The Shire of Shark Bay is located in the Shark Bay World Heritage Area which is one of three World Heritage areas within WA. Located approximately 830 kilometres north of Perth, Shark Bay is a wonderland of world-class natural attractions, the clear turquoise waters are ablaze with multi-coloured sea life and stretching beyond the white sandy beaches are spectacular rust-red sand dunes.

The Shire is seeking a Revenue and Administration Officer to provide financial services including invoicing, accounts receivable, bank reconciliations, and other office tasks as required. A position description can be found on Council's website www.sharkbay.wa.gov.au.

The ideal applicant will need to demonstrate relevant experience in the accounting functions of accounts receivable, and bank reconciliations. ## Nearly \$26 million in improvements for WA tourism infrastructure

Nearly \$26 million will be invested by the Cook Labor Government to upgrade and improve key tourism sites across Western Australia.

- Iconic tourism sites throughout Western Australia to share in \$25.9 million of upgrades
- Rottnest Island, Cape to Cape Track and Karijini National Park to benefit
- Improvements to ensure sites remain world-class, attract interstate and overseas tourists, and support local businesses and operators

Nearly \$26 million will be invested by the Cook Labor Government to upgrade and improve key tourism sites across Western Australia.

As part of the recent 2023-24 Mid-Year Review, \$25.9 million was allocated to the following tourism attractions:

- additional \$10.7 million to enhance safe and ongoing access to Rottnest Island, under the Rottnest Island Main Jetty refurbishment and upgrade project;
- additional \$5.2 million to deliver improved facilities at Karijini National Park including sealed road and car park access to the most popular gorge and visitor sites;
- \$4.6 million for the replacement of the Hamelin Pool boardwalk in the Shark Bay World Heritage Area;
- \$2.7 million to undertake repairs and upgrades to the Cape to Cape track in the South West region, including updates to signage; and
- \$2.7 million to improve access to the Wellington National Park and pedestrian access to the Wellington Dam Mural.
- This investment will help to ensure these sites remain world-class and continue to attract tourists, while also supporting the local tourism sector.

Western Australia has had a booming year in tourism, with close to 2.4 million people from interstate and overseas visiting in the year ending September 2023. Of these, more than a third visited the Kimberley, Gascoyne or South West region. Rottnest Island also had a record-breaking year, with nearly 730,000 visitors to the island in 2022-23 by ferry.

### **Comments attributed to Tourism Minister Rita Saffioti:**

"Attractions and infrastructure are a critical part of tourism, and ensuring these facilities and sites remain world-class is so important.

"Places like Rottnest Island and regions like the South West, North West and Coral Coast are already tourism hotspots attracting hundreds of thousands of visitors each year, so we need to make sure they remain fit for purpose.

"Importantly, these improvements will also support our local operators, who rely on good infrastructure to keep attracting visitors."

## Comments attributed to Environment Minister Reece Whitby:

"Western Australia's natural environment is the most diverse of any state or territory in Australia.

"Through our ongoing support for WA's iconic tourism landmarks, the Cook Government is ensuring we look after our State while making it an accessible and appealing destination for local, interstate, and overseas visitors."

# Eggfruit not so Eggsellent!

In a world of Solanaceous garden delights such as capsicums, tomatoes, chillies and eggplants, an unwelcome pest often goes unnoticed until harvest time: *Sceliodes cordalis*, more commonly known as the eggfruit caterpillar. This common garden grub has a craving for plants belonging to the Solanaceae family and can turn your hardearned produce into a feast for their insatiable appetite.

### **Biology and management**

Eggfruit caterpillars begin their journey when the small brown moth lays her tiny, white oval eggs. These eggs are predominantly laid on the stem or calyx of the developing fruit. They hatch tiny white ravenous caterpillars, which bore into the fruit through the stem or calyx. This disguises their entry point. Munching and pooing their way through the inside of the fruit, the caterpillars often turn bright pink or red in colour as they mature. Eggfruit caterpillars are particularly hard to detect as there's rarely any external signs of infestation of the fruit. These gluttonous grubs eventually chew their way out of the fruit to pupate, and later emerge as adult moths.

Controlling this pest can be challenging and requires well-timed management during all life stages. Make sure to remove any weeds from the Solanaceous family (e.g., nightshade) to reduce

their breeding sources in the garden. Moths and eggs can be controlled using light traps, or by spraying insecticidal soap on the calyx. These soaps can affect the delicate wings of the adult moth, making it too slippery for her eggs to stick to the calyx, and may also desiccate the eggs. As freshly hatched caterpillars, there is a very short window for control before they enter the fruit. Target the stems and calyx with caterpillar control products. Look for ingredients such as spinosad or the biological control 'BT' (Bacillus thruigiensis). These insecticides become virtually ineffective once the caterpillars burrow into the fruit, as they are well-protected inside. If infested fruit is found, remove and discard to break their lifecycle.

### Report your capsicum criminals!

Although eggfruit caterpillars are a well-established species, it's the small white caterpillars that may be confused with the larvae of the non-established and reportable Queensland fruit fly (Qfly). Qfly is a significant pest of over 300 fruits and vegetables. You can report suspicious larvae in your produce to MyPestGuide or contact the Pest and Disease Information Service by sending in photos of the larvae and cut-open fruits. Report early to keep your Solanaceous garden delights safe from unwelcome feasters!

# BAITING TO PROTECT NATIVE WILDLIFE

Under the Parks and Wildlife Service's *Western Shield* program, baiting to control foxes and feral cats occurs on more than three million hectares of conservation lands in Western Australia.


The baits used are toxic to introduced animals but not to native animals which have an evolved tolerance to the active compound (1080). All baited areas are signposted.

Baiting occurs on a regular and ongoing basis to protect endangered native animals including the numbat, western ground parrot and western swamp tortoise.



Attention pet owners: these baits will kill domestic dogs and cats. Baited areas must be considered dangerous for pet dogs and cats at all times.







### Consumer Watch

### Navigating renting when disaster strikes

West Aussies are no strangers to disasters such as bushfires, storms and floods. But if you're renting, there might be the extra stress of working with your landlord should your residence be affected by a catastrophe.

The good news is when it comes to rentals, both landlords and tenants have rights and responsibilities should a property become damaged or destroyed in a disaster such as a cyclone or bushfire.

If your house has been destroyed or deemed by the Local Government to be unfit to live in, the most practical approach is for the tenant or landlord to give a notice of intention to immediately end the lease. Tenants can give two days' notice, while the landlord must give seven days. Whichever way, a landlord should finalise the tenancy and repay the bond in the normal way, minus any mutually agreed expenses incurred by the landlord. The landlord doesn't have to provide alternative accommodation.

Following damage to a rental home, the landlord is legally responsible for necessary repairs and maintenance to bring the property back to a liveable condition. If a tenant continues to be able to live in the rental, urgent repairs required to essential services such as power, gas, water including supply of hot water, and sewage should be arranged within 24 hours. If any other issues could cause someone harm or undue hardship, or cause further damage then works need to be arranged within 48 hours.

With urgent repairs, if you cannot reach the landlord or if within 24 hours, the landlord fails to act, then you can employ a suitably qualified repairer to fix the issue to the minimum standard. Please be aware that there may be delays - it can be difficult to get tradespeople to your home as many properties may need repair after a disaster.

When services to an entire area have been impaired – such as when power poles burn down or the water supply becomes compromised – it can take the authorities some time to resolve the issues, but the landlord could consider providing a generator, potable water or if not, then a rent rebate for the duration. In these cases, Consumer Protection can assist the parties to reach a mutual agreement.

When it comes to debris, emergency services may already have a cleaning program in place, so contact the local authorities, such as the emergency services for advice.

It's also smart to be wary of travelling conmen or unlicensed traders who can target areas after a disaster going door-to-door, offering cheap cash-only deals.

### How to save over \$1,000 on your fuel bill

We know every dollar counts to Western Australian families right now. I want to share the news that savvy motorists could save more than \$1,200 a year by using the FuelWatch

website to shop around before they fill-up.

Independent retailers dominated the top cheapest outlets across WA in 2023. Selling the cheapest fuel in the Gascoyne region was EG Ampol Carnarvon, with an average ULP price of 195.7 cents per litre (cpl), followed by Dunning's in Morgantown and Kingsford, and Ampol Foodary in Kingsford all with an average price of 195.8 cpl.

For those who travel to Perth, FuelWatch data has also revealed independent retailers Vibe, Atlas Fuel, FastFuel 24/7 and Liberty outlets occupied all spots in the top ten of cheapest non-membership outlets across the Perth metropolitan area.

Costco outlets at Perth Airport and Casuarina topped the cheapest list overall, but an annual membership is required to access these sites.

The overall average ULP price in WA last year was 187.4 cpl and for diesel we saw an average of 203.3 cpl. When it comes to diesel, we found country areas often pay less than Perth motorists due to competition. But it's always worth shopping around by using the FuelWatch service.

Long gone are the days of not knowing if the cheap fuel you saw on the way to work will be the same price on the way home. The '24-Hour-Rule', established over 20 years ago, means retailers must tell Consumer Protection by 2pm each day what their fuel price will be for the following day. They must keep that price unchanged for 24 hours from 6am the following day making FuelWatch the only service in Australia that gives you the opportunity to access tomorrow's fuel prices today.

When FuelWatch was introduced in 2001, it also required WA regional fuel retailers to display their prices on visible price boards. This is another way FuelWatch continues to help WA motorists by making sure there are no surprises when they get to the bowser.

We are currently in a weekly petrol price cycle, with Tuesday being the cheapest day to fill up but there are always bargains to be found. It's worth noting, diesel does not follow a price cycle.

It takes less than 30 seconds to check out the FuelWatch website at www.fuelwatch.wa.gov.au to find the best deal near you, it's also worth considering signing up for personalised alerts or you can access FuelWatch through the State Government's ServiceWA app.

If you needed it and he had it to give, it was yours.



# **Country Stargazing**



### **February Conjunctions & Occultations**

Just as our daylight skies are ever-changing, with new sunsets and shifting cloud formations, our evening skies are constantly changing too, with the Moon, stars and planets providing a smorgasbord of stunning views. During their orbits we see lunar occultations (when the Moon, appears to move in front of another, blocking it from view) and conjunctions (when two astronomical objects, likes planets, appear close together in the sky). And let's not forget the spectacle of meteor showers, there's plenty to see in our night skies!

The Alpha Centaurids meteor shower returns to WA's night skies from 28<sup>th</sup> January – 21<sup>st</sup> February, peaking around 8th February. This year's Alpha Centaurids are forecast to produce about 6 meteors per hour. With the shower reaching its highest point after dawn, your best viewing will be in the hours up to around 4am.

When and where to look: Early morning, 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> February in the south-eastern sky.

On 15<sup>th</sup> February, the moon is a beautiful waxing crescent — and it's visible in conjunction with the king of the planets, Jupiter, all evening. This conjunction is a good one for nakedeye stargazing or viewing with binoculars. You'll be able to follow the conjunction until the moon sets at 10:29pm and Jupiter follows a few minutes behind.

When and where to look: 7:40pm, 15th February in the northwestern sky.

Pop these dates into your cosmic diary and have a star-filled 2024!


