On Saturday the 26th of October, in collaboration with the Shark Bay Shire and supported by the Department of Communities, Lotterywest and Healthway through Meerilinga, Shark Bay CRC (SB CRC) coordinated our very first Colour Run in order to celebrate Children's Week within our community.

Children's Week is a national, annual event held every October. Last year, SB CRC planned and hosted a successful Make Your Own Healthy Pizza Day at the Rec Centre and the year before that the popular Sensory Day event. Children's Week is dedicated to promoting the Rights of the Child as proclaimed by the United Nations in 1954 and to remind us of our responsibility to advocate for children as citizens. SHIRE PRESIDENT'S REPORT - OCTOBER 2019

Local Government Elections

The Shire of Shark Bay local government election result on 19 October saw the return of sitting councillors Greg Ridgeley and myself, plus election of two new candidates, Peter Stubberfield and Mark Smith. Congratulations to both the new and returning councillors.

As usual, Shark Bay had one of the highest voter participation rates in the State with over 45% for the Denham Ward. The seats currently occupied by Councillors Bellottie, Fenny and Burton will be contested in 2021.

Following the Special Meeting held this week, I have retained the presidency and Councillor Fenny was elected as Deputy President. It was great to have six candidates for the three available seats in the Denham Ward and four candidates for the Useless Loop/ Pastoral Ward seat.

As democracy is all about power vested in the people through representation, all councillors have been elected to serve our whole community and make decisions based on the best outcomes for the majority of the people, so don't hesitate to contact any of the councillors to provide feedback or raise issues of concern.

Community Assistance Grants

At the Council meeting this month, four local community/sporting organisations were endorsed

to receive grant funding via the Shire's assistance program which was open for submissions between 16 September – 4 October. The successful groups are; Community Resource Centre (CRC), Bridge Club, Pistol Club, Men's Shed and Speedway Club.



Details of the successful community applications are;

- CRC received \$1000 to hold a Kindy Gym Christmas and Graduation Party
- Bridge Club received \$692 to purchase a laptop and card tables
- Pistol Club received \$1000 to assist with replacing range target frames, and
- Men's Shed received \$997 to contribute to the purchase of a drill press, 18v drill and saw bench.

The Speedway Club will receive \$8000 from the Significant Event Sponsorship Fund to contribute to the track wall improvements for the 33rd Far Western Race Meet.

PROPOSED MANDATORY SAFETY EQUIPMENT

PROPOSED MANDATORY SAFETY EQUIPMENT

FOR ALL RECREATIONAL VESSEL OPERATING IN UNPROTECTED WATERS

In addition to the mandatory safety equipment skippers should carry additional items of safety equipment based on the:

- type of craft;
- weather;
- location;
- number of people on board; etc.

Item	Description	Required
	Recreational Skipper's Ticket The skipper of a recreational vessel, powered by a motor greater than 6 hp must hold an RST.	In all navigable waters
	Lifejacket Carriage A lifejacket of buoyancy level 100 or higher for every person onboard, complying with AS 4758 or ISO 12402 (suitable for the size and weight of the person).	Beyond 400 metres of the shore.
	Lifejacket Wearing The wearing of a level 100 or higher lifejacket, complying with AS 4758 or ISO 12402 (suitable for the size and weight of the person), by every person onboard. - A vessel less than 4.8m. - Over the age of 1 year and under the age of 12 years on any sized vessel.	
	GPS Enabled Distress Beacon An in date GPS Enabled EPIRB or PLB (PLB must be worn) registered with AMSA, complying with AS/NZS 4280.	Beyond 400 metres of the shore.
	Electronic Night Signalling Device (water resistant)	Beyond 400 metres of the shore.
	or Flares At least two in date red hand held flares and two hand held orange smoke signals complying with AS 2092.	
	Marine Radio An operational marine radio (27 MHz, VHF* or HF) is to be provided (hand-held or fitted), approved by the ACMA. * = preferred option.	Beyond 4 nautical miles of the shore.

Recreational Vessel Safety Equipment Review

In 2016, the Department of Transport (DoT) commenced the first comprehensive review of safety equipment requirements for recreational vessels in WA since 1992.

The aim of the review is to deliver a contemporary safety equipment regime for recreational vessels navigating in WA as boating and community behaviours, technology and vessel design and construction standards have changed significantly in the past 27 years.

The formation of an external reference group comprising representatives of key industry and boating community organisations has been central to the progress of the review to date.

In March 2017, DoT released the Recreational Vessel Safety Equipment Discussion Paper and conducted an online survey to seek community input. More than 1,200 submissions were received during the six week consultation period.

After careful consideration of the feedback received from the community and the external reference group, DoT has prepared a position paper detailing proposed changes to the safety equipment requirements for recreational vessels.

DoT is now seeking feedback on these proposed changes before making formal recommendations for change to the Minister for Transport.

Executive Officer's Report



Transport Minister Rita Saffioti has released the Recreational Vessel Safety Equipment Review Position paper calling for Community feedback regards 12 proposed changes which will bring WA into line with other states. It has been more than 25 years since the last review of safety equipment requirements for recreational vessels in WA.

Skippers from Broome to Albany are encouraged to discuss the proposed changes at a series of special information sessions locations across the state, our closest being in Geraldton on Wednesday the 6th November or also via the website. Participants can register to attend by emailing safetysafetyequipmentreview@transport.wa.gov.au or contact DoT on 9435 7901.

Proposed recreational vessel changes include;

- the compulsory wearing of lifejackets for children and by anyone on a vessel less than 4.8m in length
- not needing to carry any safety equipment when operating in protected waters or within 400m of shore in unprotected waters beyond 400m, vessels will require a GPS enabled distress beacon, plus either flares or an electronic night signalling device as well as a marine radio of operating more than 4 nautical miles from shore.

Associations Online

All incorporated associations and clubs were given three years to review and update their rules to comply with the Act. This transition Period ended on 30 June 2019. During this three year transition, 15,152 applications were lodge to change their rules, with 50% submitted in the last twelve months.

There are three actions all incorporated organisations and clubs must complete every year within six months after the end of the financial year. These are;

- hold and Annual General Meeting (AGM);
- prepare financial report/statements which are presented at the AGM; and
- lodge an Associations Information Statement with Consumer Protection.

The financial year for the majority of incorporated associations and clubs end on 30 June so these organisations have until 31 December 2019 to meet these obligations.

If the AGM cannot be held within the time frame required by the Act, an application requesting further time to hold a meeting will need to be lodged prior to the six month period ending.

The Shark Bay CRC wants to thank everyone who

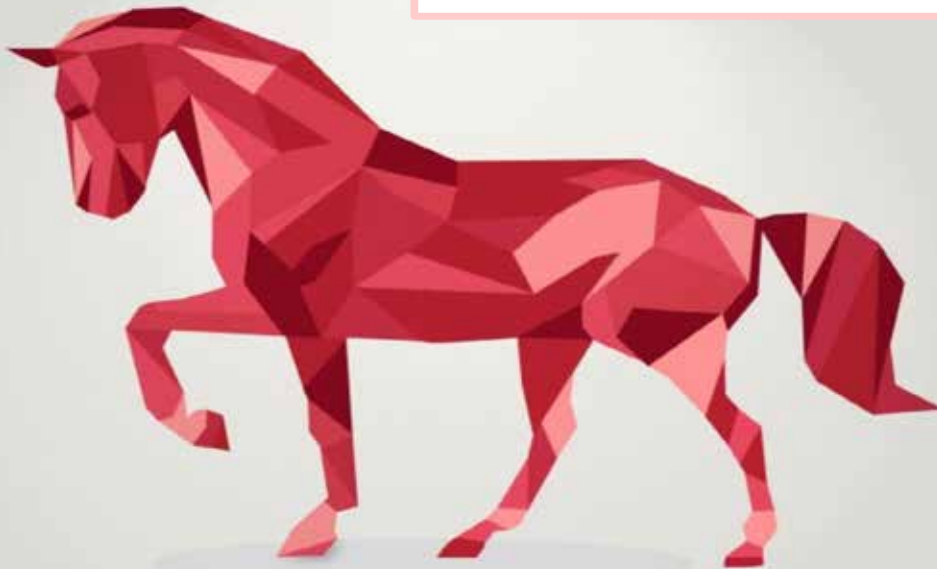

On Monday 11 November 2019 the Shire of Shark Bay will conduct its annual clean up in the Townsite of Denham in preparation for the coming Cyclone season.

The Industrial area is **excluded** from this pickup.

Residents are asked to place any materials that may be a Cyclone risk, including green waste, on the road verge in front of their property after **1 November 2019—Rubbish placed on verge before this date will NOT be removed.**

Residents are asked to **clearly** separate metal items and green waste from normal materials.

Asbestos, tyres, batteries and putrescible (household) rubbish **will not** be collected and must not be placed on the verge. Penalties apply for the dumping of these materials.

The cyclone clean-up will commence at 7.30 am on Monday 11 November 2019.

Any items placed out after this date will not be picked up and will be the responsibility of the resident to remove.

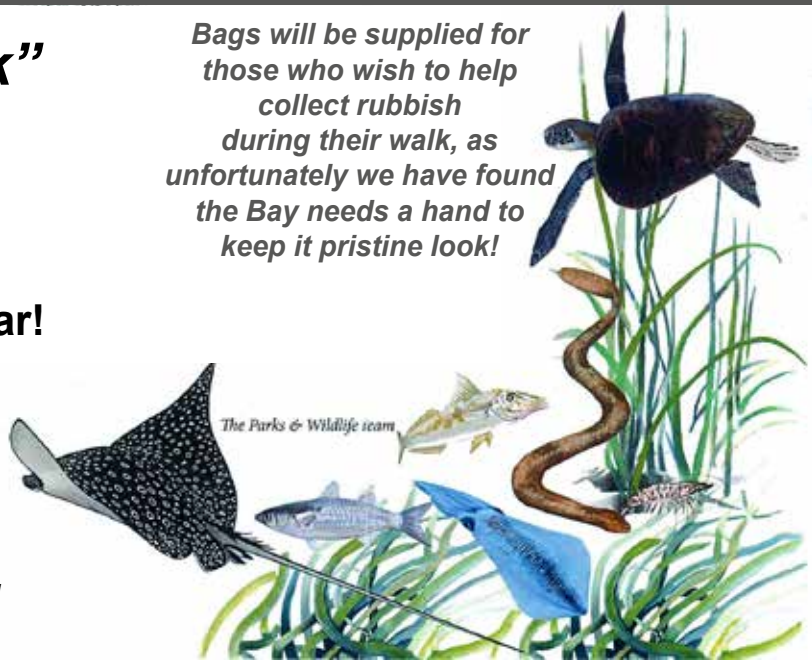

The scholarship guidelines ask the student to research the history of the Australian prisoners of war that were sent to British North Borneo after the fall of Singapore in 1941. They have a choice of options as well having a list of suggested topics to provide subject matter for their presentation.

The student that is selected will join group of people that will include students from other West Australian towns and travel to the Eastern Malaysian states of Sabah and Sarawak for 14 days in April 2020. The group will visit various places of historical significance as well as having the opportunity to walk along a portion of the "Sandakan Death March track". The scholarship includes all travel, accommodation and most meal costs between the travel dates.

Our committee thanks everyone that has supported our fund raising events during the past year.

It has been really appreciated that people have made a big effort to help out when we were a bit short staffed and also to support our efforts. Without that great support we would not have been able to gather the fund to enable this project to go ahead each year.

Volunteer Marine Rescue



Commander Report as presented at the 2019 AGM

The past year has been one of great progress as we strive to become a dedicated and efficient Marine Rescue Group. The committee have been meeting regularly to effectively manage the affairs of the group and I believe the positive and cooperative attitude that has been adopted by this committee has filtered down through the group resulting in a cohesive unit that people want to be a part of.

COMMITTEE

John Nelson left the committee during the year to relocate to Carnarvon and was replaced by Chris Rewi. Chris and Secretary Sue Herriot have not re-nominated for positions this year so I would like to thank John, Chris and Sue for their valuable assistance over the past twelve months.

A six-member sub-committee was formed to work towards the replacement of Rescue 3 with a brand-new vessel. This work is on-going, and it is expected that a new vessel will be delivered in the first half of 2020.

DFES have supplied the group with a new computer and a laser printer. The secretary and treasurer each have a new laptop and there is a new touch pad to use on jobs.

Greg Ridgely has been elected to the committee of VMRWA association as Regional Commander for the Gascoyne. Best wishes to Greg in his new role.

GROUP OPERATIONS AND ACHIEVEMENTS

During the past twelve months Marine Rescue Shark Bay have carried out 23 Search and Rescue missions. Most of these jobs were recovery tows of broken-down vessels but at least two of them were more serious incidents that could have had tragic outcomes.

The rescue of a man and his two sons from their submerged vessel near Steep Point resulted in the group being awarded the prestigious "Outstanding Group Achievement" award at this year's WAFES conference.

Our Whats App system seems to be working well when organizing jobs or passing on information to the group, but in the future we may trial a system called BART that is being used by the Geraldton group as it only requires one click to respond that you are available or unavailable to assist instead of typing a reply.

All group members that required a new uniform have been kitted out, thanks Kath for your efforts.

We were successful in applying for a \$40,000 grant to have a catwalk built and installed at our boat pen to make it safer to get on and off Rescue 4. However, there was a last minute hold up when the DoT engineers asked for more information before they would pass it. The

builders, Marina Systems Australia are working with the department to resolve any issues so we are optimistic that we will have a new catwalk sometime in the New Year.

MEMBERSHIP

Our membership numbers have fluctuated somewhat this year. Six of our members have left town, six past members have not renewed their membership and we have at least six people who are interested in joining. Currently we have 23 members, 11 of them are DFES qualified rescue crews and skippers and 6 are on DFES Pathways to become crews and skippers.

Soon we hope to create a junior membership category. Next weekend I will be meeting with the DFES coordinator for youth programs to work out how to proceed with this new initiative.

TRAINING

Many members have taken advantage of the various training opportunities the group has been involved in this year. Courses have been held in Geraldton and Carnarvon For Seamanship and Sea Survival as well as a weekend MARSAR. Locally we have had members attend courses on using WAERN Radios, AIMS Awareness, Basic Navigation, Leadership Fundamentals, Radio Operators Certificates and First Aid. Next years training calendar is in the process of being finalized and all groups have been invited to have input so that it can cater to their needs. We have a few of our newer members that have a couple more steps to reach crew level 3. Next year DFES will roll-out pathways 5 and 6 so some of our members will be the first to take part.

VESSELS

There is a new Safety Management System Manual in place for Rescue 3 and Rescue 4. Both vessels have recently passed inspection by an AMSA surveyor. R4 has a new power steering system fitted which has reduced the amount of turns lock to lock from 11 to 4. When the new rudder feedback unit is fitted tomorrow the auto pilot should work properly for the first time. New USB fast chargers have been installed.

R3 has been upgraded with a WAERN radio which means that both boats now have radio coverage everywhere in Shark Bay. New floodlights and deck lighting have been fitted and trim stoppers have been installed on the outboards to stop them hitting the transom. The transducer has been moved so that the sounder works at speed. Both boats have new satellite phones and toolboxes.

SHED

The shed floor has been ground and painted at a cost to the group of a bit over \$10000. We have some new

furniture and we have sold the old jinker to Jamie Morgan.

RELATIONSHIPS

We continue to work closely and share training opportunities with our local police, fisheries and SES. Police are the hazard management authority and we are tasked with assisting them when called upon. Sgt Bond has set aside a dedicated radio room in the police station where our members go to assist during critical incidents. By working and training with the other agencies we become a more effective unit.

CONCLUSION

Lastly, I would like to thank all the volunteer members who have contributed their time and energy to the successful operation of this group. I can assure you that this group is a necessary and vital part of our community. This year our members really have made a difference to people's lives and you should be very proud of the contribution you have made.

SES Shark Bay



Our message this month as we approach the high-risk part of the year, is for everyone in the community to take some responsibility for their own safety and welfare. The West Australian cyclone season is usually between November and April. This coincides with Summer fire season and there are times when the two collide to produce difficult times for the emergency responders.

The shire is again offering residents a cyclone clean up opportunity and they are generous in collecting not just cyclonic debris type articles. Please do the right thing and clean up around your premises to reduce the risk to your own property as well as your neighbors.

The Midwest – Gascoyne region covers an area of approximately 600,000km² this is around 75% of the land mass of NSW. Our region is served by 2,500 emergency service volunteers across volunteer fires and rescue brigade, state emergency service units, marine rescue groups and volunteer emergency groups. To support them from the regional headquarters in Geraldton, there are only 14 staff. The volunteers respond to a wide range of incidents at all times of the day and night, from building and bush fires to road crash rescue, marine, land and air searches to cliff rescues as well as incident support in other areas of the state.

All residents should assist our volunteers by stepping up and doing a bit themselves to ease the load.

As you may have heard, the weather boffins have predicted an average year for cyclones, whatever that may be. They expect that there will be 4 or 5 cyclones to approach the North West coast and maybe there will be one cross the coast. The one that do come close may be at the higher end of the range. So, if there is a bit of rainfall resulting from one of these things, and you are travelling where they have affected the area by causing some flooding you may well take heed of the following.

More people die as a result of attempting to cross flooded rivers and creeks than by other impacts of cyclones. A Nissan patrol floats in 0.9 of a meter of water, it becomes unstable in water just 0.30 meter deep. The same could be said for Land cruisers. A Yaris floats in water 0.6 m deep and becomes unstable in water 0.15 deep, that is you can push it sideways. A Rangers safe wading depth is 0.8 m but will move sideways. I am not picking on any particular brand of vehicle but these numbers are an indicator for any similar vehicle. The message is stay safe and keep out of fast running water even if it is shallow.

- **Registration:** Is your dog registered? All dogs aged three months and over must be registered with your local authority. Failure to register your dog may result in a \$200 on-the-spot infringement.
- **Tags:** Is your dog wearing a current registration tag?
- **Microchipped:** Is your dog microchipped with your current address and relevant contact information? All registered dogs must be microchipped.
- **Escape:** Are your fences and gates good enough to stop your dog going under, over or through them?
- **Behaviour:** Does your dog socialise well with other dogs and people?
- **Poo Patrol:** Do you pick up your dog's poo when it does its business in public?
- **Exercise:** When you are out and about do you have your dog on a leash in public or under your control in dog exercise areas?
- **Health:** Is your dog free of parasites and in good condition for its age/breed?
- **Home:** Does your dog always have sufficient shelter, cooling, water, food and attention?

Irresponsible dog owners may face significant penalties under the Dog Act 1976.

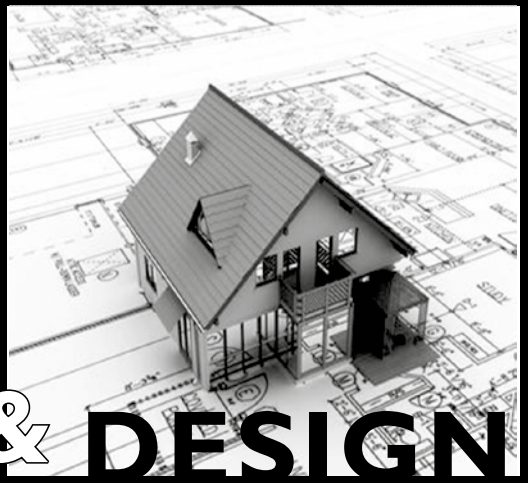

EMERGENCY

If you call the Shark Bay Health Centre after hours you will be transferred through to Health Direct where a Registered Nurse will ask you a number of questions to determine whether you need further emergency assessment by the Shark Bay nurse. If you require further assessment, your call will be put through to the local nurse.

Examples of an EMERGENCY include:

- Breathing difficulties
- Chest pain
- Severe abdominal pain
- Bleeding that can't be controlled with first aid
- Convulsions and fits
- Deep lacerations
- Eye or ear injuries
- Uncontrolled high fever
- Loss of consciousness
- Pregnancy – bleeding or onset of labour
- A very sick child





From January 2020, Transwa will manage annual Pensioner Free Travel entitlements digitally for WA Pensioner Concession Cardholders. Your travel entitlements will be the same however Centrelink and the Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) will no longer send WA Free Trip Vouchers with new concession card(s). To ensure you are ready for travel in 2020 register with Transwa now. Bookings for travel in 2020 commence from 3rd October 2019.

Transwa will need your concession details to confirm your entitlements before you book and travel. To help us please send copies of both sides of your Centrelink or DVA Pensioner Concession and/or DVA Gold Health cards when you register.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

I have a Pensioner Concession Card from Department of Human Services (DHS) / Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA). What am I entitled to?

Once registered and your concession has been validated, you may take one free return or two free single trips on Transwa services each calendar year (from 2020).

I have a Gold Health Card from Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA). What am I entitled to?

Once registered and your concession has been validated, you may take two free return or four free single trips on Transwa services each calendar year (from 2020).

How do I register for Pensioner Free Travel and get my concession validated?

Complete the attached registration form (or download it from the web) and attach images of both sides of your concession card(s).

What do I do if I have a digital wallet instead of a concession card?

A digital wallet allows you to have your concession or health card with you everywhere you take your smart device. Transwa accepts either the physical card or your digital wallet as evidence of your valid concession.

When registering we ask for a photocopy or scan of your card(s). You can also screenshot both sides of your digital wallet and send us the images with your online registration form.

Why do I need to give Transwa consent to access my concession records held by Centrelink?

We need your consent to enable the Australian Government Department of Human Services (Centrelink) to confirm the concession details you provide to the Public Transport Authority of WA (Transwa) when you register with us. The consent you give remains valid with Transwa unless you withdraw your consent by contacting us.

How do I book my Pensioner Free Travel?

There are a number of ways to book your Pensioner Free Travel with Transwa once you have registered. Have your concession card/digital wallet handy and:

Visit us at one of our Transwa Booking Centre's or visit one of our Accredited agents

Call us on 1300 662 205

Book online (available from late 2019)

What do I do if my travel plans change?

We know plans often change. To cancel or re-schedule your trip, call us on 1300 662 205 prior to the scheduled departure of the first leg of your journey and we will re-book or arrange for your Pensioner Free Travel entitlement to be reinstated.

Can I still use my WA Free Trip Vouchers from Centrelink or DVA if I have not registered with Transwa?

From 2020 you must be registered with Transwa to receive Pensioner Free Travel on Transwa services. Transwa will calculate your travel entitlement each calendar year and you will not need to provide a paper voucher.

Can I still receive a concession fare after I have used my free travel entitlements?

In addition to Pensioner Free Travel, WA Pensioner Concession cardholders and WA Gold Health cardholders can claim 50% concession on Transwa services.

Am I entitled to other travel entitlements if I live in the north of Western Australia?

If you live north of the 26th parallel in Western Australia and hold a Pensioner Concession Card or DVA Gold Health Card you may be entitled to other free travel options. Contact the Department of Transport for more details.

Do I need travel insurance?

Travel involves many risks and our liability to you may be limited in certain circumstances. We strongly suggest that you protect yourself by purchasing comprehensive travel insurance cover for (without limitation) loss of booking due to delays or cancellations, damage or loss to personal baggage and other items, personal liability, death, personal injury and medical costs. We do not sell or endorse any specific travel insurance products.

Shire of Shark Bay Australia Day Awards

Guidelines and Criteria

Local citizens and community group and/or community event will be eligible for the Shire of Shark Bay Australia Day Citizen Award in 2020. The awards will be presented at the Shire of Shark Bay Australia Day Celebrations to be held on the 26 January 2020. Nominees will be notified of their nomination and will be officially invited to the event.

The recipients will be selected from people and groups who have made noteworthy contributions to the community during the year, or given outstanding service to the local community over a number of years through active involvement.

Nomination Process

The Shire of Shark Bay invites nominations for the awards from local community members and community groups.

The recipient of the awards will be decided at the December Ordinary Council Meeting.

Selection Criteria

The award winners will be judged to have shown active citizenship and:

- Significant contribution to the local community.
- Demonstrated leadership on a community issue resulting in the enhancement of community life.
- A significant initiative which has brought about a positive change and added value to community life.
- Inspiring qualities as a role model for the community.

Eligibility Criteria

- Nominees should reside or work within the Shire of Shark Bay.
- Groups of people or couples will not normally be eligible except when meeting the criteria of a community group.
- A person may receive an award on more than one occasion in recognition of their outstanding contribution or involvement.
- Unsuccessful nominees may be nominated in future years.
- Sitting members of State, Federal and Local Government are not eligible.
