Executive Officer's Report



Matters of Concern with 2023 Income Tax Returns from the team at H & R Block Geraldton and Shellborough Accounting Pty Ltd

As you will have heard in the recent Budget the Middle-Income Offset, which affected everyone with Taxable Income less than \$126,000, has been cancelled for the year to 30th June 2023 with the following affect to refunds;
Income

- 0 - \$37,000, \$675 reduction in refund
- \$37,000 - \$48,000, \$675 rising to \$1,500 reduction in refund
- \$48,000 - \$90,000, \$1,500 reduction in refund
- \$90,000 - \$126,000, \$1,500 reducing to zero reductions in refund

Also, the ATO is likely to be targeting various matters within Tax Returns lodged for the 2023 year and we would like to draw your attention to some of them we feel could affect some clients:

Self-education expenses

The ATO need to be sure that any self-education expenses are directly connected with your current income earning activities and not that the course is directed towards the commencement of a new income-earning activity. You will need to provide details of the course and how it relates/improves your current work position.

Repairs to your Rental property

The ATO will be taking a closer look at any major repairs to your rental property and whether they are immediately deductible, or not, on the basis that they maybe capital in nature. The question of whether, or not, repairs are deductible is based on a question of fact and degree and hence is always open to differing points of view.

It maybe advisable, that before the claim is made, you obtain independent written advice from the builder, who conducted the repairs, confirming the nature of the repairs was to only remedy existing defects.

Motor vehicle travel expenses – work travel

The ATO have increased the use of own motor vehicle rate for the Cents per kilometre claim to 78c (from 72c). They have also declared that this is likely to be an audit target this year.

In order for own vehicle travel expenses to be deductible, the travel needs to demonstrate the following characteristics, as outlined in TR 95/34:

- travel is a fundamental part of the employee's work;
- the existence of a "web of workplaces" in the employee's regular employment (ie the employee has no fixed place of work);
- The employee continually travels from one work site to another;
- the cents per kilometre method is only available for cars and not work utes or vans.

The ATO can contact your employer to verify that you are required to use your own vehicle for work purposes.

Working at home

If you have worked from home at any time from 1 July 2022 to 30 June 2023, and have kept a record in the form of a diary, work roster etc, you may be able to make a claim for working at home.

Please note however, the ATO has changed how working from home deductions can be claimed by eligible taxpayers for the 2023 income year.

To be eligible to use the ATO's revised fixed-rate (67 cents per hour) method to claim for:

- energy expenses (i.e. electricity and gas) for lighting, heating/cooling, and to run electronic items used for work or business;
- internet expenses;
- mobile and home telephone expenses; and
- stationery and computer consumables (e.g., printing paper and printer cartridges).

Under the revised fixed-rate method, a claim for the above running expenses is calculated at a fixed rate of 67 cents for each hour (compared to 52c per hour PLUS phone, internet and stationery costs) that you worked from home during the 2023 income year.

This is an alternative method to claiming for the above running expenses using the actual expenses method, which would require a separate claim for the work/business portion of each expense.

The depreciation of a computer used for work or business and other larger office equipment can be claimed both methods.

Shire President's Report



Grant Funded Projects and Successful Submissions

The Shire has been successful in obtaining the following grant funds

\$20,000 – Lotterywest to assist with the Beats in the Bay Festival

\$130,000 - Regional North Local Government Assistance – to undertake a review of our Local Planning Strategy.

Work is continuing on the following local community programs;

- Installation of hard shade shelters - foreshore adventure park
- Matting and beach wheelchairs – to improve accessibility to town beach area
- New reticulation and resurfaced lawn areas - town oval (completed)
- Installation of additional solar streetlights and CCTV cameras.

Funding of \$70 000 from the Department of Transport for the dual use pathway along Stella Rowley Drive and this project has now been completed to the lookout.

Phase 3 of the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure (LRCI) funding will also support a much-needed upgrade of the air conditioning systems in the Discovery Centre.

Options to expand Denham's social housing infrastructure, including additional aged pensioner units, utilising the \$4.1m in funding secured through Round 2 of the Social Housing and Economic Recovery Plan are being progressed by Shire staff and Council.

Shark Bay has been selected (via a competitive process) for geotechnical surveys to be undertaken along the coastline north and south of Knight Terrace. Apart from traffic management services whilst this is being undertaken, there will be no additional cost to the Shire for this work which will ultimately support our Coastal Hazard Management planning for the foreshore area.

WA Local Government Gascoyne Waste and Environment Summit

The Shire hosted this successful conference on 11/12 May in Denham which attracted 30+ delegates to our town to discuss Waste Management and Environmental issues.

Shark Bay NEW Recycling Centre

Locals will no doubt have noticed changes to the previous Shire recycling depot and in partnership with Containers for Change and the ABC foundation, the previous Bring Centre has been upgraded with new signage and some changes to processes.

The Centre is now a donation point for eligible containers for change, collected by ABC, to raise money for sustainable practices and projects. The Shire is developing a marketing campaign to educate the community as to how the new Recycling Centre will operate.

Shark Bay Fiesta

This Fiesta held in mid-May was once a very successful and well attended event, with a schedule of events organised by the CRC which promoted a positive social and economic impact for the Bay. Well done once again to CRC and all involved!

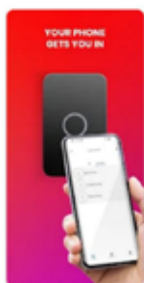

The Shire of Shark Bay is located in the Shark Bay World Heritage Area which is one of three World Heritage areas within WA. Located approximately 830 kilometres north of Perth, Shark Bay is a wonderland of world-class natural attractions, the clear turquoise waters are ablaze with multi-coloured sea life and stretching beyond the white sandy beaches are spectacular rust-red sand dunes.

The Shire is seeking a Finance Officer – Revenue to provide financial customer service for the Shire of Shark Bay in the areas of invoicing, accounts receivable, bank Reconciliations, Department of Transport licensing and other office tasks as required. A position description can be found on Council's website www.sharkbay.wa.gov.au.

The successful applicant will need to demonstrate relevant experience in the accounting functions of accounts receivable, bank reconciliations and month end reporting. Strong interpersonal and communication skills with the ability to work autonomously and as part of a team is essential. This role requires high skill competency in Microsoft Word and Excel. Experience in local government and SynergySoft would be advantageous though not necessary as training will be provided.

enjoy our Shark Bay Environment with some new/old friends. We are hoping some of our Useless Loop families will also be coming so it would be great to spend some time together.

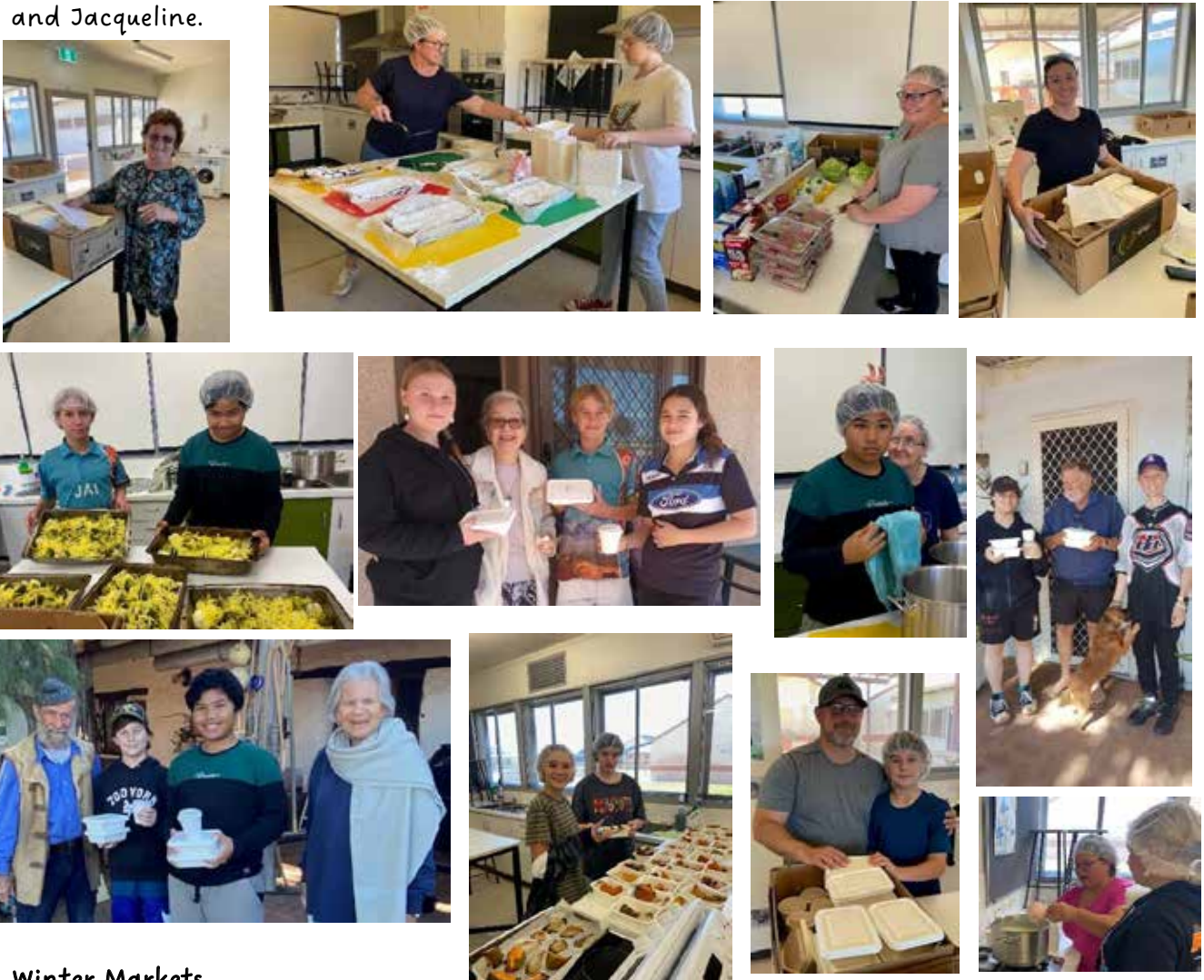
Circus Workshops

Fatigue Management

When a person has exceeded their physical and mental capabilities, their body begins to decrease their physical and mental performance.

Fatigued people are often unaware that they are not functioning as well as they would be if they were not fatigued, and this can make it difficult to diagnose. Keeping everyone safe requires us to not only be vigilant in self-assessment but also identify fatigue - related behaviour in the people we work with. This cooperative approach removes the negative stigma associated with admitting you or your colleagues may be fatigued and emphasising the shared responsibility that goes with managing fatigue effectively.

It's OK to admit that you may be fatigued and it's OK to work with your colleagues emphasising the shared responsibility that goes with managing fatigue effectively. These checklists can help you identify fatigue.

Marine Rescue Shark Bay

The new vessel being built for Marine Rescue Shark Bay is progressing well. It is being built in Geraldton by Dongara Marine who also built Cape Rose. It will be 12 metres in length and powered by triple 300hp OXE diesel outboards. Delivery is expected later this year or early 2024. The hull and wheelhouse fabrication has been completed and the vessel is really starting to take shape. Two sisterships are being built at the same time for the Exmouth and Dampier Marine Rescue groups.

June was a quiet month for the group with only 1 call for assistance, which was great after a busy last 2 weeks in May with 5 jobs logged.

DFES and Marine Rescue Volunteers are working towards a new era for the boating public in WA with Radio Over Internet Protocol, (ROIP), to be rolled out soon. ROIP and the Department of Transport's Deckee App will enable people

to log on and off from anywhere in the State via phone or VHF radio. Float plans will be stored in a centralized data base and the nearest Rescue Group notified in the case of overdue vessels. Hopefully the ease of use and the Statewide coverage will encourage more people to log their trips and make our job a lot easier when they run into difficulty.

Gascoyne Sports & Recreation Forum

During June several SBCRC staff participated in a sports & recreation forum held locally which welcomed representatives across a variety of state sporting associations and government organisations to Denham. It

was a fantastic opportunity for us to advise these people of the limitations we currently have specific to our community (numbers especially) when we are organising and encouraging any sports or recreation activities. It was also a great chance to put Denham on their radar should they be touring the state visiting local schools or sporting clubs.

A valuable part of the forum was finding out what funding is available and worth looking into. In short some of the relevant grants bought up during the forum included:

- Kidsport (\$150 a year for registration fees, 5-18 years, must have a current Health Care Card).
- North West Travel Subsidy (\$600 for an individual, \$2000 per team).
- Athlete Travel Support Subsidy (for high performance athletes, 1 application per sport per year).
- Active Regional Community Grants (great for events such as Shark Bay Downwinder & Gassy Dash).
- Community Sport Recreation Facility Fund (for infrustrcture or events 100 plus people, based on a 3 year cycle).
- Bendigo Bank in Geraldton for Community Grants.
- Healthway.
- Horizon Power (for equipment).

Have a google and check out which ones might assist the situation you are in as either an individual, club or community group,

One sport we are keen to look further into is touch rugby, which has proven popular in other small towns similar to our number participation problems. The sport can be adapted to allow school aged children to play along side parents and capable seniors in the same teams. As the sport is new to our staff, we are keen to seek the knowledge of anyone locally who could guide us through testing out this competitive fun sport in our community. Happy sporting & crafting!

**BAITING TO PROTECT
NATIVE WILDLIFE**

Under the Parks and Wildlife Service's *Western Shield* program, baiting to control foxes and feral cats occurs on more than three million hectares of conservation lands in Western Australia.

The baits used are toxic to introduced animals but not to native animals which have an evolved tolerance to the active compound (1080). All baited areas are signposted.

Baiting occurs on a regular and ongoing basis to protect endangered native animals including the numbat, western ground parrot and western swamp tortoise.

  **Attention pet owners: these baits will kill domestic dogs and cats. Baited areas must be considered dangerous for pet dogs and cats at all times.**



Consumer Watch

Travelling in a post-pandemic world

As the world shakes off the shackles of COVID-19, many Western Australians are feeling more confident about jetting off or setting sail for a holiday. We therefore want to remind travellers about their rights under the Australian Consumer Law (ACL) if something goes wrong with a travel product or service.

Beyond what is outlined in the terms and conditions, the travel provider is bound by the ACL to deliver a cruise, flight, tour or accommodation that meets the description or advertisement.

This issue was recently highlighted when Perth cruise passengers were told shortly before departure their ship was no longer heading into open waters and would instead remain docked in WA for maintenance. Following media coverage on the issue that included commentary by Consumer Protection, our understanding is the maintenance was subsequently cancelled and the cruise proceeded as originally planned.

In addition to delivering on what was promised, travel services must also be provided with due care and skill, fit for any specified purpose and occur within a reasonable period of time (if no time was set when booking).

When one of these consumer guarantees is not met, the appropriate remedy will depend on how major the problem is. If you wouldn't have paid for the service had you known about the problem, it's considered a major failure and means you get to choose the remedy, which could include a refund, compensation or new booking. For minor failures that can be resolved, the travel provider can choose to fix the issue or provide a replacement service in a reasonable time.

Remember, that while the ACL protects you within Australia, accommodation or travel booked with overseas companies may mean your entitlements are dictated by the consumer regulations in that jurisdiction.

If things don't go to plan, it's best to try to resolve any issues with your travel provider directly. If you are unsuccessful, don't forget that paying by credit card may allow you to get a chargeback through your bank if you do not receive what you pay for.

Speak up about substandard rentals

Western Australia's rental market has never been tighter, but it doesn't mean tenants should accept living in homes that are falling into disrepair, have mould or electrical safety issues.

So far this year, Consumer Protection has received 367 enquiries and 32 complaints about rental repair and maintenance issues, but we suspect these figures are only a small proportion of the actual number of tenants experiencing such problems currently.

Due to the low vacancy rates, we are concerned some tenants may feel trapped in substandard properties and afraid to voice their concerns out of fear of being unable to find another place to live.

While we understand these anxieties, we still urge tenants to learn about their rights or contact us so that we may try to help them resolve the problems.

Landlords are duty-bound to promptly attend to any maintenance or repair issues, as well as to provide a safe and healthy environment for their tenants.

We are concerned to see electrical hazards listed among some of the issues reported to us. If tenants experience any shocks, tingles or other serious electrical safety issues in their rental home, they should immediately contact their network operator (likely either Western Power or Horizon Power) before alerting their landlord, property manager or other government agencies like Consumer Protection or Building and Energy.

Harmful black mould is another health hazard to watch-out for, particularly as we head into the wetter months. A landlord could be in breach of a rental agreement if mould develops due to a lack of maintenance or repairs, while a tenant could be in breach if they fail to keep the property reasonably clean, dry and well ventilated.

Tenants facing repair or maintenance issues that could cause them harm or undue hardship are reminded they can breach the landlord for failing to carry out urgent or essential repairs. If the matter goes to court, tenants may be released from their rental contract obligations and even be awarded compensation.

Tenants who believe their landlord or agent has failed to initiate repairs or maintenance within a reasonable timeframe are urged to contact Consumer Protection on consumer@dmirs.wa.gov.au or by calling 1300 304 054.

Country Stargazing

Dance of the Planets

Just as our daylight skies are ever-changing, with new sunsets and shifting cloud formations, our evening skies are constantly changing too, as the planets of our solar system appear to move across the sky throughout the year. The word planet means “wanderer”, given by the ancient Greeks who studied the night sky and began to understand their orbits.

From our perspective here on Earth, as the planets continue their never-ending ‘waltz’ around the Sun, their orbits can sometimes bring the planets together to form incredible conjunctions or ‘Planet Parties’.

Across the month of July, stargazers will be treated to a sunset display as Mars, Venus and Mercury take centre stage. Starting on the 10th, Mars will appear right next to the bright star Regulus and Venus! Keen eyed observers may also spot the ISS passing by this triplet of lights around 6pm. Watch Mars drift away from Regulus and Mercury and take centre stage throughout the month, culminating in Mercury making a very close approach to Regulus on the 29th. Even the Moon will join the party, making a close approach on the 20th and 21st.

When to look: Earlier in the month, watch from sunset to 7:30pm, by the end of July, this event can only be seen from 6:00pm to 6:30pm.



Which direction to look: West north-west, very low to the horizon.

They will continue their beautiful dance throughout July, and this will culminate with another special grouping on the 20th and 21st, when the stunning thin slither of the Moon joins the party to form a striking nightscape with Mars and Venus. Enjoy the cosmic views stargazers.

Gascoyne Development Commission

My role is to support local businesses to access opportunity in State and Local Government tenders and contracts, and work with you to build capability and capacity by connecting you to support as needed. - Upgrade, replace or purchase tools and equipment
- Purchase a vehicle (either new or second-hand through a dealer)
- Buy specialised plant and machinery e.g., winches, bobcats, forklifts, cherry pickers, backhoes, trailers, or trucks etc.
- Put your workforce through a course
- Upgrade your IT systems, hardware or accounting software
- Investment in professional business advice and planning.

I encourage you to have a look at the attached guidelines to make sure you're eligible and check if you have an idea in mind. The Application form is also attached so you can see

what's required.

In conjunction with the Grow Local Program and the Shire of Carnarvon, we're looking at hosting a workshop where we go through the application question by question to assist those not familiar with grant applications.

This will likely be early July, so if you're interested in attending, or wish to attend a similar workshop in Shark Bay, please reply via email and register your interest.

We encourage you to apply for this funding! There may be a limited pool - however it's important to show the State just how much the Gascoyne can grow with some funding, as we demonstrated with the results of the Total Solar Eclipse.

If you call the Shark Bay Health Centre after hours you will be transferred through to Health Direct where a Registered Nurse will ask you a number of questions to determine whether you need further emergency assessment by the Shark Bay nurse. If you require further assessment, your call will be put through to the local nurse.

Examples of an EMERGENCY include:

- Breathing difficulties
- Chest pain
- Severe abdominal pain
- Bleeding that can't be controlled with first aid
- Convulsions and fits
- Deep lacerations
- Eye or ear injuries
- Uncontrolled high fever
- Loss of consciousness
- Pregnancy – bleeding or onset of labour
