

GET ONLINE WEEK

2.5 million people are currently not online in Australia, and 4 million people have limited digital skills.

Get Online Week began in 2007 in the UK as an initiative to bring digital inclusion to national attention. Since then the campaign has grown into a week-long annual celebration, with thousands of events taking place each year, bringing digital skills and know-how to everyone.

Good Things Foundation brought Get Online Week to Australia for the first time during 2018 and has offered grant funding again for organisations to host activities from the 14th-20th October 2019.

Over 750 events were held across Australia in 2018, helping people with limited digital skills make the most of the internet. We worked together with commercial partners, stakeholders in government and community organisations to reach out and encourage people to get involved and #try1thing new online.

The Shark Bay CRC has been successful in receiving \$1,500 worth of funding to hold an event, so we will release more details closer to the date!

BE CONNECTED

Did you know that the Shark Bay CRC receives funding from the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development to provide one on one training for community capacity building here in our community? This includes assisting you with your technology queries (iPads, phones etc). Our staff recently held a free group training session for the over 50's in our community and assisted participants with their list of queries regards utilising their iPads. 4 people attended and are now able to:

- create photo albums (especially a grandkids album)
- add folders in their emails and file each email
- backup their devices apps and data to their iCloud
- save images from an email and add them to specific photo albums

If you have any questions, regardless of how silly you might think they are, or would like to learn a little bit more about something on your iPad, phone, laptop etc, please ask us at the CRC to assist. If we are unsure, we have ways and means of finding quick answers (such as the younger generation who are masters of technology as well as good old-fashioned Google answers).


Welcome

invite you to accept the invitation and follow the prompts to join the system.

Class Dojo enables us to post small news items, photos and videos to the entire community of parents/carers or to individual classes so that families can have an insight into student learning and activities. We can also



send messages, such as reminders about library books, to a whole class, or to individual parents. Parents can send a message to the class teacher to let them know about something like a lost hat. Important or sensitive information would not be shared in this way and we would always arrange to meet or speak with parents in the usual way.

School Councillors

Student leaders for the term from will be elected from among the senior primary students on Friday 24th July. Seth, Josh, Beau, Esther, Ella and Matilda are all standing and have prepared speeches outlining their commitment to the school values in their own way. What came through strongly from all of them was their sincere

Volunteer Marine Rescue

Things have been relatively quiet for Shark Bay Volunteer Marine Rescue Service since our last article in the June edition of the Inscription Post. We have done three recovery tow jobs and responded to one epirb activation and flare sighting.

One of the jobs was a simple tow back to town from Bar Flats. A second job was a nighttime tow of a vessel that had run out of fuel. He had departed from Nanga Bay Resort for a days fishing with his wife and two grandchildren but had run out of fuel about seven nautical miles out on the return voyage. He was towed as close as the rescue vessel could safely get to the beach in the dark at Nanga with a very low tide and allowed to drift in to where he could anchor.

The skipper of a large motor vessel called for help when his anchor wouldn't hold in a strong wind and he was drifting through the mooring area. Tamala Rose went to his aid and dropped one of our local policemen and a fisheries officer on board to help the lone sailor. His anchor winch couldn't pull the two anchors up as their chains had become tangled, so it was a case of getting them up by hand before he could be towed to a secure mooring.

An epirb activation and flare sighting off Bottle Bay turned out to be not such an emergency when the two young men in their broken-down dinghy managed to row themselves ashore using an eski lid and a floorboard.

Tamala Rose and the Fisheries vessel were heading to the scene at forty knots until a DBCA Ranger on the shore radioed in that he had the men in sight, and they were going to make it safely back to land. A good example of several agencies working together to achieve a positive outcome.

Five of our members have recently completed their radio operators course and exams, and six people attended a navigation course held over two evenings with a DFES trainer who drove up from Mandurah.

Your local Shark Bay VMR Service has been listed as finalists, alongside Albany and Esperance, in the "Outstanding Group Achievement" category of the annual DFES awards. The nomination was submitted by our District Manager Simon Miller for the successful rescue mission in May of a man and his two young sons from their sunken vessel near Steep Point. Winners are to be announced at the State Conference in September.

Your local Marine Rescue Service Volunteers really do make a difference to peoples lives. We would love to hear from you if you would like to get involved. New members are always welcome. Call 9948 1376 anytime and ask for a nomination form.

Games 4 Toddlers - Toddlers love to explore - here are some fun and easy ways to play with your little one. Spending time together makes your child feel special.

Card Board Boxes - are great toys. They can be taped together, painted and decorated to become cars, towers and tunnels. Cut (or draw) windows and a door into a large box to make a house.

Sand and water play - Toddlers love to play in sand and water. Give them some plastic containers llike mugs, buckets, spades and a funnel with a trav of water or sand. Never leave a child alone with water.

Making music - Toddlers can have lots of fun with home made instruments. Fill a tin or plastic container with rice or stones and shake. Nail bottle tops to a stick that you can rattle.Put paper over the top of a tin to make a drum. Make clapping sticks from pieces of wood. Play some music and get up and dance with your toddler.

Painting - Paint with fingers, brushes, sponges, toothbrushes, onto just about anything - paper, cloth, newspaper, wood, paper bags and plates, bark. Children also like to paint with water - give them a brush and let them paint the outside doors, fences, windows and walls.

Sorting - Toddlers love to sort things into different groups. Try using coloured pegs, stones, shells, pasta, big buttons or food. Sort the pegs by colour, shells by size, buttons by shape or whatever way you decide. Pasta, shells and buttons can also be threaded onto string to make necklaces.

Carnarvon lifts off with a blast at Apollo 11 50th Anniversary celebrations

Putting man on the moon was made possible thanks to the instrumental role Carnarvon played in early space exploration, when it hosted the world's largest tracking station outside of the U.S.

The town of Carnarvon was a buzz last weekend with past Trackers and people connected with the NASA Carnarvon Tracking Station returning to reunite at a cocktail party held at the Carnarvon Space and Technology Museum to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the Apollo 11 mission, and the achievements of those that worked at the station.

Former Trackers spent time reminiscing, sharing stories and returning to where they lived and socialised, while reconnecting with a community they were once very much a part of and helped shape.

Member for North West Central Vince Catania said "for too long the importance of the contribution made by the NASA Carnarvon Tracking Station has flown under the radar, with many people unaware the historical landing may not have happened had it not been for the pivotal role the Trackers in Carnarvon played."

"The Carnarvon Space and Technology Museum, next to the iconic Dish, has been developed and run entirely by dedicated hard-working volunteers over many years, with great support from the Carnarvon Community, to ensure the story is understood and etched in history."

"An important tourism icon for the town, the State and Australia, the Museum tells the space race story and recognises how vital the site and Trackers were in the success of this mission into space."

"It's a credit to everyone involved, including Phil Youd, an instrumental driver of the project, insisting this important history be preserved and shared for generations to come," said Vince.

"Congratulations must go to everyone involved in the evolution of the Carnarvon Space and Technology Museum and the Apollo 11 50th Anniversary celebrations, recognising the extent of what happen both in Carnarvon and the World fifty years ago – landing on the moon," said Vince.

Elvis has left the building It might surprise you that over 50 years have passed since Elvis Presley, the widely acclaimed & loved King of Rock & Roll, left this world. It was on the 16th August 1977 that he died in catastrophic circumstances, after a massive battle with drugs, food, and that most perilous of all ills – boredom. An experienced showman once said, being famous is the worst thing that can ever happen to someone.

Elvis inspired a whole generation to take up the guitar and sing sweet soulful melodies about love. His influence was seen in many Hollywood movies and his imprint in millions of vinyl recordings, in the yearnings of girls the world over when they saw him flexing his hips and pulsating his lips. The legend of Elvis Presley is quite incredible, and lives on in pop culture all over the world.

It might surprise you even more to know that this flamboyant entertainer was a born-again Christian. Many have found that hard to believe in the face of the extravagant self-indulgent life-style associated with megastardom.

In the spring of 1956, Elvis Presley's career as a rock 'n' roll singer was beginning to explode across the country. When reporters began digging into the past of this 'unknown' performer, they discovered a Christian background that was hard to reconcile with his sexy stage image. Raised in the Assemblies of God, Elvis during his professional career admitted to having a complex relationship with God. Many clergymen felt compelled to preach the danger of Presley and rock & roll. I remember that myself as a teenager. He himself, though, continued to assert that there was no inconsistency in a religious young man performing rock & roll music.



Who could listen to his rendition of Gospel songs like 'Amazing Grace', 'He Touched Me' and 'The Wonder of You' without thinking it was more than just a song he was singing? His wife Priscilla stated in a documentary that 'The Wonder of You' was sung specifically to the Lord Jesus Christ.

A good friend and backing singer of his, Donnie Sumner, himself a Christian, tells of how one day Elvis asked him what 'being born again' and 'saved' meant. Surprised, he responded, "Well, the way I understand it, if you believe the story that Jesus came as they say He did and that He died for sins the way they say He did and He rose from the dead, went back to Heaven and that He's coming again some day; if you really believe all of that and discount any other way to get right with God, then you are saved". Elvis, in that laid back way he had, looked straight at him and said; "Well, what happens then?" "Then your life changes, and you put Christ at the centre of everything you do."

On one occasion when a fan held up a banner proclaiming 'Elvis is King', he paused as he was singing, looked across the audience and with that charming smirk on his face, said for all to hear, 'there's only one King honey, and he is Jesus Christ'. Long live the King.





This project is coming at a huge cost so we are still looking for more support. We are sitting at 35 sponsors but need to get that number up over 60 to complete the next section.



Workers' compensation essentials

Employer fact sheet



WorkCover WA is the government agency responsible for administering the Workers' Compensation and Injury Management Act 1981 (the Act). All employers in Western Australia are required to have workers' compensation insurance coverage for anyone defined as a 'worker' under the Act.

What is workers' compensation?

Workers' compensation is financial compensation provided to workers who become injured or exposed to diseases during the course of their employment.

Workers' compensation can include:

- weekly payments to cover loss of earnings
- medical and related expenses
- certain travel expenses
- lump sum payments in case of permanent impairment and/or permanent incapacity for
- workplace rehabilitation assistance.

Any worker who suffers a work-related injury or disease requiring medical treatment or time off work is entitled to claim workers' compensation.

Why do I need workers' compensation insurance?

Workers' compensation insurance is mandatory and protects your business from the financial cost of a workers' compensation and common law claim.

If you don't have workers' compensation insurance, you can be fined up to \$5,000 per worker you employ while uninsured, plus you will need to pay any avoided premium and court costs.

Additionally, if an injured worker makes a claim while you are uninsured, you will be responsible for all costs associated with the claim. Workers' compensation and common law claims can cost in excess of \$1,000,000 so it's simply not worth the risk.

Who do I need to cover?

It is mandatory to have workers' compensation insurance for anyone you employ who is defined as a 'worker' under the Act. This includes:

- full-time workers on a wage or salary
- part-time, casual and seasonal workers
- workers on commission
- family members
- piece workers
- working directors (optional)
- payment in kind.

A contractor or sub-contractor may also be defined as a 'worker' if they are engaged to do work for the purpose of your trade or business and they are paid in substance for their personal manual labour or services. For more information refer to the publication A technical note on contractors and workers' compensation or watch our educational videos under the 'Resources' section of the WorkCover WA website.

How do I get an insurance policy?

You can contact an insurer to obtain a premium quote for your business. A list of approved insurers is available on the WorkCover WA website at

www.workcover.wa.gov.au/service-providers/insurers/.

Alternatively, you can use the services of an insurance broker who will negotiate with an insurer on your behalf.

Your insurance premium will vary depending on:

- the number of workers you employ
- the amount of wages paid to your workers
- the industry in which you operate
- your claims history and risk factors.

The claims process

The following steps must be taken following a workplace injury:

- 1. Apply first aid to the injured worker and report the injury in your incident reporting system.
- 2. Get the worker to see a doctor of their choice as soon as possible.
- 3. Ask the worker to obtain a First Certificate of Capacity from their treating doctor.
- 4. Provide the worker with a Workers' **Compensation Claim Form and ask** them to complete the worker's section.
- 5. Obtain the completed Claim Form and First Certificate of Capacity from the injured worker.

All received claim forms **must** be forwarded on to your insurer.

You can be fined \$1,000 if you fail to submit a claim to your insurer within **five days**.

- 6. Complete the employer's section of the Claim Form.
- 7. Take copies of both documents for your own and your worker's records.
- 8. Submit the First Certificate of Capacity and Claim Form to your insurer within five days.

You can be fined \$1,000 if you fail to submit the documents to your insurer in time.

9. Your insurer is required to advise you and the injured worker within 14 days if the claim has been accepted, disputed or pended.

Waiting for a decision

An injured worker is responsible for covering the costs of medical treatment for their injury until a decision on liability is made by the insurer. It's important the worker keeps receipts during this time. If the claim is accepted, the costs will be reimbursed by the insurer.

While awaiting a decision on a claim, you may consider paying accrued leave, such as annual or sick leave, to an injured worker. It's important you seek the worker's agreement before taking this action.

If a claim is accepted, any sick leave must be credited back to the worker. Enquiries about annual leave can be referred to the Fair Work Ombudsman on 13 13 94.

Claim outcomes

Your insurer is required to advise you and the injured worker within 14 days if a claim has been accepted, disputed or pended.

Accepted

If a claim is accepted by the insurer, the worker's compensation entitlements will commence.

Disputed

If a claim is disputed, no compensation will be paid and the insurer will advise you and the worker of the reason.

If the worker disagrees with the insurer's decision, they can lodge an application with WorkCover WA's Conciliation and Arbitration Services.

Decision pended

If a claim is pended, this usually means the insurer needs more information to make a decision.

The insurer has a further 10 days to decide whether to accept or dispute liability.

If no decision is made after this time, the claim is said to be 'in dispute' and the worker can apply to WorkCover WA's Conciliation and Arbitration Services for resolution of the dispute.

How do I make payments?

While claim payments are reimbursed by your insurer, you are responsible for making payments to the worker. Your insurer will advise you of the correct amount to pay. You must:

- Make the first payment no later than 14 days of a claim being accepted by your insurer
- Make subsequent payments on the usual payday
- · Make payments in the usual manner
- Only cease payments if your insurer advises you to do so.

Failure to make payments to an injured worker on time can result in a \$2,000 fine for each late payment.

Medical appointments

An injured worker is entitled to choose their own medical practitioner for diagnosis and treatment.

If you would like a second opinion, you can request a medical review through your insurer.

An injured worker cannot be required to attend medical appointments arranged by yourself or your insurer more frequently than once every two weeks and only during reasonable hours.

A worker also cannot be required to see more than three medical practitioners who are specialists in the same field.

An employer cannot insist on being present at an injured worker's medical appointment.

If a worker's claim is accepted, their medical bills can usually be forwarded straight to the insurer for payment.

Prior to commencing any treatment, the worker should be advised to check with your insurer that any proposed treatments will be covered and costs reimbursed.

When can an injured worker return to work?

An injured worker can return to work as soon as their doctor issues a Certificate of Capacity indicating the worker can fully or partially return to work.

You are required to develop a Return to Work Program for an injured worker as soon as the doctor signs a certificate indicating a Return to Work Program should be developed or states that the worker:

- has partial capacity for work
- has total capacity for work but is unable to return to their pre-injury position.

A Return to Work Program template is available under the 'Resources' section of the WorkCover WA website.

If you are unsure how to best support your worker's return to work, or if you are experiencing difficulties identifying modified duties for the worker to perform, talk with your insurer about obtaining assistance from a Workplace Rehabilitation Provider.

Failure to have a Return to Work Program in place can result in a \$2,000 fine.

Can I terminate an injured worker's position?

You are obliged to keep an injured worker's position available where reasonably practicable for 12 months following a worker's incapacity for work.

If the position is no longer available, or the worker can no longer perform that position, you must, where possible, provide a position that is comparable in status and pay and that the worker is deemed qualified and capable of performing.

If you wish to terminate the worker's employment during the 12 month period, you must give the worker and WorkCover WA 28 days' notice of your intention to do so by completing a Form 15G: Notice of intention to dismiss a worker.

WorkCover WA may undertake further investigation to determine if there has been a breach of your legislative obligations.

What happens if there is a dispute?

WorkCover WA's Conciliation and Arbitration Services provide assistance with resolving disputes over workers' compensation and injury management issues.

For more information refer to the publication What happens if there is a dispute? available from the WorkCover WA website.

WorkCover WA Inspectors

WorkCover WA Inspectors regularly visit businesses in metropolitan and regional Western Australia to check employers have workers' compensation insurance.

If you are contacted by a WorkCover WA Inspector, you will be asked to produce a Certificate of Currency (issued by an approved insurer) which you are required to keep on your business premises.

If you employ workers and do not have workers' compensation insurance, you will be advised to obtain a policy immediately. The Inspector will also investigate the reasons why an insurance policy was not taken out.

During the investigation, you will be asked to produce records of any remuneration you have paid to workers while uninsured.

Failing to produce the required records, or providing false or misleading information to a WorkCover WA Inspector, can result in penalties and prosecution.

Penalties for not holding insurance whilst employing workers apply.

Frequently asked questions

Does workers' compensation insurance automatically renew each year?

No – you need to obtain a new Certificate of Currency each year directly from your insurer or via your broker.

I have public liability insurance – am I covered?

No – public liability insurance does not cover you for workers' compensation claims.

I have a 'business insurance package' – am I covered?

'Business insurance packages' often exclude workers' compensation insurance so it's important to check you have the correct coverage.

What is an Injury Management System?

An Injury Management System provides a written description of the steps you will follow when a workplace injury occurs.

An Injury Management System template is available from the 'Resources' section of the WorkCover WA website and can be tailored to suit the needs of your workplace.

Failure to have an Injury Management System in place can result in a \$2,000 fine.

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




If you call the Shark Bay Health Centre after hours you will be transferred through to Health Direct where a Registered Nurse will ask you a number of questions to determine whether you need further emergency assessment by the Shark Bay nurse. If you require further assessment, your call will be put through to the local nurse.

Examples of an EMERGENCY include:

- · Breathing difficulties
- Chest pain
- Severe abdominal pain
- Bleeding that can't be controlled with first aid
- · Convulsions and fits
- Deep lacerations
- Eye or ear injuries
- Uncontrolled high fever
- Loss of consciousness
- Pregnancy bleeding or onset of labour
- A very sick child


