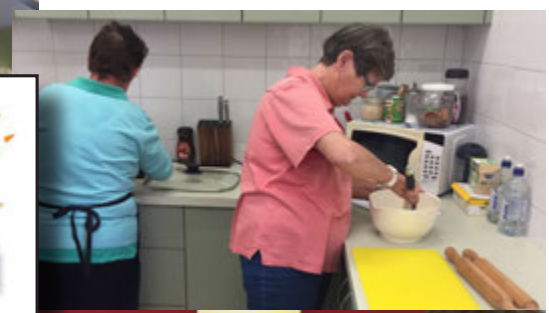
Food Sensations

It may have come to your attention recently, that the Ranger has been visiting individuals regarding their dogs.

Responsibilities come with dog ownership and we would like to further assist you in understanding some of those responsibilities.

As a dog owner are you able to answer yes to all these questions?

- **Registration:** Is your dog registered? All dogs aged three months and over must be registered with your local authority. Failure to register your dog may result in a \$200 on-the-spot infringement.
- **Tags:** Is your dog wearing a current registration tag?
- **Microchipped:** Is your dog microchipped with your current address and relevant contact information? All registered dogs must be microchipped.
- **Escape:** Are your fences and gates good enough to stop your dog going under, over or through them?
- **Behaviour:** Does your dog socialise well with other dogs and people?
- **Poo Patrol:** Do you pick up your dog's poo when it does its business in public?
- **Exercise:** When you are out and about do you have your dog on a leash in public or under your control in dog exercise areas?
- **Health:** Is your dog free of parasites and in good condition for its age/breed?
- **Home:** Does your dog always have sufficient shelter, cooling, water, food and attention?

Irresponsible dog owners may face significant penalties under the Dog Act 1976.

Rex Airlines Schedule changes

REX have now halved the advance time to book the Community Fare from 60 to 30 days, which should ensure that the lower fare becomes available to more travelers.

The 2019-20 Summer schedule for the Perth-Monkey Mia-Carnarvon route has recently been advised with a reduction of the number of flights during December – January when passenger demand is expected to decrease. On average there is a 30% reduction in passengers during January compared to the monthly average across the remainder of the year.

RETIREE

"I was born on the beach at Shark Bay; I was a twin but my sister died. My mother was Australian-Malay but we all used to mix together – white people and the coloured people – and we helped one another. We respected each other, too.

We'd picnic on the beach and the mothers and daughters would fish from the jetty while the boys went hunting for rabbit and different things. Sometimes the others would go out fishing on the boats although I wouldn't – I'm frightened of boats. We used to have horseraces on the beach. It was all so much fun.

I never had much schooling because I was a very delicate child. When I was sick, my mother would put me in the oven to keep me warm, like an incubator. The kids say to me, 'Nan, that's why you're so dark – you got burnt!'

My first job was on a station on Dirk Hartog Island. I learnt a lot of skills there, like waiting tables. The owners, Mr and Mrs McIntyre – she was a lovely lady – treated me like their own daughter.

I'm the only one left here from my family – my sister and brother passed away – but I've got plenty of grandkids down in Perth and Geraldton. Never mind, that's life. I'm alive, I don't drink, I don't smoke and I don't play cards anymore – we used to play rummy.

I'm at the age now where you just stay put. I've got a good girl who comes and helps me out and a lovely lady cleaner. I go down to the beach to talk to people every day. People are very good to me. I wouldn't live anywhere else." ●

Dear Shire of Shark Bay residents and visitors,

Permanent Doctor urgently required for Shire of Shark Bay

As your local Member of Parliament, representing and advocating on behalf of constituents in the electorate of North West Central, and after ongoing consultation with community members within the Shire of Shark Bay, I am again calling on the McGowan Labor Government to urgently instate the services of a permanent Doctor in Denham.

The need for a resident Doctor has been raised with me on numerous occasions and confirms some very valid reasons for calling on the State Government to instate a permanent Doctor in the Shark Bay region, such as:

- Providing medical services for the communities and hundreds of visitors to remote regions is essential.
- Ensuring the community is safe and the level of services available for the health and well-being of residents and visitors in the region is acceptable. With more than 6,000 tourism beds in the Shark Bay area, along with permanent residents, the number of potentially vulnerable people is significant.
- A reduction in waiting periods or long travel distances for both emergencies and simple requirements such as filling prescriptions or being medically assessed and treated in an appropriate timeframe without incurring additional costs, time off work and inconvenience.
- A reduction in stress levels placed on particularly vulnerable groups such as the elderly, families with young children and patients with severe medical conditions which may be time critical.
- Acceptable and expected levels of basic medical services to ensure new families, businesses and residents are attracted to live and visit the region.

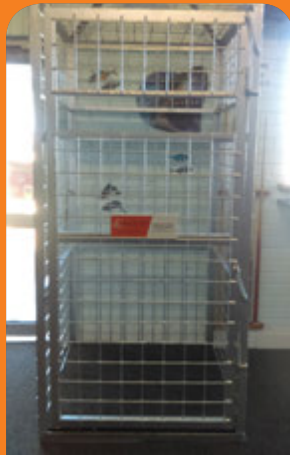

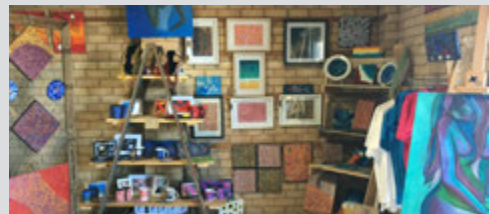

Volunteer Marine Rescue

I am happy to report that there have been no calls for help to your local Marine Rescue Group in the past month. Well done to the boating public who must be keeping their boats and motors in good reliable condition.

Our members have been involved in training courses on the use of our WAERN radios and AIMS Awareness. AIMS is the Australian Inter-agency Incident Management System which is the ground rules for how VMR fits into the network of responders called upon in emergencies.

Our shed in Durlacher Street has had the concrete floor ground and painted by professional contractors and it looks brand new and will be much easier to keep clean.

We had a visit from the Australian Maritime Safety Authority's inspector who came to Denham to do surveys on commercial vessels. Both our vessels were up to the standard required to comply with their Certificate of Operation which was a good result.

A film crew from DFES Media came to Denham to make a short film about the successful rescue of a man and his two sons whose boat capsized and sank near Steep Point in April. The film will be shown as part of the awards night at the conference weekend in September.

Four of our members will be going to the conference weekend at the Perth Convention and

Exhibition Centre. The weekend showcases all the latest developments in Marine Rescue and features guest speakers and tours of Water Police HQ among other highlights.

In another exciting development we have successfully applied to DFES for funding to have a floating catwalk built and installed at our boat pen. This will be of great benefit to the boat crew and skippers who currently get onto the boat by clambering over the bow from the jetty. A catwalk will make it much safer and quicker to get onto the boat and the reduced response time could one day be the difference to the outcome of a critical incident.

There is always plenty happening with your local VMR Group, so if you want to get involved, call 99481376 and ask for a nomination form. Meanwhile, always keep boating safety in mind when heading out on the water.

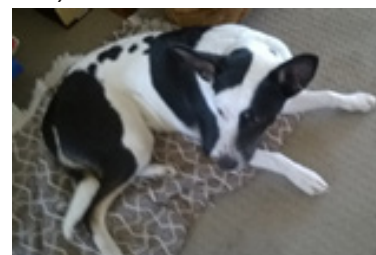

How to check in on someone

Helping others and providing support can make a difference for someone who is having problems and going through a tough time. If you think someone you care about isn't going so well, try the following tips on how to support them and continue to check in on them.



Talk

For most people, just asking if they are okay and listening can make a difference.

By simply being there for someone, they can feel less alone and more supported to open up and talk about how they are really feeling.

Asking open ended questions that require a response is a good way to start the conversation.

FOR EXAMPLE:

- How are you going? What's been happening in your life lately?
- You don't seem quite yourself lately, is something bothering you?
- You seem upset or worried, what's going on? Can I help with something?
- I've noticed you're not going out much lately, anything going on?



Listen

Just being there for someone and offering a listening ear can make a difference.

1. Show them that you care and are here to listen to them.
2. Have patience, let others talk and don't judge.
3. Be reflective by repeating what they have said.
4. Keep calm and accept that they may disagree with you.



Provide support

If the person you're concerned about is in a life threatening situation, or is at risk of harm to themselves or others, call 000.

Getting help early can make a difference. A good place to start is:

- Talk to your GP or someone you trust.
- Call a support line.
- Contact a support service.
- Try the Think Mental Health check-up tool.

They may also need your support while they look for professional help.

Know how to use them

Flares are best used when you believe there is chance of it being seen.

The method used to fire flares varies widely between flare types and manufacturers. The firing instructions are always printed on the flare, and you should be familiar with your flare's method. Hand-held red flares, especially, burn very hot and may spill glowing embers. Hold it downwind so that embers don't spill into the vessel and point it downwards while in your hand to avoid being burnt.

If you see a flare, contact the Water Police or phone 000 to report it.

Storage

Flares should always be readily accessible:

- stored in a waterproof container (marked with the registration number of your boat);
- in a place where they don't receive too much pounding in rough conditions;
- away from dampness; and
- away from heat sources above 60°C.



Expiry dates

Flares must be within the expiry date and maintained in serviceable condition at all times. Check them regularly to ensure they have not been rendered unserviceable by exposure to moisture. Mildew or bubbling of paper coatings may indicate this.



Disposal

Do not discard unserviceable or out of date flares in general rubbish collections or land fill. Visit the DoT website for disposal locations.

Unauthorised use of flares

There are severe penalties for the improper use of flares. Flares have a very serious purpose.

Falsely indicating distress rightly carries a severe penalty, but it also wastes a lot of time and resources – possibly weakening the ability to respond to a genuine emergency.

Do not leave flares in your vessel when it is not in use, and keep them away from children.

Distress flares

All vessels operating outside protected waters must carry flares. The type you need depends on how far offshore you travel. Flares must be manufactured to *Australian Standard AS 2092-2004* or comply with *Australian Maritime Safety Authority Marine Orders Part 25*.

For inshore waters

- Within five nautical miles from the mainland, or within one nautical mile from an island situated more than five nautical miles from the mainland, you will need:
- two hand-held orange smoke flares or one orange smoke canister; and
 - two hand-held red flares or two parachute flares.

For offshore waters

More than five nautical miles from the mainland, or more than one nautical mile from an island situated more than five nautical miles from the mainland, you will need:

- two hand-held orange smoke flares or one orange smoke canister; and
 - two parachute flares.
- If you operate both inshore and offshore you only need to carry an offshore set of flares.

Required flares

All boats operating outside protected waters must carry flares. The type you need depends on how far offshore you travel.

Distance from shore	Smoke flares	Incandescent flares
Inshore	2 hand-held orange smoke flares or 1 orange smoke canister	2 hand-held red flares or 2 parachute flares
Offshore	2 hand-held orange smoke flares or 1 orange smoke canister	2 parachute flares

Only an offshore set of flares is required if operating in both inshore and offshore areas.

Types of flares

Orange smoke flares



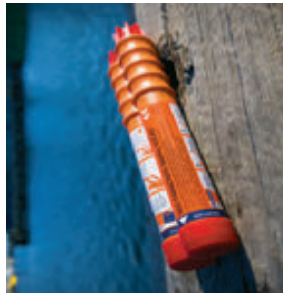
These are designed for day use only and have no luminosity. They emit a cloud of orange smoke. Orange hand held flares burn for about 60 seconds. The buoyant canister, which is safe for use in petrol or oil covered water, burns for about three minutes. Potential sighting range by day is 4 kilometres, although this can drop to less than 1 kilometre in a fresh breeze. These flares are especially visible from aircraft, even on windy days.

Red hand-held flares



These are designed for use both night and day and burn for about 45 seconds at 15,000 candle power. Potential sighting range at night is 10–12 kilometres and about 4–6 kilometres during the day.

Parachute flares



These are designed for use both night and day. They project a rocket to 300 metres high and then deploy a parachute-suspended red flare, which burns for about 40 seconds at 30,000 candle power. Potential sighting range is 15 kilometres by day and 40 kilometres at night.

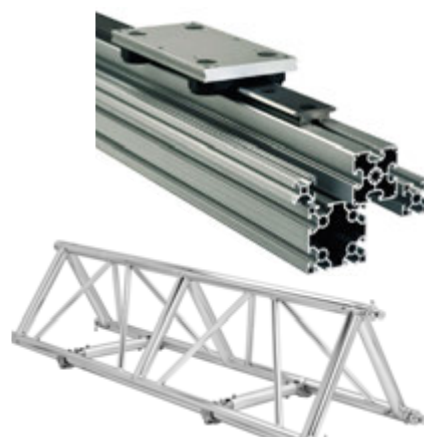

EMERGENCY

If you call the Shark Bay Health Centre after hours you will be transferred through to Health Direct where a Registered Nurse will ask you a number of questions to determine whether you need further emergency assessment by the Shark Bay nurse. If you require further assessment, your call will be put through to the local nurse.

Examples of an EMERGENCY include:

- Breathing difficulties
- Chest pain
- Severe abdominal pain
- Bleeding that can't be controlled with first aid
- Convulsions and fits
- Deep lacerations
- Eye or ear injuries
- Uncontrolled high fever
- Loss of consciousness
- Pregnancy – bleeding or onset of labour
- A very sick child
