughter Cheryl, Septimus Row was an individual abounding in great Energy, Determination & Drive.

Variants of name – Rowe, Ro, Roe, Row & McEnroe. Celtic name found throughout England, Ireland, Scotland & Wales. Note the dominant gene of the aristocratic nose & determined jaw line carried through to the successive third generation.

New Cancer Support Group

My name is Sherry Baker and I have Cancer.

Now that should sound very familiar, it is the format they use at AA (Alcoholics Anonymous). This is the model I will be using to introduce a new local group - Triple C (Cancer Community Connections), for two very good reasons. Firstly a lot of people who have cancer feel it is very personal and do not want anybody else to know, so what happens and is said at a meeting stays in the meeting. If someone doesn't mind anyone else knowing then it is up to them to say, the meetings have to remain totally confidential. The second reason is by the very nature of the group, it has to be self-perpetuating. Inevitably we are going to lose members of the group, however much we need and love them, it is also their knowledge and their experiences that we do not want to lose.

When you first get unwelcome news that there has been grim diagnosis, it can be overwhelming. The doctors, nurses and social workers try hard to be helpful, but too often they cannot explain in layman's terms, nor do they truly understand the logistics and needs involved with remote area living, *this is where other people's experience can help*. Cancer can be very frightening and cancer can be very lonely, *this is where other people's love and empathy can help*.

I would like to start this group to address this shortfall. There are so many past and present residents who have been struggling alone through this horrible nightmare. I have a degree in Welfare Practice through Curtin University, so with the



assistance of many understanding and well informed locals I should be capable of giving this project a sound grounding for the members to help each other in the years to come. We already have the Cancer Council and the Palliative Care Nurses supporting the formation of a local group.

Once a month on the first Sunday afternoon from 4 until 5pm has been suggested. This sounds good to me, a lot of people have work and voluntary commitments during the week and also a Sunday late afternoon doesn't even clash with the footy!!

I look forward with hope and optimism to our first meeting
On Sunday 3rd April. 4-5pm

Living with History

Planet Fisheries

When Planet Fisheries decided to start prawn processing in Denham in the 60's, they extended the fish processing works and built extensive accomodation and messing facilities for the work force. They also built the jetty at Monkey mia, where up to a dozen trawlers unloaded. Some of the prawns were cooked for local markets but the majority of the catch was sold overseas and interstate as snap frozen raw prawn flesh.

As there was not sufficient local labour, the company brought in quite a large force of female workers. Delighted by this influx of talent, a lot of the younger local men and some not so young, lost their hearts and their heads. This caused a lot of ill feeling between the local girls, who worked in the fish processing part of the business, and the prawn staff.

One day at work I heard something that caused me to warn the manager that there was going to be trouble between the girls of the different departments when they all came out for smoko. He, being a man of discretion and sound common sense, promptly made himself scarce. It- fell to his diminutive wife to defuse the situation. This she did, somehow or other, and an uneasy truce was declared.

Another boat, crewed by a Dutch family had a licence to catch a certain number of green turtles. The turtles were caught by hand from power dinghies up off Quobba. The turtles were beheaded and gutted and when they had a freezer load filled, they came back to Monkey Mia. Each boatload filled one

of the Wesfarmers big semi-trailer freezer trucks. They were carted to Robs Jetty for processing. I believe most of the product went overseas. When Planet moved their whole operation to Carnarvon it was quite a blow to the economy of Denham.

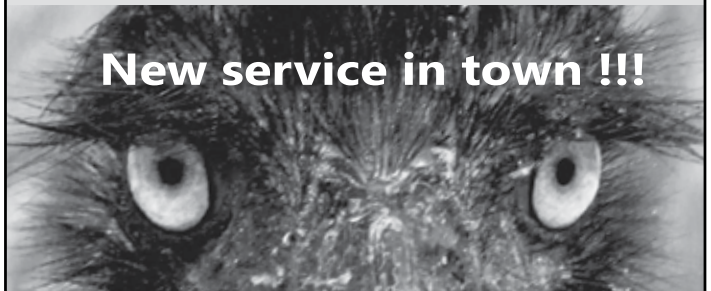
