

It may have come to your attention recently, that the Ranger has been visiting individuals regarding their dogs.

Responsibilities come with dog ownership and we would like to further assist you in understanding some of those responsibilities.

As a dog owner are you able to answer yes to all these questions?

- **Registration**: Is your dog registered? All dogs aged three months and over must be registered with your local authority. Failure to register your dog may result in a \$200 on-the-spot infringement.
- **Tags**: Is your dog wearing a current registration tag?
- **Microchipped**: Is your dog microchipped with your current address and relevant contact information? All registered dogs must be microchipped.
- **Escape**: Are your fences and gates good enough to stop your dog going under, over or through them?
- Behaviour: Does your dog socialise well with other dogs and people?
- Poo Patrol: Do you pick up your dog's poo when it does its business in public?
- **Exercise**: When you are out and about do you have your dog on a leash in public or under your control in dog exercise areas?
- Health: Is your dog free of parasites and in good condition for its age/breed?
- Home: Does your dog always have sufficient shelter, cooling, water, food and attention?

Irresponsible dog owners may face significant penalties under the Dog Act 1976. Please call the Shire of Shark Bay, 08 9948 1218 or contact the Ranger on 0418 531 485 for more information.

"I was born on the beach at Shark Bay, I was a twin but my sister died. My mother was Australian-Malay but we all used to mix together – white people and the coloured people – and we helped one another. We respected each other, too.

We'd picnic on the beach and the mothers and daughters would fish from the jetty while the boys went hunting for rabbit and different things. Sometimes the others would go out fishing on the boats although I wouldn't – I'm frightened of boats. We used to have horseraces on the beach. It was all so much fun.

I never had much schooling because I was a very delicate child. When I was sick, my mother would put me in the oven to keep me warm, like an incubator. The kids say to me, 'Nan, that's why you're so dark – you got burnt!'

My first job was on a station on Dirk Hartog Island. I learnt a lot of skills there, like waiting tables. The owners, Mr and Mrs McIntyre – she was a lovely lady – treated me like their own daughter.

I'm the only one left here from my family -my sister and brother passed away - but I've got plenty of grandkids down in Perth and Geraldton. Never mind, that's life. I'm alive, I don't drink, I don't smoke and I don't play cards anymore - we used to play rummy.

I'm at the age now where you just stay put. I've got a good girl who comes and helps me out and a lovely lady cleaner. I go down to the beach to talk to people every day. People are very good to me. I wouldn't live anywhere else."




In loving tribute to Aunty Nellie Cock

Dear Shire of Shark Bay residents and visitors,

Permanent Doctor urgently required for Shire of Shark Bay

As your local Member of Parliament, representing and advocating on behalf of constituents in the electorate of North West Central, and after ongoing consultation with community members within the Shire of Shark Bay, I am again calling on the McGowan Labor Government to urgently instate the services of a permanent Doctor in Denham.

The need for a resident Doctor has been raised with me on numerous occasions and confirms some very valid reasons for calling on the State Government to instate a permanent Doctor in the Shark Bay region, such as:

- Providing medical services for the communities and hundreds of visitors to remote regions is essential.
- Ensuring the community is safe and the level of services available for the health and well-being of residents and visitors in the region is acceptable. With more than 6,000 tourism beds in the Shark Bay area, along with permanent residents, the number of potentially vulnerable people is significant.
- A reduction in waiting periods or long travel distances for both emergencies and simple requirements such as filling prescriptions or being medically assessed and treated in an appropriate timeframe without incurring additional costs, time off work and inconvenience.
- A reduction in stress levels placed on particularly vulnerable groups such as the elderly, families with young children and patients with severe medical conditions which may be time critical.
- Acceptable and expected levels of basic medical services to ensure new families, businesses and residents are attracted to live and visit the region.







I am happy to report that there have been no calls for help to your local Marine Rescue Group in the past month. Well done to the boating public who must be keeping their boats and motors in good

reliable condition.

Our members have been involved in training courses on the use of our WAERN radios and AIIMS Awareness. AIIMS is the Australian Interagency Incident Management System which is the ground rules for how VMR fits into the network of responders called upon in emergencies.

Our shed in Durlacher Street has had the concrete floor ground and painted by professional contractors and it looks brand new and will be much easier to keep clean.

We had a visit from the Australian Maritime Safety Authority's inspector who came to Denham to do surveys on commercial vessels. Both our vessels were up to the standard required to comply with their Certificate of Operation which was a good result.

A film crew from DFES Media came to Denham to make a short film about the successful rescue of a man and his two sons whose boat capsized and sank near Steep Point in April. The film will be shown as part of the awards night at the conference weekend in September.

Four of our members will be going to the conference weekend at the Perth Convention and





Exhibition Centre. The weekend showcases all the latest developments in Marine Rescue and features guest speakers and tours of Water Police HQ among other highlights.

In another exciting development we have successfully applied to DFES for funding to have a floating catwalk built and installed at our boat pen. This will be of great benefit to the boat crew and skippers who currently get onto the boat by clambering over the bow from the jetty. A catwalk will make it much safer and quicker to get onto the boat and the reduced response time could one day be the difference to the outcome of a critical incident.

There is always plenty happening with your local VMR Group, so if you want to get involved, call 99481376 and ask for a nomination form. Meanwhile, always keep boating safety in mind when heading out on the water.

If you think that father was a bit over the top, let me assure you that's how our father God in heaven relates to us when one of us, his wayward children, come home to him.



How to check in on someone

Helping others and providing support can make a difference for someone who is having problems and going through a tough time. If you think someone you care about isn't going so well, try the following tips on how to support them and continue to check in on them.



For most people, just asking if they are okay and listening can make a difference.

By simply being there for someone, they can feel less alone and more supported to open up and talk about how they are really feeling.

Asking open ended questions that require a response is a good way to start the conversation.

FOR EXAMPLE:

- How are you going? What's been happening in your life lately?
- · You don't seem quite yourself lately, is something bothering you?
- · You seem upset or worried, what's going on? Can I help with something?
- · I've noticed you're not going out much lately, anything going on?



Do an activity together

Activities create conversation. Find an opportunity during everyday life activities to start the conversation and ask them how they are really feeling. Try doing activities together such as:

Flares should always be readily accessible:

- away from heat sources above 60°C.



Expiry dates

Flares must be within the expiry date and maintained in serviceable condition at all times. Check them regularly to ensure they have not been rendered unserviceable by exposure to moisture. Mildew or bubbling of paper coatings may indicate this.

If you call the Shark Bay Health Centre after hours you will be transferred through to Health Direct where a Registered Nurse will ask you a number of questions to determine whether you need further emergency assessment by the Shark Bay nurse. If you require further assessment, your call will be put through to the local nurse.

Examples of an EMERGENCY include:

- · Breathing difficulties
- Chest pain
- Severe abdominal pain
- Bleeding that can't be controlled with first aid
- · Convulsions and fits
- Deep lacerations
- Eye or ear injuries
- · Uncontrolled high fever
- · Loss of consciousness
- Pregnancy bleeding or onset of labour
- A very sick child


