<u>Dental van visit to Denham</u>

Due staffing difficulties Dental to Health Services has had a reduced capacity to provide dental care to the Shark Bay community.

DHS will be providing dental care at Shark Bay School from 9th October to 3rd November 2023 and will prioritise the provision of care to the eligible school children in the area. There will be limited capacity to provide dental care to the adult population however adult patients requiring urgent



care can contact staff on 0447 854 272 to schedule an appointment for emergency care 25th October on 27th October.

<u>4 WAYS TO RECYCLE IN DENHAM</u>

1: GET A 10C REFUND

Return eligible containers to Yadgalah Aboriginal Corporation Mobile Drop Point and receive a 10c refund.

2: DONATE YOUR CONTAINERS

Collect eligible containers and drop them in marked bins at the Shark Bay Recycling Centre. 'Onion bags' are available for free at the Op Shop and CRC to help you collect containers.

3: OUT AND ABOUT

Drop eligible containers into specially marked collection baskets along Denham Foreshore.





4. NON-ELIGIBLE RECYCLABLE ITEMS

Bring non-eligible plastics, glass, and cardboard to Shark Bay Recycling Centre and sort them into marked yellow-top bins. The Shire is working on securing recycling partnerships for transport and processing.

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN I DONATE MY 10C CONTAINER?

When you recycle through the Shark Bay Recycling Centre or marked collection baskets:

- 5c is donated to ABC Foundation for important social programs in remote communities.
- 5c is used by the Shire of Shark Bay to fund future local recycling and sustainability efforts.

One Bin Only

Only one bin will be collected per household, unless approved by the Shire prior to collection,



Overflowing Bins

Bins overflowing with rubbish will not be collected. Ensure that the lid on your bin is able to remain shut at all times to ensure no wildlife can access it.

Waste Disposal Local Health Laws

All owners and occupiers are responsible for your bins and what goes in them

Bin Receptacles

- · keep your bin lid closed, except when depositing rubbish or cleaning it
- except for a reasonable period before and after collection time, keep your bin on the premises and located either behind the street alignment as close as practicable to the street alignment of the premises but so that it does not obstruct any footpath, cycle way, right-of-way or carriage way.
- · ensure that the premises is provided with an adequate number of receptacles.

Incorrect Items

Do not put items such as bricks, heavy timber or steel in the bin. These materials can damage the collection equipment and your bin. The bins are for domestic waste only.



Damaged Bins

Bins that are broken, cracked, or missing lids/wheels will not be collected. It is your responsibility to ensure repairs or replacement.

It is the property owners responsibility to arrange bin repairs & replacements. Renters, please contact the Owner or Property Manager.

What should NOT go in your bin

- more than 70 kilograms of rubbish or refuse,
- hot or burning ash,
- oil, motor spirit or other flammable liquid, liquid paint or other solvent,
- bricks, concrete, building rubble, earth or other like substances, drugs, dressings, bandages, swabs or blood samples unless placed in a
- sealed impervious and leak-proof container, hospital, medical, veterinary, laboratory or pathological substances containing blood unless placed in a sealed impervious and leak-proof
- container, syringes, needles, surgical hardware, broken glass, sharps or other sharp objects unless placed in a sealed impervious leak-proof and impenetrable
- container, cytotoxins, radioactive substances and dangerous chemicals,
- sewage, manure, nightsoil, faeces or urine, any object which is greater in length, width, or breadth than the corresponding dimension of the receptacle or which will not allow the lid of the receptacle to be tightly closed, or
- rubbish or refuse which is or is likely to become offensive or a nuisance, or give off an offensive or noxious odour, or to attract flies or cause fly breeding unless it is first wrapped in non-absorbent or impervious material or placed in a sealed impervious container

Conservation Matters

Western Grasswren Surveys

Many locals will be familiar with our beloved Western Grasswren, Amytornis textillis, pictured below. More so, many birding enthusiasts from around Australia and even overseas visit Monkey Mia to catch what is sometimes just a fleeting glimpse of this hard to see bird. Why Monkey Mia? At least one family of bids has become accustomed to the bustle of visitors, going so far as to remove dead insects from the radiator grills of cars!

Apart from those at Monkey Mia, the species, and their relatives spread across arid and tropical Australia, are usually very difficult to find, as they sprint across the ground between the cover of bushes, rarely taking flight. Even worse, their contact calls are so highly pitched that a significant portion of the human population cannot hear them.

Within the Shark Bay Heritage region they are found in two distinct populations, those from Hamelin Station and nearby lands as far north as Gladstone, and those from the Peron Peninsula. Importantly, they were once found on Dirk Hartog Island prior to loss of suitable habitat and so have been included as the only bird in the list of DBCA's 'Return to 1616' species.

An exciting and ground-breaking translocation occurred in 2022, with 85 Western Grasswren captured from Hamelin and Peron, and released into carefully chosen locations on Dirk Hartog. Without knowing the careful science behind this, one could be excused for thinking that's a large number and worry what effect it might have on the mainland populations.

As with all of the translocations, post-monitoring is conducted on the source populations, as well as on the new arrivals. There is good news on both fronts.

Some 9 months are the translocation, banded individuals have been captured on camera and heard by researchers on the island, and of course that monitoring will continue. Equally important, monitoring of all the source sites on Hamelin and Peron was undertaken in August 2023.

Observers visited capture sites and known 'control' family sites, recording whether Grasswrens were present within 100m of the GPS point during a 10-15 minute walk. Obviously, observers had to be able to hear the contact calls, the longer duration songs, or even better, catch glimpse of the birds themselves. Return to 1616 fauna team members Kelly Raynor, and Aline Gibson Vega, led the monitoring, ably assisted by Malgana and local DBCA personnel, Bush Heritage Hamelin staff, and volunteers.

The results- monitoring detected an occupation at 76% for Hamelin and 79% of Francois Peron National Park known Western Grasswren territories. These results are comparable to what was detected pre-harvest across the board. There seems to have been minimal adverse effect on the source populations, and equally important, the populations on the mainland seem to be stable, with estimates ranging from 2000 upwards.

For those with good hearing, a visit to Dirk Hartog may be rewarded with the sound of Grasswren song!

If you call the Shark Bay Health Centre after hours you will be transferred through to Health Direct where a Registered Nurse will ask you a number of questions to determine whether you need further emergency assessment by the Shark Bay nurse. If you require further assessment, your call will be put through to the local nurse.

Examples of an EMERGENCY include:

- Breathing difficulties
- Chest pain
- Severe abdominal pain
- Bleeding that can't be controlled with first aid
- Convulsions and fits
- Deep lacerations
- Eye or ear injuries
- Uncontrolled high fever
- Loss of consciousness
- Pregnancy bleeding or onset of labour
- A very sick child


intervention could potentially avoid placing our volunteer members in harms way through contact with organised crime syndicates.

As summer approaches, nbn is urging communities to prepare for a potential loss of nbn services during an emergency event and test their residential evacuation and business continuity plans. While the nbn® network is built and designed to be as resilient as possible, it's important to remember that the majority of outages on the nbn® network during emergencies are caused by power outages. That is why it is important for households and business to prepare in case of disrupted connectivity. nbn is urging the community to prepare by taking four simple steps:

1. **Stay mobile**: Keep a charged mobile phone and portable mobile battery pack ready to use in a power outage, or if your nbn® connection is disrupted in an emergency event. Consider turning off cellular data on unnecessary apps to save battery.

2. **Stay updated**: Local radio is a good source of information during an emergency, so include a battery powered radio in your emergency communications kit. Also follow emergency services, including your state Fire and Rescue and Police Services, as well as utility companies and nbn (@NBN_Australia) on social media for updates.

3. **Back up**: To make sure you can access important information and essential documents from anywhere, including insurance policies and financial documents, consider creating a digital back up on a USB or in the cloud.

4. **Be Prepared**: Test residential evacuation and business continuity plans, including considering investing in alternative communication and power options to keep your business or community group operating – these need to be tried and tested regularly as part of your Business Continuity Plans.

The latest Marine Rescue vessel Neptune from the Two Rocks unit was on display for attendees to inspect and check out its impressive latest technology and build design.




The weekend as a whole was very





Consumer Watch

Scammers target seniors with fake WA Seniors Card website

- Scammers stealing money and ID from seniors
- WA Seniors Card membership is free of charge and only available via www.seniorscard.wa.gov.au
- Contact ID Care immediately if you gave out your ID or your bank if you paid a fee

Western Australian seniors are being targeted by scammers through a fake WA Seniors Card website requesting money and multiple forms of personal identification.

The fake website seniorsportal.au claims to be "officially approved" and charges WA Seniors Card applicants a fee of \$29.

The WA Seniors Card is free of charge and applicants are never requested to pay a fee, or disclose personal identification such as bank or credit card details in exchange for membership. WA Seniors Card does not accept Seniors Card applications made by third party organisations.

Commissioner for Consumer Protection Trish Blake is concerned for seniors that have been targeted by these cyber criminals and handed over their personal identification such as bank details, driver's licence and passport.

"If you have provided any form of ID to this fake website, make sure to contact ID Care on 1800 595 160 or visit their website www.idcare.org," Ms Blake said.

"If you have already made a payment to this fake website, contact your financial institution and report that it is a fraudulent transaction.

"There is only one website where a WA Seniors Card is available. Only use www.seniorscard.wa.gov.au to get your card or visit WA Seniors Card in person at Level 2, 140 William Street, Perth 6000.

"Remember, any time you are looking for a WA Government service online, always make sure the website address ends in a ...wa.gov.au to confirm it is legitimate. Be aware that the first listing on an internet search may not be a legitimate website and not the service provider you are searching for."

Don't get caught in a subscription trap

Whether it's a gym, streaming service, or dating site you're signed up to, it can be tricky keeping track of how much money is leaving your bank account each month to pay for subscriptions and memberships.

These small, but regular, costs can soon add up and contribute to cost of living pressures, so it can be worthwhile taking the time to see which services are worth keeping and which ones aren't.

In the past 12 months, almost 300 consumers have come to Consumer Protection with complaints about subscriptions and memberships – nearly a third of which involved issues cancelling fitness services.



Under WA's Fitness Code, consumers are allowed to cancel their fitness service electronically, with direct debits to stop once the last payment due under the contract has been paid. Prior to the end of the initial term of an agreement, fitness providers must also notify consumers before automatically renewing their memberships, thus giving them the opportunity to cancel without penalty.

Subscriptions traps are one of the many so-called 'dark patterns' that may be deceiving consumers online by tricking them into parting with more money than they intended to.

A subscription trap may occur when an online retailer or service provider treats a single purchase or free trial as consent to sign consumers up to a paid subscription without adequately disclosing that ongoing fees are involved. Deceptive design patterns are often built into the interface, such as pre-ticked checkboxes, trick questions and redirection.

To avoid getting caught in a subscription trap, make sure you've read and understand the terms and conditions before signing up to see whether any ongoing fees are involved.

If you sign up for a free trial with the intention of cancelling the subscription before the billing date, it can be helpful to set yourself a calendar reminder.

When reviewing existing memberships and subscription services, look through your bank statements to see what you're paying for, then think about which services you use and check whether there's a better deal, cheaper plan or lowcost alternative. Cancel any subscriptions or memberships you're not using or getting value from.

Country Stargazing



October is a great month to be out under the stars! Jupiter and the Moon appear together, there's a meteor shower plus Halloween to celebrate!

A great time to see Jupiter is after 9.30pm on the 2nd October. Jupiter will rise in the north east with the almost full moon rising below it just 10 minutes later. The pair will be bright and stunning!

This year the Orionids Meteor Shower will have almost perfect viewing conditions. Stargazers can expect to see up to 20 meteors per hour. The Orionids Meteor Shower is generated from Halley's Comet and peaks on the night

of the 21st/22nd of October but can be viewed several days either side of the peak. The best views will be after 1am when the quarter Moon has set and the sky gets darker.



When to look: From midnight/1am to early morning, 21st/22nd October

Which direction to look: Toward the northern horizon.

Will you be trick or treating this Halloween? If you are, from sunset onwards keep an eye out for the gas giants! Jupiter will rise in the northeast, appearing as a bright star. Saturn will be overhead, as a slightly dimmer looking bright star. Happy stargazing!

Living with History -Army Life

After returning from leave in early 1945,togetherwithaboutonehundred volunteers from various units, I was sent to the Atherton Tablelands in Queensland. We were to receive



basic paratroop training, and besides physical fitness, we were all required to be experienced in jungle operations. As usual, the army was short of equipment. Most of the training consisted of jumping off twenty five foot towers with full pack and weapons. Although there were plenty of base wallahs swaggering around Brisbane in highly polished, calf length, American style, paratroop boots, we could not get them. As the ordinary army boot did not give enough support, there were a high percentage of broken and sprained ankles.

There were two DC3's from which most of us managed to get at least one practice jump. The instructors never had any trouble getting anyone to bail out. It seemed a lot safer outside those old planes than in them!

After four weeks of pretty strenuous training, without any explanations, we were all returned to our units. Sometime later we were told that the original plan was to drop us into Borneo to free Australian prisoners held there by the Japanese. The plan had a fair chance of success as at that stage of the war, Japanese forces in that area were spread pretty thin and were low in moral and condition.

The reason the plan was abandoned, was that MacArthur, the supreme Commander in the Pacific, refused to release the necessary planes. All his resources were concentrated on his much publicised return to the Philippines. Australian forces were relegated to so called mopping up operations. Because of this decision, several thousand Australians died of disease, starvation or were murdered.


