



Executive Officer's Report







Training

The government has recently announced several training courses available through Central Regional Tafe in Geraldton which could be free depending on your situation and certain criteria, including individuals on JobKeeper or JobSeeker. These courses include;

Operating a Small Business - If you're currently operating or thinking about starting up a small business, or would like to get job ready for an administrative support position in a small business operation, this is the skill set for you! There is no requirement for eligibility for this course, the only requirement is particpants must complete all six units. This course is free!

Customer Service Skill Set - You'will learn to communicate effectively and provide quality service to both internal and external customers, and how to deal effectively with people from a range of social and cultural groups with respect and sensitivity. You'll also gain negotiation, conflict management and problem solving skills.

Business Ready - The Business Ready skill set will give you the skills and knowledge required to deliver all aspects of customer service including how to create a relationship with customers, identify their needs, deliver services or products and process customer feedback. You'll also learn how to use business technology and produce business documents, follow work health and safety (WHS) and emergency procedures and instructions, and use computer software and organise electronic information and data.

Certificate IV Business - This course will give you a practical foundation to take you into a number of business and corporate careers: office management, start-up business planning and marketing, and customer service. You will gain the skills and knowledge to manage customer needs and feedback, develop and promote products and services, and play a supporting role in the recruitment of staff. You will acquire valuable experience in making presentations to groups, working in effective teams, and with workplace health and safety.

Apprenticeship and Traineeship Re-engagement Incentive - to support WA businesses, and employers of apprentices and trainees, the new Apprenticeship and Traineeship Re-engagement Incentive (the Re-engagement Incentive) has been introduced by the State Government.

The Re-engagement Incentive will assist businesses to employ an apprentice or trainee and help WA build a pipeline of skilled employees as we move into the economic recovery phase post COVID-19. Businesses will receive a a one-off payment of \$6,000 for hiring an apprentice and \$3,000 for hiring a trainee. The payment is available until June 30, 2021.

Shire President's Report - July 2020

Current Economic Conditions
During a recent budget workshop,
councillors endorsed the Shire's
2020/21 financial budget which
has been developed after careful
consideration of the economic

conditions associated with the past six months during the Covid-19 pandemic and which are likely to continue for some time to come.

In March, Council resolved not to increase the 2020/21 rate in the dollar nor increase any fees and charges for that period. This means that ratepayers will not see an increase in their rates for the forthcoming financial year. To achieve this objective, without significantly reducing the services provided to the community, we've focused on operational expenditure and ongoing maintenance commitments to infrastructure and plant, which will assist us to maintain service delivery levels to the local community.

The Shire has also received some State and Federal economic stimulus funding related to the Covid-19 recovery package, so expect to see some new capital works projects commencing in the next few months, such as;

- o New and extended footpaths
- o dual use pathways
- o upgrade to lights at the multi-purpose courts
- o foreshore adventure park fence replacement
- o signage at Little Lagoon, as well as
- o site works and building at the new Child Care centre.

Influx of Visitors

The proactive approach taken by the Shire Discovery Centre staff prior to the July school holidays with radio, social media and television promotions and marketing, certainly paid off with record numbers of visitors during the holiday period – for many, their first time to the Bay.





Although the unit has not had to respond to any incidents, the Shark Bay SES unit members have been busy over the past few weekends attending regional training. Unit members travelled to Geraldton to take part in land search team member training while others visited Kalbarri for continuation training in vertical rescue techniques.

Members will also be taking part in field radio operators course to be held here in Denham with visitors from other units in the region attending. This course will enhance skills and proficiency around radio operations using high frequency, VHF and UHF radios. During the response to large scale incidents, SES members are often tasked with handling communications between the base operations centre and teams in the field.

To help our unit members maintain their vertical rescue skills, one end wall of our storage shed has been modified to assist with climbing drills such as ascending and lowering on a single rope as well as rope transfer. This facility will also allow those members that do not wish to hang on a thread to be involved as part of the team by practicing setting up anchors and belaying



All our emergency services in town welcome new faces to join their groups. By getting involved, you are making a positive contribution to our community and support the essential work that the various groups do. SES is no exception, and we would love anyone to come along, even if it is for a look to see what we do and see if that is how you wish to be involved. 

Conservation Matters

Return to 1616 - Laying the foundations

The return of native animals to Dirk Hartog Island National Park is well on its way with four species having been translocated to the island. But the 'one way, all expenses paid' trip to their new island home, is only the 'tip of iceberg' when it comes to the work involved to ensure each species breeds successfully and creates a new population when reintroduced. To lay the foundations and ensure this success, lots of information must first be gathered on each species well before their island trip.

The western grasswren (Amytornis textilis textilis) is currently planned for reintroduction to Dirk Hartog Island National Park in 2021 as part of the Return to 1616 project. This secretive species now only occurs in mainland Shark Bay (within WA) and very little is known about them. Aline Gibson Vega, PhD student from The University of Western Australia aims to fill this information gap.

Naturally the first step was to find some grasswrens. Together with the Return to 1616 team, Aline visited Peron Peninsula and Bush Heritage Australia's (BHA) Hamelin Station Reserve over several field trips in 2019 and 2020. Assisted by BHA ecologists and project collaborators Michelle Hall and Ben Parkhurst, a special set of "mist nets" were designed to catch ground-dwelling birds, such as

grasswrens. Mist nets are so fine they're almost invisible. When set in the correct place, birds get gently entangled as they run into it.

Once this method for capturing grasswrens was perfected, individuals were banded with a metal ring, and a unique combination of colour bands on their legs. Grasswrens can then be identified from a distance using binoculars or spotting scopes. This helps researchers to learn about group behaviour, breeding success, dispersal, population genetics and how long grasswrens live. After many weeks of trapping, 120 individuals have now been identified with colour bands representing approximately 60 family groups that occupy an area of approximately 150 hectares. A huge effort for a very cryptic species.

Information provided by Aline's research on the western grasswren ecology will be used in the future to help plan for their successful reintroduction to Dirk Hartog Island National Park.




I am an ex resident of Denham and I recently came back to Shark Bay to stay with a friend.



Marine Rescue Shark Bay have received half a dozen calls for assistance over the last few weeks.

Four of the jobs were due to mechanical failure and one was a nighttime run to investigate a report of an inflatable boat with no occupants anchored near Steep Point. Apparently, the inflatable had run out of fuel and the occupants had been taken ashore by another vessel to get some. While they were away another vessel saw the unoccupied boat and a report was relayed to Shark Bay Police. Tamala Rose departed for the scene to investigate and used their radar and night vision capability to find and question the vessel that was thought to have assisted the crew of the inflatable. All turned out to be okay and the crew of the inflatable are probably still unaware that two local Police, four Marine Rescue Volunteers as well as Water Police in Fremantle and the Challenger Search and Rescue jet were on high alert in case they were in need of assistance. Worst case scenario was that they were diving and had been swept away from their boat, so we had to act on that possibility.

Another slightly frustrating case involved four occupants of a small aluminium dinghy which was stranded in the Cape Lesueur area when the tide went out and they didn't have enough water depth to make it back to their vehicle and trailer which were parked at Big Lagoon. Instead of staying on the beach near where the dinghy was anchored, they set out to walk back to their car in the dark with no shoes and very little water. Around 10pm, after walking for four hours they decided to light a fire and stay the night. They managed to alert a friend by text of their plight and Tamala Rose set out at daylight to retrieve the group and their dinghy and take them back to their vehicle.

The frustrating part is that had they just stayed on the beach




where the dinghy was, they could have woken up in the morning and continued on their way as the tide had come back in. The rule applies in this case just the same as if you are bogged in a remote location in a car, "Don't leave the vehicle". None of the group had any shoes and they left behind all their water and food as well as all their safety gear and a perfectly good dinghy. Anything could have happened as they stumbled along the coast on a dark moonless night, hoping to walk all the way around Big Lagoon to get back to their car.

We have had three new members join the group recently, but we are always on the lookout for more volunteers as most of our members work and lead otherwise busy lives. This makes it hard to find a crew when a call for assistance comes in. If you would like to get involved, call 9948 1376 to apply.

Our treasurer, one-time Commander and highly valued member John Craig is leaving Denham with his wife Emma, baby Molly and Luna the dog to take up a position in Perth. The Committee and Members sincerely thank John for his valuable contribution to the group since becoming a member following his own dramatic brush with sea survival several years ago. He has used his time in the group well, and I can honestly say that we have benefited greatly from his contribution. We will miss him, but we sincerely wish him and his family every success and continued happiness in the path they have chosen.





If you call the Shark Bay Health Centre after hours you will be transferred through to Health Direct where a Registered Nurse will ask you a number of questions to determine whether you need further emergency assessment by the Shark Bay nurse. If you require further assessment, your call will be put through to the local nurse.

Examples of an EMERGENCY include:

- · Breathing difficulties
- Chest pain
- Severe abdominal pain
