You don't need a password so you can get online straight away. You can also use the Wi-Fi to download and install the Express Plus mobile apps. We can help you set up your digital services if you're not sure what to do.

Speedway Safety Reminder

It's always important as a sport that we are constantly keeping an eye on general safety throughout speedway events and continually educating wherever possible. The Speedway Australia rulebook covers a wide range of general health and safety rules which need to be followed at events.

One rule in particular is around the use of axle stands, or lack thereof anytime someone is positioned under a race car.

Rule 18.1.5. Axle stands must be used at all times if a person is working under a Race Car.

Speedway Australia have advised that on their travels to venues throughout the country they recognised varying levels of compliance with this rule. Some teams are fantastic with safety first thinking, while others sometimes need a push in the right direction. As divisional and track leaders, we need you all to keep an eye on this as you walk through the pits. If you see a team not using axle stands, please give them a heads up on the rules and help spread the word before we see any unfortunate and unnecessary accidents.



In Denham, Horizon Power is helping lead Western Australia's energy transition by building Australia's first remote microgrid renewable hydrogen demonstration plant.

The Australian Renewable Energy Agency (ARENA) and the Government of Western Australia have announced funding commitments, supporting Horizon Power to bring the exciting project to Denham.

In anticipation of the technology becoming cost competitive in the future, the construction of this first-ofits-kind demonstration plant will test the technical capability of hydrogen as a dispatchable power source.



Project overview

The power supply for the hydrogen plant will be from a dedicated solar farm. The plant is expected to generate 526 MWh per year, which is equivalent to the energy required to power up to 100 residential houses in Denham.

The Denham Hydrogen Demonstration Plant will include:

- Dedicated solar generation 704kW
- Electrolyser 348kW
- Hydrogen compression and storage
- Fuel cell 100kW
- Connection into the Denham Hybrid Power System

- Denham will be at the forefront of developing the technical capability in hydrogen, which could be deployed across other remote microgrids in the future
- The overall percentage of Denham's electricity generated from renewables will increase

HORIZON POWER COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP

St John Ambulance Shark Bay Sub Centre were recently successful in our application for a Horizon Power Community Partnership to contribute to the cost of a Ferno 531 Stair chair and 531D Ferno Stair Track.

We attend a number of callouts where stairs are involved in transporting a patient to our ambulance. Currently our ambulance attendants have to navigate stairs using a stretcher or lifting or helping a patient, which causes delays in moving the patient and increases the risk of an injury to the ambulance volunteers.

The safety of our patients, ambulance attendants and drivers is paramount and the addition of the Ferno 531D Stair Chair and 531 Chair Track will minimise the risk by reducing evacuation time, provide the ability to manoeuvre in tight stairwells and provide a stable ride without pressure on operators.

The addition of the Ferno 531D Stair Chair and 531 Chair Track supports good health and well-being for the community and visitors to the region. It will create a safer environment for both our ambulance attendants and our patients.





BLUE ALERT Get ready for a cyclone. You need to prepare for cyclone weather.

RED ALERT Take shelter from the cyclone. You need to get to shelter immediately.

ALL CLEAR The cyclone has passed but take care. Wind and storm surge dangers have passed but you need to take care to avoid the dangers caused by damage.

Emergency Kit



Supplies for sheltering during a cyclone

An **emergency kit** is essential for short term survival (at least three days) whether you choose to stay at home or need to relocate to safer accommodation. An emergency kit is a collection of items that are essential for your household's needs in the event of any emergency.

Keep your kit in a sturdy bag or waterproof storage box, which is stored in a safe and easily accessible place.

Start your Emergency Kit with the following items

Medication

- First aid kit
- Toiletries, sanitary supplies
- Drinking water (to last at least three days)*
- □ Canned food (to last at least three days)*
- Portable, battery operated AM/FM radio
- □ Waterproof torch
- Spare batteries
- * You may require food and water for your family to last more than three days depending on your location and family's needs

Remember to consider your pets. What do they need? These items should be included in your Emergency Kit.



You and your family must

- Prepare an emergency kit
- Check and replace food and water every 12 months
- Review your kit when a cyclone or flood alert is issued

How many species of seagrass are there?

Shark Bay (Gathaagudu) has some of the largest seagrass meadows in the world. There are approximately 4,000 km2 of seagrass meadows. The widespread seagrass meadows are home to the largest dugong (wuthuga) population in the world (more than 11,000



animals). The seagrasses also provide food and shelter for many other species, from the smallest microscopic organisms living in the seafloor to large marine animals, such as turtles (buyungurra) and dolphins (irrabuga).




