

Get Online Week

The Shark Bay Community Resource Centre (CRC) has applied for grant funding through our partner the Good Things Foundation and the Be Connected Network to host a Get Online Week activity between the 19th -25th October. We are keen to host a "Lets get Dancing" session, using various forms of technology, accessing the internet to watch and learn different types of performing arts dancing.

Participants will at the end join together and perform their own dance routine which may include line dancing or a style of dancing of their choice. CRC staff will assist to record their performance and upload it to the internet using a web-based video tool (eg: YouTube, Tik Toc etc) or even send it via a email or link to family and friends.

Should our application be successful, we plan to host this activity at our weekly Friendly Hub session on Wednesday 21st October from 10.30am to 1.30pm at the Shark Bay Bowling Club. A sausage sizzle lunch will also be provided. Don't worry to much if you aren't keen on dancing, as we need people to assist with the recording and filming.

Mental Health Week

Staff have been working on developing a Mental Health Week activity here in Denham in partnership with our local Shire of Shark Bay and the Shark Bay P&C Association. We are in the early stages of planning, however our vision is to hold a car rally around the area with a small donation fee expected per car, with all proceeds donated to the Shark Bay P&C Assocation. The event will be held on Saturday 10th October and will encombass trekking around the wider Denham/Monkey Mia area.

Following the car rally, a quiz night is also being finalised so keep your eyes and ears open for futher information closer to the date.

Rec Centre hours

The courts are open Monday and Wednesday's after school if any adults or kids are keen to come for a play. Kids are currently enjoying rollerblading and roller skating around the courts however we welcome impromptu games of basketball, netball or any sport.

Gabi has started a sports morning session on Tuesday's from 9am - 11am, with parents welcome to bring along their small children. It's a chance for our mums and dads often restricted at home with young children to participate in some social active sports sessions. Any adult is welcome to come along (not just parents with young kids) otherwise you're welcome to pop in for a game of badminton Monday nights or indoor soccer on Wednesday's, both from 6.30pm. The CRC encourages members of the community to access the Jobs and Skills Centre services available through our CRC, as its free and an important measure to ensure residents in regional areas of the State have greater equity of access to this valuable service.

Shire President's Report - August 2020

Shire Budget and Economic Status

During a recent budget workshop, councillors endorsed the Shire's 2020/21 financial budget which was developed

after careful consideration of the economic conditions associated with the past six months of the Covid-19 pandemic, which are likely to continue for some time to come.

In March, Council resolved not to increase the rate in the dollar nor increase any fees and charges during 2020/21. Which means that ratepayers will not see an increase in their rates for this financial year. To achieve this objective, without significantly reducing the services provided to the community, we've focused on operational expenditure and ongoing maintenance commitments to infrastructure and plant, which will assist us to maintain service delivery levels to the local community.

Given the current economic conditions and the future uncertainty, I acknowledge the excellent work by the CEO to deliver a budget which has increased reserve funds by almost \$500,000 from the 2019/20 balance, without reductions in service provision to the community.

Increased Visitation to the Bay

There has been a huge influx of visitors to the Bay over the past few months and with the continued WA border closure, this is likely to continue to the end of the year and even beyond. The positive is that there are now heaps of WA visitors checking out the amazing natural assets that Shark Bay has to offer. This is also a major boost for our local businesses and the economy.

The down-side of the increased number of four-wheel drive vehicles is added pressure on areas of the landscape, with many new tracks being created. It is also impacting our local fish stocks, with fish waste averaging 1,000kg each day during the July school holidays.

The following statistics tell the story!

Accommodation has been around 65% capacity since the internal WA travel bans were lifted and during the July holidays it was at 100%, with between 65-70% per night since then. The September school holidays are currently at approximately 90% booked, with the Christmas period filling fast.

Common enquiries at the Discovery Centre are around camping/accessing national parks, camping in Shire campgrounds, tour availability and bookings. WA tourists generally have their own recreational vessels and 4-wheel drive vehicles, do without international tourists, this has resulted in a change in the visitor demographic and market for this time of the year.

Shark Bay Community

Although it's more difficult to adhere to the COVID health rules and regulations with so many visitors to the Bay, I urge you where possible to implement them to keep our community virus free so we can continue to enjoy the freedoms not afforded to less fortunate residents in the Eastern States. Please keep up the good work to ensure we all stay safe and healthy.





Stephen Michael Foundation


We were glad to welcome the Stephen Michael Foundation for a day of football training for all students




Deb Wilkes declared all positions vacant and the following people were elected:



Regional WA records some of the highest application rates for JobKeeper in the country

According to Federal Treasury data, five local governments - Exmouth, Shark Bay, Dundas, Augusta-Margaret River and Denmark - had 50% or more businesses apply for the payment. That was the highest number of all the states and territories.

In comparison, Queensland had only two shires where 50 per cent or more of their businesses applied, followed by New South Wales and Tasmania, which each had one.

The Shire of Shark Bay in WA's Gascoyne region was ranked third in the country for the percentage of JobKeeper applications - 63% of businesses applied for the payment.

Byron Bay in NSW took the top spot at 67 per cent.

The report was compiled by economic and demographic specialist company REMPLAN, which analysed postcode data released by the Federal Government.





University of Western Australia research shows WA has natural tsunami protection

New research shows the unique features of the Indian Ocean provide south west WA with natural protection from tsunami waves. The UWA research showed natural topographic features play a critical role in shielding towns between Geraldton and Busselton, where more than 90 per cent of the WA population lives.

The WA coastline experiences tsunamis through underwater earthquakes originating from offshore Indonesia from the Sunda Trench in the Indian Ocean. Professor Chari Pattiaratchi from UWA's Oceans Institute carried out a range of earthquake simulations to understand how tsunami waves move in the region. The study was published in the Journal of Marine Science and Engineering and examined the role of the surface and subsurface ocean topography that influenced tsunami wave heights, speed and direction.

Professor Pattiaratchi said the ocean features, seamounts and plateaus, including the Cuvier and Exmouth plateaus, acted as a natural shield by deflecting the tsunami waves. "These ocean features influence the energy distribution of a tsunami following an earthquake event," Professor Pattiaratchi said. "If one of these features is struck, the tsunami will dissipate and scatter energy and reduce its impact on the south-west.

"However, locations to the north of Shark Bay will experience higher waves." Professor Pattiaratchi said the offshore features each played a unique role in scattering and refracting the tsunami waves. "For instance, the Exmouth plateau acts as a focusing feature to increase wave heights between North West Capeand Barrow Island while the Cuvier plateau deflects the wave energy towards the coast at Shark Bay," Professor Pattiaratchi said. "It's critical to understand how tsunamis travel in order to implement effective tsunami warning and mitigation."


