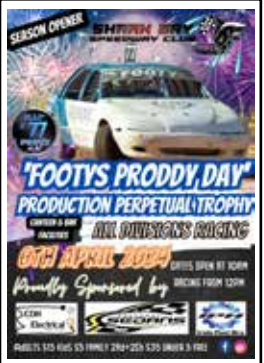

Jila Kujarra: Two Snakes Dreaming is a cross-cultural collaboration between Warnman artist Desmond Taylor and Boorloo-based textiles practitioner Mariaan Pugh, commissioned by Fremantle Arts Centre in partnership with Martumili Artists.

Taylor and Pugh have worked together to transform Taylor's *Niminjarra* paintings, usually seen on canvas or paper, into highly tactile textile works, animating the important *Niminjarra Jukurrpa* (Dreaming).

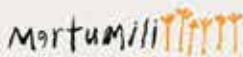
“ *Niminjarra* is the two brothers transforming into a snake so they can come back home to *Ngayartakujarra* (Lake Dora). They were in training for ceremony, those two brothers, but they were kept too long, and nobody was there to release them. They waited then they decided to transform into snakes to travel back to where they came from, because their mother was waiting for them.

The Shire of Shark Bay is located in the Shark Bay World Heritage Area which is one of three World Heritage areas within WA. Located approximately 830 kilometres north of Perth, Shark Bay is a wonderland of world-class natural attractions, the clear turquoise waters are ablaze with multi-coloured sea life and stretching beyond the white sandy beaches are spectacular rust-red sand dunes.

The Shire is seeking a Revenue and Administration Officer to provide financial services including invoicing, accounts receivable, bank reconciliations, and other office tasks as required. A position description can be found on Council's website www.sharkbay.wa.gov.au.

The ideal applicant will need to demonstrate relevant experience in the accounting functions of accounts receivable, and bank reconciliations. Strong interpersonal and communication skills with the ability to work autonomously and as part of a team is essential. This role requires high skill competency in Microsoft Word and Excel. The Crew in Blue

With the holidays approaching we would like to remind you all that we need to make it 'tougher for crooks', we continue to see valuables in unlocked cars. Please don't leave valuables in cars, keep a close eye on your belongings, always secure windows and doors of your car and home, even if you are on holidays and just visiting. Together we can prevent some crimes before they happen. Visit www.police.wa.gov.au/TougherForCrooks for more tips.

We have noticed an increase in the use/misuse of eRideables. To assist, an eRideable is an electric rideable device that:

- has at least one wheel
- is designed for one person
- doesn't go faster than 25km/h on level ground
- weighs 25kg or less
- is no more than 125cm long, 70cm wide and 135cm high.

Examples include eScooters, eSkateboards, hoverboards, eSkates, and eUnicycles.

Other devices such as mobility scooters, motorised wheelchairs, or low-powered motorised scooters for children are not considered eRideables and are covered by their own rules. For more detail on the difference between eRideables, motorised scooters, and other similar devices.

eRideables Rules and Safety



- **Only people aged sixteen and over are allowed to use eRideables.**
- eRideables are a type of vehicle, so all road laws that apply to vehicles apply to eRideables as well unless expressly excluded. Read on to find out what rules are specific to eRideables and how you can ride safely.
- **Keep to the speed limit.** On footpaths and pedestrian crossings, this is 10km/h. On and bicycle paths, shared paths and local roads eRideables can be ridden up to 25km/h where safe.
- **One person per device.** Never carry passengers or animals on your eRideable.
- **Wear a helmet.** Any approved bicycle, skateboard or motorcycle helmet can be worn when riding an eRideable.
- **Hands on the wheel, not on your phone.** Always have at least one hand on the handlebars (if fitted). Don't be distracted by your mobile phone – the same rules apply to eRideables as to bikes, motorcycles and cars.
- **Don't drink and ride.** eRiders must maintain proper control of their eRideable device at all times and are subject to the same drink and drug driving laws as car drivers.

If you are travelling in your vehicle during this period, remember to make your journey as safe as possible by

making preparations before you leave, including the safety check of the vehicle, planning your route, including frequent stops to reduce fatigue, drive within the speed limit and conditions of the road, overtake safely, follow at a safe distance and most importantly be patient with other road users. There is a larger number of vehicles on the road at this time, increasing your risk, so please take the appropriate care and drive safe.

Sustainability

Shark Bay School is increasingly trying to embed sustainability into our actions and our educational programs. This includes both environmental and social sustainability. Teacher Leadership

This year we have ensured that all staff members have opportunities for professional development and leadership. This term several teachers have commenced development in either Teachwell, a series of teaching 'masterclasses' across our region, and some specific guided planning with the regional School Psychology and behavioural support teams for students with special learning needs. At school, teachers have adopted specific leadership roles in support of each other, including Student Services, STEM education, Teaching Quality, and sharing individual teaching passions such as Science, HaSS and Sport.

Data Analysis to Support Student Progress and Achievement

Students at Shark Bay School undertake tests to assist teachers in identifying their learning needs. These include OnEntry, NAPLAN and Progressive Achievement (PAT). We will be starting to use a program called Elastik which enables teachers to see compiled data from these tests for each student in their class and more quickly identify any gaps in knowledge. We plan to trial this this year for students from Pre Primary to Year 10. No additional testing is involved. The Elastik software has been assessed and approved by the Department of Education and the linked data are stored within Australia. Schools in our Desert Coast network have already been trialling Elastik and finding benefits for teachers in meeting their own students' learning needs. The individual data do not go to other teachers or beyond our school.

Healthy Apple Crumble Recipe

Ingredients

- 2 apples, chopped
- 50 g margarine
- 1/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar (or regular sugar)
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1/4 cup plain flour
- 1 cup rolled oats

Method

1. Preheat oven to 200°C (180°C fan forced).
2. Place the apple pieces in a small baking dish.
3. Cook apples on HIGH in microwave for 5 minutes or until soft.
4. In small bowl, combine the remaining ingredients.
5. Mix with fingertips until it has an even crumb texture.
6. Top the apple with the crumb mixture and bake in the oven for 20 minutes or until the crumble is golden brown.

Shark Bay State Emergency Service Unit

In partnership with volunteers from the local Fire Brigade our units have been participating in Manage Injuries training which will be held over several weeks/months at our regular training sessions to obtain unit competency. The Department of Fire & Emergency Services training delves deeper past St Johns first aid training including recording and monitoring a patients vital statistics (including pulse, blood pressure and respiration rates) as often it may be SES or Fire Brigade personnel first on seen.

As this hands on training covers both Fire Brigade and SES volunteers, the course included learning several techniques of extracting a spinal patient from a vehicle after a crash as well as the use of spinal boards and collars. Some of the techniques we learnt included teaching smaller volunteers practices that they can use to move larger patients.

Consumer Watch

Don't let the thrill of a bargain hunt cloud your judgement

Facebook Marketplace, Gumtree, eBay, garage sales and even swap meets can be brimming with a treasure trove of bargains. However, a bargain you buy today could cost you tomorrow.

Buying items through private sellers requires caution to avoid potential issues that may not be covered by Australian Consumer Law (ACL). When you buy goods privately there is a risk they may not work as they should or may not match the advert or description. You won't be protected by the law. While you may forgo many of your rights protected under the ACL for items purchased privately, you are entitled to undisturbed possession and an item free from debt, unless you are clearly told otherwise. If there is money owing on the item, you could become liable for this debt.

If you are buying a vehicle, caravan, camper trailer or boat it is advisable to spend \$2 and complete a Personal Property Securities Register (PPSR) check if see if there are outstanding debts.

When it comes to privately purchased used vehicles, you are not protected by a statutory warranty or consumer guarantees. However, the car may still be covered by a manufacturer's or extended warranty. In this case, ask the seller to transfer any remaining warranty into your name. So how about that vintage dress you want to buy off eBay or the latest iPhone you've seen on Facebook Marketplace at a steal?

Consumer Protection advises checking the profile of the seller to see what previous buyers have said and watch out for a too-good-to-be-true price for a high ticket item. Would someone really be selling the latest iPhone for \$300?

There are also safety issues to consider. If you are planning a face-to-face purchase, we advise you meet in a public place to view the item if possible. It's also a good idea to bring along another person.

If something is wrong with the item after you've paid for it, the first step should be to contact the seller to negotiate a solution. Buyer beware - they are under no obligation to negotiate with you.

If the seller won't negotiate, there are a couple of options left. For PayPal payments, file a dispute with their resolution centre within 180 days. For cash or bank transfer payments, it can be very difficult to track down your money. Although Consumer Protection cannot resolve disputes arising from private sales, we can provide you with further advice. For more information, contact us on 1300 30 40 54.

The Southern Cross Constellation

International Dark Sky Week is from 2nd-8th April (<https://idsw.darksky.org/>) and it's a great time to view the famous Australian constellation, the Southern Cross. You can track it over mid-autumn and winter evenings.

When you head outside to stargaze, what you will notice first are two bright stars on a diagonal. The brighter of the two, Alpha Centauri, is closer to the horizon. Together, the two stars are commonly known as the "Pointers". That's because they seem to point towards the Southern Cross.

The Southern Cross is above and a little to the left of the Pointers. It looks like a diamond on its side and is made up of five stars. Four make up the cross shape and there is one dimmer star between the two stars on the longest edge of the diamond.

When and where to look: 7:30pm, from April. Look to the south east.

Morning Planets

This month also features conjunctions, Mercury, Venus, Mars and Saturn! A conjunction is where two astronomical objects, like planets, appear close together in the sky. Below are some of the highlights. If you watch regularly, you'll be marvelling at the motion of our amazing solar system.

When and where to look: Look towards the eastern horizon at 6am:

- 7th April: Venus is low to the horizon. Above is the beautiful waning crescent Moon and higher again is Saturn and Mars, all in line with each other!
- 11th April: Mars and Saturn are just 0.4 degrees apart. Over following mornings, watch as Saturn and Mars appear to drift apart.
- 19th April: Bright Venus conjunction with Mercury. You'll need a very good line of sight to the eastern horizon. It's only about 30 minutes before the sun rises, but you should be able to spot the two planets, Venus brighter than Mercury which is just below to the left.

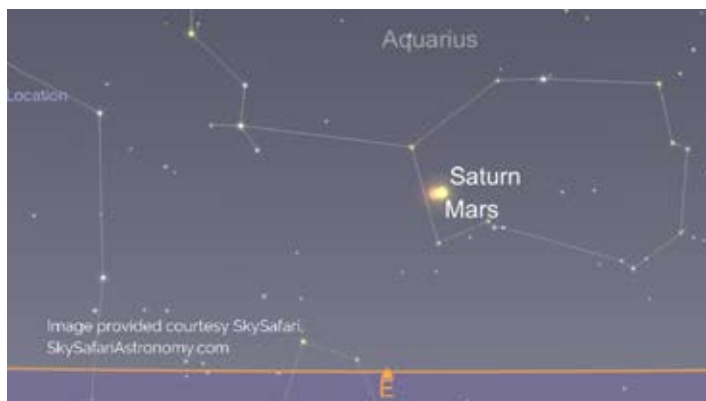

That was one country cop with no sense of humour at all.
